## City will get into the Halloween spirit this weekend

Superheroes, zombies, princesses, ghosts, celebrities and about a dozen John Kowalkos will assemble on Main Street for the city's 65th annual Halloween parade this Sunday.

Close to 90 groups totaling about 2,000 people are already signed up to march in this year's parade — the longest-running event in the city's history, said Sharon Bruen of the city's Department of Parks and Recreation.

Several downtown streets will be closed from 2:30 to 5 p.m., including

Main Street between Library Avenue and South College Avenue, Tyre Avenue; and Delaware Avenue between Chapel Street and Library Avenue.

The parade will begin at 3 p.m. Businesses along Main Street will give out treats to children just after the parade, until 5 p.m. A pumpkin patch where families can get their pictures taken will be set up at the Academy Building at 105 E Main St.

The parade will include floats, families, and marching bands from Newark, Christiana, Glasgow, Caravel, St. Mark's, Salesianum, Delaware Technical and Community College, and The Fifes and

Drums of the Delaware Militia.

Large groups interested in participating in the parade should contact Bruen at 302-366-7060 by Friday. Parade entrants will be judged in several different categories and prizes will go to the winners. Individuals or families who want to march in the parade can check in with the Parks and Recreation staff at George Read Park, across from Newark High School, by 2:30 p.m. Sunday.

Those planning to don a disguise for the annual march will include a gaggle of locals dressed as — of all things —

## Trick-or-treating tips for kids

Master Cpl. Gerald Bryda of the Newark Police Department shares these tips for a safe Halloween:

**DRESS RIGHT:** To prevent trips and falls, avoid wearing long costumes. Wear light-colored clothing that drivers can easily see. Avoid wearing masks that could obstruct your vision, or take off the mask when crossing the street or walking near traffic.

**TRAVEL IN GROUPS:** Never go trick-or-treating alone.

**STAY THE COURSE:** Kids who are going trick-or-treating without adults should first review a map of the neighborhood with an adult and establish a safe route to follow. Keep a safe distance from cars, and walk on the sidewalk, not in the road.

**FOLLOW THE LIGHT:** Only travel down well-lit, well-traveled streets. Only knock on doors to houses with an outside light on.

**DON'T GO IN:** Never enter a stranger's house or car.

**CHECK YOUR TREATS:** It's hard to resist waiting until you get home to start eating your treats, but you need to have an adult check them before you eat them. Don't eat anything that's not in its original wrapper.

## Kowalkos and a canine costume contest

John Kowalko, the state representative from District 25 in Newark, who is running unopposed this election.

Kowalko has been marching in the parade with a group of supporters – who all dress as John Kowalko – since he started campaigning for the position eight years ago. (He's been in office since 2006.)

He said Steve Dentel, a University of Delaware professor who worked on his campaign, came up with the idea after learning that in order to march in the parade, political candidates had to dress in costume.

"He said, 'How about you dress up as yourself?' and it was a brilliant idea," said Kowalko, who has curly white hair, a moustache, and glasses. "Frankly, from a political vantage point, people know who I am now through that. This became almost like a multiple broadcast of, 'Who is this John Kowalko character?' It's been so popular that I feel that even if I retired or dropped dead, I'd have to somehow make a clone of myself to keep marching in the parade. All my marchers seem to get a kick out of it."

During the event, his "clones" shake hands with

parade spectators and say, "I'm the real John Kowalko," he said.

"Then I tell them I'm a one-man filibuster because I get nine votes for the price of one," he said.

### CANINE COSTUME CONTEST

Newark Jaycees are hosting a Canine Costume Contest at 10 a.m. Saturday at Norma B. Handloff Park on Barksdale Road in Newark. The event encourages locals to dress up their dogs for this contest, which will support Bear resident Staff Sgt. Tim Hasko.

Hasko, an Army Staff Sergeant stationed at Fort Bragg for eight years, has been deployed to Iraq three times, and suffers from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, according to Jaycees president Richard Lapsley.

A \$15 donation will help support Hasko through the Paws and People Assisting Wounded Warriors organization, which places service dogs with veterans with PTSD or brain injuries.

The dogs are trained to remind veterans to take their medication, to calm the them when they are having flashbacks, to patrol the house and provide a sense of security, and to wake them if they are having nightmares.

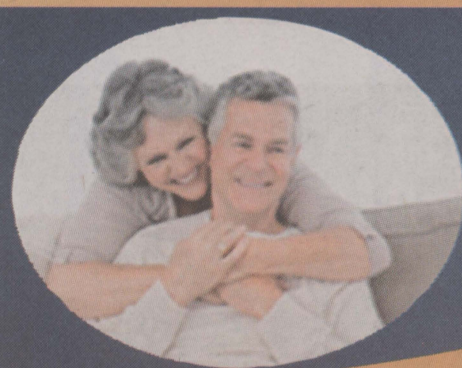
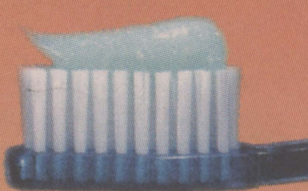

# Residents help plan Newark's future

City officials invited locals to speak their minds Tuesday during an open house in the city's Municipal Building on Elkton Road.

Residents, students, workers, business owners and anyone else with a vested interest in Newark's future were encouraged to stop by the open house, peruse displays, and write down their thoughts on the city's strengths, weaknesses, potential threats and opportunities for improvement.

The open house is part of an 18-month effort to gather public opinion and incorporate it into an update of the city's Comprehensive Development Plan (CDP), a document first developed in 1969.

The plan outlines a vision for Newark's near and more distant future, and includes strategies for housing, parks, land use, open space, transportation, infrastructure and economic development.

The state of Delaware requires that

local governments review their comprehensive plan every five years.

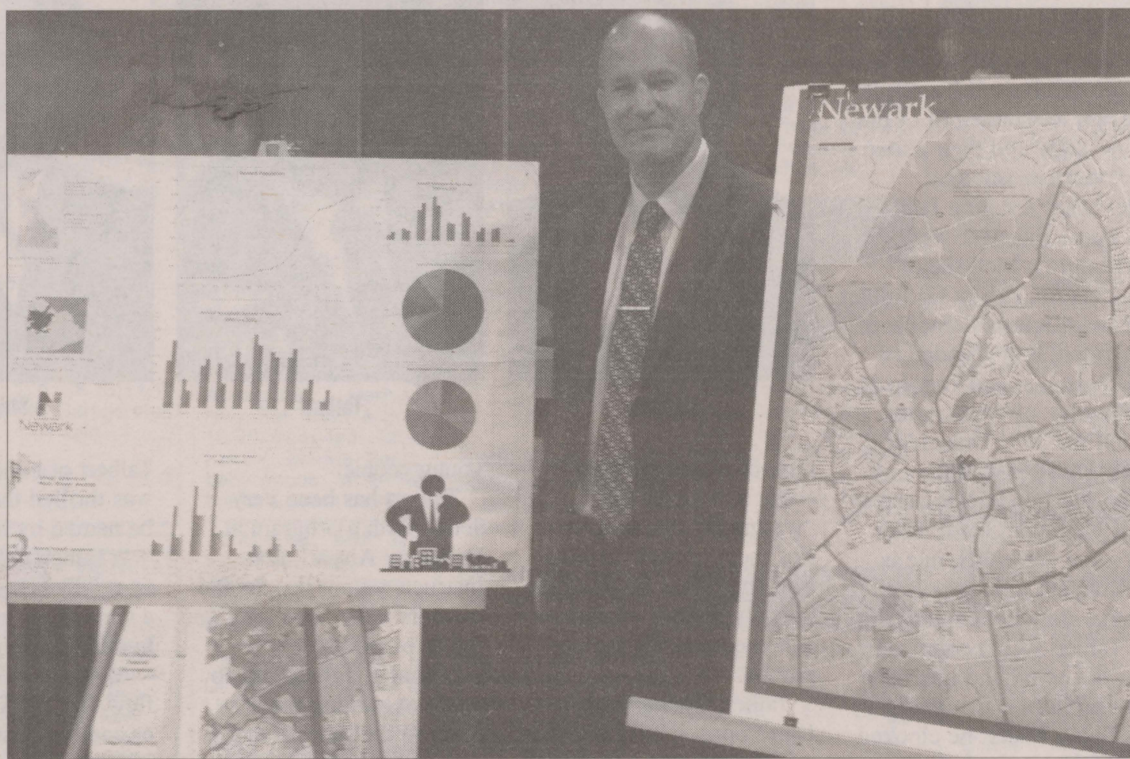
The public can view Newark's most recent CDP, a 147-page document last updated in 2008, by visiting the Planning and Development department's web page, <http://www.cityofnewarkde.us/index.aspx?NID=59> and clicking the Comprehensive Development Plan IV link.

The city will host several more open houses in an effort to get public input, said Michael Fortner, Development Supervisor for the City of Newark, who said he hopes to present an updated CDP to city council by next summer.

The city will host public hearings on the proposed plan before council members vote to approve or reject it, he said.

Fortner said he hopes to make the updated plan shorter and more streamlined, with a clearly stated vision.

"I'd like it to be something that someone could skim and get a good sense of the city," he said.

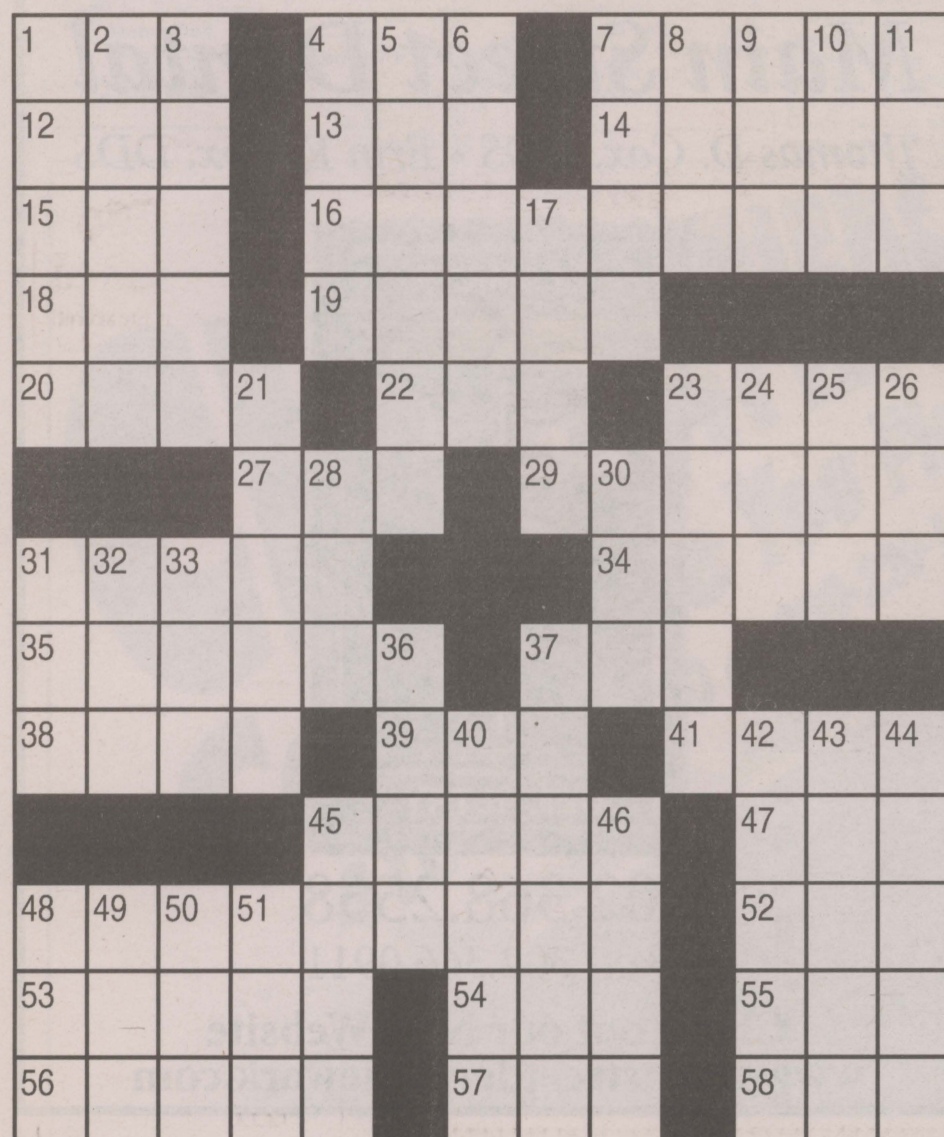

## Locals among Aviation Hall of Fame inductees

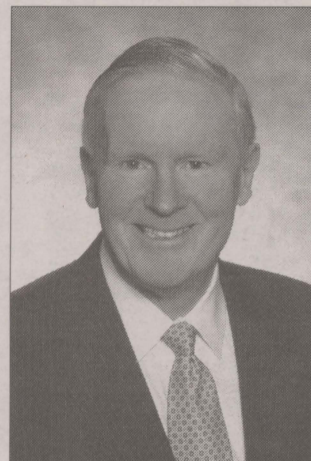

Five Delawareans were recently recognized for their roles in advancing aircraft design to the benefit of the First State and their country.

Inductees into the Delaware Aviation Hall of Fame this year were William O. McCabe of Hockessin, Ernest G. Talbert of Bear, Jeness F. Steele of Camden, E.N. Tyndall of Georgetown and Tenney H. Wheatley of Wilmington.

Of the 2012 inductees, all have served in the military, three in the Delaware Air National Guard. Four of them are pilots, one is a navigator, and one is an active-duty helicopter pilot.

Talbert was recognized for his command positions and an impressive number of flying hours: he clocked 6,500 hours, including combat hours, as a pilot for the United States Air Force and the Delaware Air National Guard. He retired as Chief of Staff of DANG with the



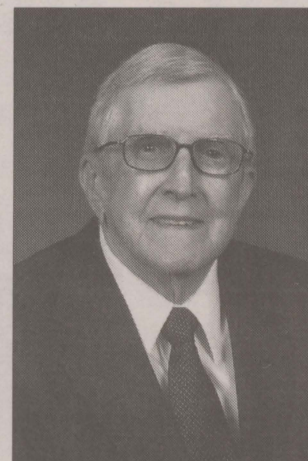

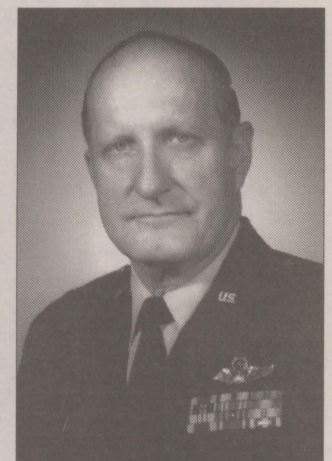

rank of Major General.

Each inductee has a "wingman" that notifies them of their nomination and helps the inductee create a display of their achievements for the ceremony.

Talbert's wingman, Dr. Dan Coons, a 2011 inductee, said Talbert was nominated because of his service to the country, his position on the Delaware Aviation Hall of Fame Board of Trustees and his commitment to leading

young people.

Talbert has been very active with a program at Delaware Airpark that instructs young people and mentors those who are training to be pilots.

"General Talbert did so much at guiding the program to the success that it was and is today," Coons said.

Coons said he could not think of a better candidate than Talbert for the induction. He said when he told

Talbert of his induction, he was thrilled that he would be named by his peers.

"(Talbert) had tears in his eyes," Coons said. "It was a surprise to him. Ernie is a humble person."

McCabe, of Hockessin, flew 100 USAF fighter combat missions in Vietnam, and went on to become an aerospace executive for DuPont and head of the DuPont Aviation unit at New Castle County Airport. He is currently CEO of his

own aerospace/aviation consulting firm.

Talbert, McCabe and their fellow inductees were recognized at Delaware Aviation Hall of Fame organization's Honors Banquet Sept. 29.

Hugh Horning, president of the hall of fame's board of trustees, said there is a backlog of about 60 nominees who are revisited each year by the Board to determine if they will be inducted.

The board accepts nominations from members of the public who can send a letter and supporting documents listing the candidate's accomplishments and qualifications. About six are inducted each year. Since the hall of fame's inception in 2000, 73 men and women have been inducted.

Horning said there is no checklist of qualifications for candidates to

## Md. men arrested for unlawful sexual contact

Newark Police arrested two men from Edgewood, Md. on multiple charges after an incident that happened around 1 a.m. Sunday on East Cleveland Avenue.

Anthony Battle, 19, and Desmond C. Romeo, 21, were arrested and charged after they smacked women on the buttocks and then physically attacked other members of the group, police said.

According to Newark Police, two 21-year-old women walking on the sidewalk on East Cleveland Avenue attempted to pass through a group of males standing on either side of the sidewalk, when someone slapped them on the buttocks.

Five more females between ages 18 and 20 then passed

through the group of men, when someone also slapped them on the buttocks.

When one of the females, a 20-year-old, from Clayton, confronted the men, Romeo pushed her into the street, police said.

When the victim then attempted to call 911, Battle took her cell phone and threw it, preventing her from making the call, police said.

When an 18-year-old female friend of the victim confronted the men, Romeo grabbed her around the neck, lifted her off the ground and threw her into the nearby bushes, police said.

A 19-year-old male then attempted to intervene, but an unknown person in the group knocked him to the ground, police said.

During this altercation, several people called police. Responding officers were

able to detain six men, and witnesses on the scene were able to positively identify Battle and Romeo.

Police charged Battle with one count of second-degree robbery, three counts of third-degree unlawful sexual contact and one count of malicious interference with emergency communications. He was committed to Howard R. Young Correctional in lieu of \$9,200 bail.

Romeo was charged with one count of strangulation, two counts of third-degree unlawful sexual contact and two counts of offensive touching. He was committed to Howard R. Young

Correctional in lieu of \$8,200 bail.

The woman who was knocked into the street sustained minor abrasions to her neck during the incident. The 18-year-old that Romeo threw into the bushes sustained neck and back pain. The 19-year-old male who was thrown to the ground sustained abrasions to his arm. All three declined medical treatment.

Five of the eight victims are current University of Delaware students. One is a former UD student and two are not students. Neither Battle, Romeo, nor the other

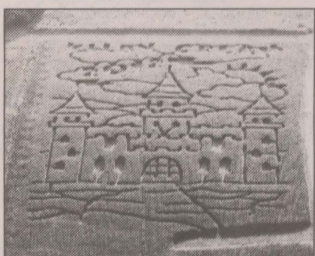

four males detained, were both committed to Howard R. Young Correctional in

Battle and Romeo were lieu of bail.

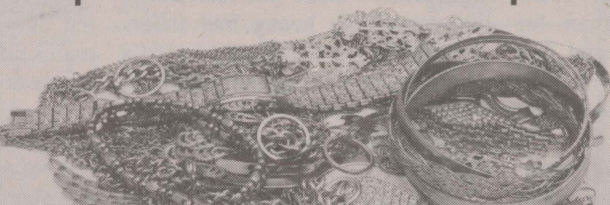

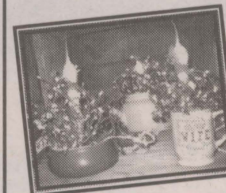

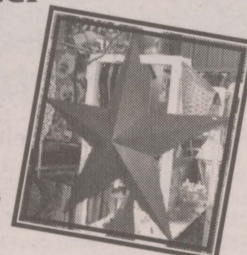

# Man murdered in motel just outside Newark

A Delaware man is facing murder and manslaughter charges after a deadly assault inside a room at a motel late Monday night just minutes from Newark in Elkton, Md., police said.

Leonard M. Mullikin, 44, stands accused of killing 45-year-old Joel A. Odom about 10:45 p.m. inside Room 418 of the Knights Inn motel at 262 Belle Hill Road, just over the Delaware state line.

Odom died from "injuries (suffered) during the physical altercation," according to police officials, who did not specify if Mullikin allegedly beat Odom with his fists or with an object or if the deadly assault involved strangling or the use of a weapon.

Police officials listed Mullikin's address as 262 Belle Hill Road.

However, according to Ravi Raval, the motel's general manager, Mullikin presented an identification card listing Bear, Del., as his address on Oct. 16 when he checked in to Room 418 at the motel.

In addition to Mullikin, the other registered Room 418 guests were a woman who identified herself as Mullikin's girlfriend, the woman's 17-year-old daughter and the teen's boyfriend.

The group was scheduled to check out of the motel on Tuesday morning, Raval said.

Odom, presented an ID listing him as an Atlanta, Ga., resident when he registered as a motel

guest on Friday, Raval said. Odom stayed in Room 419 — adjacent to the room where he was killed, Raval added.

Lt. Joseph Zurolo, an Elkton Police Department spokesman, provided only a sketchy account of the slaying amid the ongoing investigation Tuesday.

Three EPD detectives had remained at the crime scene overnight, gathering evidence and interviewing motel guests and witnesses.

EPD officers rushed to the motel after receiving an assault complaint at 10:46 p.m. on Monday from a telephone caller, police said.

"Upon arrival, officers discovered a white male lying on the floor, just inside the door of Room 418. This individual was unconscious and not breathing," Zurolo explained.

Officers performed CPR on the unresponsive man — later identified as Odom — until paramedics arrived moments later and continued the procedure, police said.

Odom was pronounced dead at the scene, police added.

A guest in Room 420 — two doors away from the murder — identified himself as a foreman for an Atlanta-based commercial and industrial painting company that handles jobs throughout the United States.

That man, who asked to remain anonymous, said Odom had "bussed up from Atlanta" on Friday after securing a paint job the company is performing at Restoration Hardware near North East.

Odom would have remained on this job for about a month, he added.

He described Odom as a sporadic worker, estimating that he last worked a job with Odom about 18 months ago and that it lasted about a week. The man staying in Room 420 said he did not know Odom well.

According to the man, who also is an Atlanta, Ga. resident, Odom had befriended the female occupants of Room 418 at some point over the weekend.

Moreover, during the hours leading up to the fatal incident, Odom and the occupants of Room 418 seemed to be social — aside from Mullikin, who didn't appear to be on the premises at that point, he said.

"I came back from eating at (a nearby restaurant) about 7:30 last night, and they were all hanging out outside their rooms, just kicking back," he said.

The man went to bed, only to be stirred later inside his Room 420 by a commotion coming from somewhere close at that motel, he added.

"I was asleep about 10:30 at night when I heard this loud noise, like something heavy had fallen. It rattled my wall. Then I heard a whole lot of moving and yelling. It was like war cries. It went on for two minutes," the guest in Room 420 described.

He pounded on the door to Room 419, assuming Odom was having some sort of medical episode or some other type of struggle, but no one answered, he said.

Then he realized that source of the cacophony was the next-door unit, Room 418, he added.

"There were loud thuds coming from that room. I saw the door vibrating like someone's body was being slammed against it. I heard loud screams," the man said. "It sounded like a war zone in there."

The man sprinted to his room and called the motel office, instructing the desk clerk to call 911, and then he ran back to the door of Room 418, he added.

"I begged for them to open the door, but they wouldn't," the man said, noting that a voice from inside ordered him to leave.

When EPD officers arrived several moments later and took custody of everyone inside Room 418, the man peeked in and saw Odom lying near the door, he said.

"You would have hit his legs if you opened the door all the way. His eyes were closed and his

mouth was open. I knew he was dead," the man said.

It appeared that the man, later identified as Mullikin, suffered injuries during the ruckus.

"He had golf ball-size knots on his head," the guest in Room 420 said.

Acknowledging that he had heard rumors concerning what triggered the fight between Mullikin and Odom, the man said he did not know the cause.

Mullikin is charged with second-degree murder, manslaughter, first-degree assault and second-degree assault, according to Cecil County District Court records.

Mullikin remained in the Cecil County Detention Center on Tuesday night in lieu of \$750,000 bond, a jail-spokesman reported.

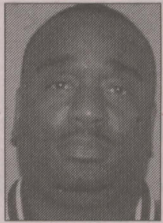

### Police: Man arrested for pedestrian hit-and-run

Newark Police have arrested a 46-year-old Newark man in connection with a hit-and-run collision that injured three pedestrians in the unit block of East Cleveland Avenue early Saturday morning.

Police said a group of pedestrians, including a 21-year-old female from Morristown, N.J., a 19-year-old female from Irvington, N.Y., and a 19-year-old female from Northport, N.Y., were walking westbound on the north side of East Cleveland Avenue around 12:15 a.m. Saturday when Erroll Johnson, 46, of Newark, driving a 2001 Dodge Dakota Pickup truck traveling westbound, struck the 21-year-old female pedestrian, who was walking in the roadway just off of the curb.

Flying debris from the initial collision also struck two 19-year-old pedestrians who were both walking westbound on the sidewalk. One was struck in the back of the head and the other in the lower leg, police said.

After the collision, Johnson failed to stop and continued westbound on East Cleveland Avenue, police said. Witnesses obtained the tag number for the vehicle and officers immediately responded to Johnson's home, where the vehicle was located in the driveway. Johnson was found still inside the vehicle and was taken into custody without incident.

The 21-year-old female pedestrian was transported to Christiana Hospital and is listed in serious but stable condition with head and internal injuries. The 19-year-old female pedestrian, struck in the back of the head with debris, was transported to Christiana Hospital for a minor laceration to the head. The second 19-year-old pedestrian, struck in the back of the leg with debris, declined medical treat-

ment, police said.

Johnson was released from custody after posting \$600 secured bail.

The Newark Police Department Traffic Unit are still investigating the incident.

### Woman wakes up to find stranger touching her leg

A 22-year-old Newark woman woke up to find a strange man inside her bedroom touching her leg early in the morning on Oct. 19, said Lt. Mark Farrall of the Newark Police Department.

The victim was sleeping in her second-floor bedroom on South Chapel Street and woke up around 3:55 a.m. to find a man with a large build, wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt pulled over his head, touching her leg, Farrall said. The room was dark, and the victim could not tell the suspect's race or age, he said.

The boys were released to the custody of their parents and will be tried in Family Court of Delaware, Bryda said.

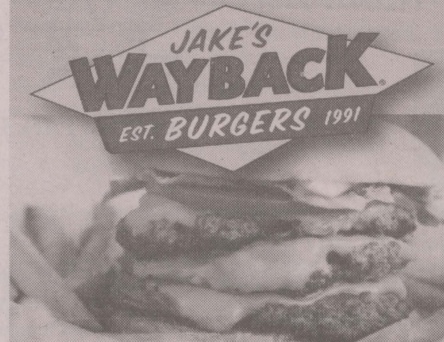

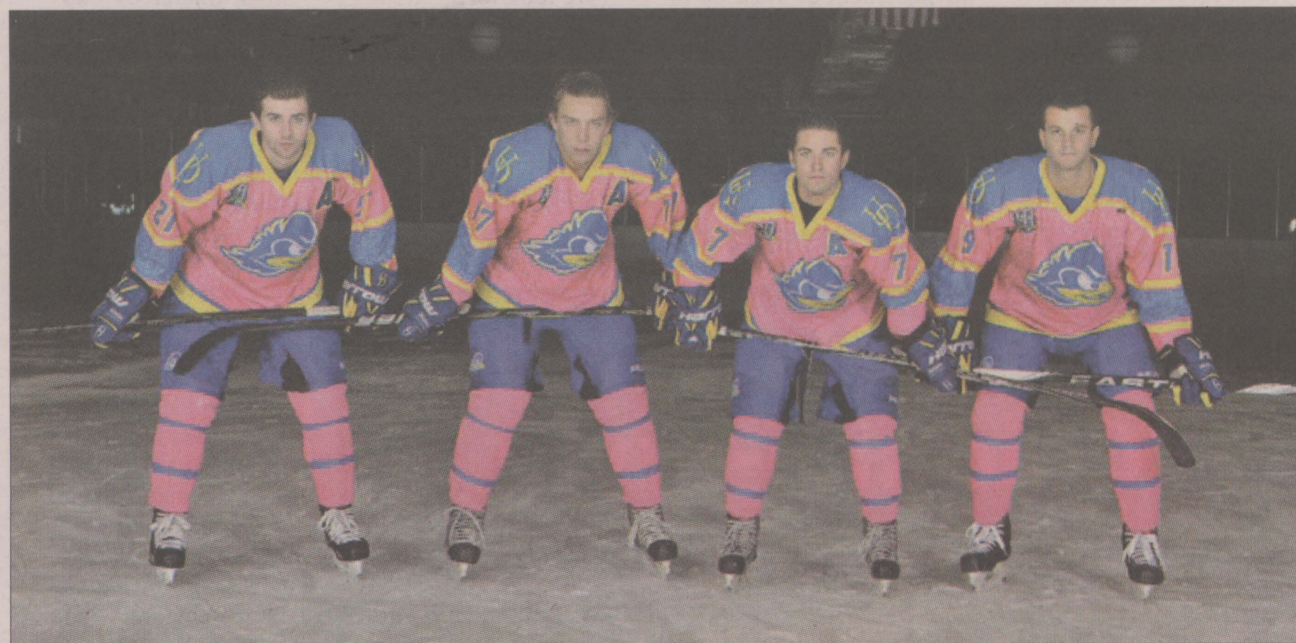

tribution in Delaware and beyond Delaware," Horning said.

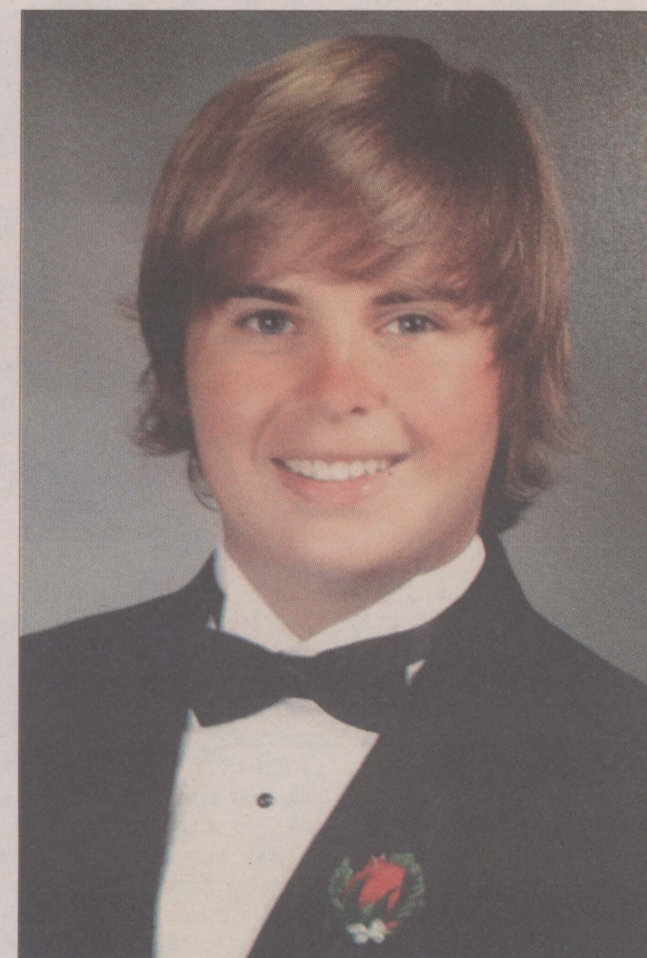

# Time to review your Medicare insurance coverage

The Annual Election Period – the time during which you can make changes to your Medicare Advantage health/prescription drug coverage – is Oct. 15 through Dec. 7.

The advertisements touting this period have been relentless and a bit confusing. As the daughter of an aging parent, I know it often falls to family members to help parents make good decisions about their coverage. Now is the time to review your own or a loved one's plan to make sure the amount of coverage is still accurate.

The original basic Medicare Part A (hospital) and B (medical) options don't change much. But the Medicare Advantage plans and Medigap insurance policies can change from year to year – and so can you or your senior's health-care or prescription-drug needs.

ELDER Info is a local

program to educate Medicare beneficiaries and their caregivers about Medicare health care benefits, Medigap insurance, and Medicare assistance programs. They can be reached at 1-800-336-9500 for a private consultation.

Experts recommend that seniors and their advisers review:

Annual notice-of-change statements from the current insurer to see if these changes will impact your senior's needs for coverage.

The plan formularies; is the drug used still covered and, if not, is there an acceptable replacement?

Are there coverage gaps between what – and the cost of what – will be covered between Medicare Part A, B and your plan? How much will it cost in out-of-pocket costs?

What is the new cost for prescription-drug charges and delivery networks?

Check out how much the surcharges will be if they have high taxable income.

This is the time when you will see some plans have a rise in premiums and changes in benefits, so you really need to make sure the plan still is a good fit given current circumstances.

Take it from me: it takes time to review your or your senior's bills to determine what is currently being used, what it costs, and what Medicare and the

wrap-around policies provide. Start now so you have plenty of time to comparison shop across insurance programs.

## AFFORDABLE CARE ACT CHANGES

Under the new law commonly referred to as the Affordable Care Act, you will not see any changes to your eligibility or to your guaranteed Medicare benefits, and you do not have to change doctors.

However, the law does provide additional benefits under many Medicare plans that will help lower your health-care costs:

- **Free Preventive Services:** Starting Jan. 1, 2011, many preventive-care services are now provided under Medicare Part B at no cost. Examples include flu shots, prostate-cancer screenings, Pap tests, and screening mammograms. If you get your coverage through a Medicare Advantage Plan, you should check to see if the plan offers any preventive services beyond what Medicare Part B covers.

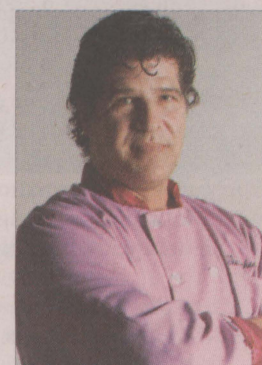

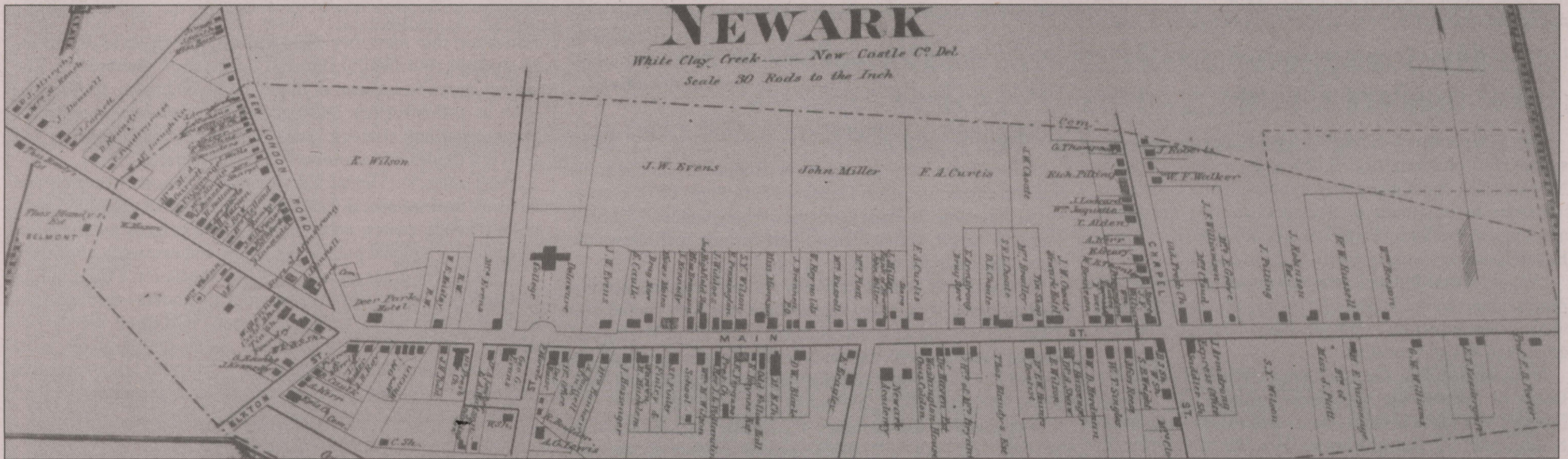

# Beers Map of Newark, 1868

This week's Out of the Attic item is a D. G. Beers map of Newark published in 1868 as part of a statewide atlas.

Compared to a map from 1858 (10 years earlier), this map shows substantial growth in both the length of Main Street and cross-street development.

During this period, the nation was struggling

through the Civil War, and African-American residents' roles in society were starting to change.

In 1858, the east end of Main Street was the Village Presbyterian Church on the corner of North Chapel and East Main.

A decade later, as depicted in this map, development had moved way east,

marked by large homes and lots. North Chapel Street had filled in to the town line, and Main Street from Chapel Street west to the Deer Park had filled in even more.

The side streets of South Chapel, Academy, Depot, and Elkton Road were defined and had started to fill in.

Delaware Avenue had been opened between Elkton

and Depot Roads.

The most dramatic developments were the large homes along Nottingham Road west to and beyond the town line. Along the west side of New London Road, a community of African-American residents had started, and free black citizens could own property in Delaware; they were still

prohibited from doing so in Maryland and Virginia.

Copies of the Beers Atlas are available for public use at the Newark Free Library's Local History room. This map and others are also on display at the Newark History Museum.

# State Line Liquors store seeks growler legislation

The owners of State Line Liquors, just over the state line in Elkton, recently stepped up their quest for growler legislation that would let them and other retailers in Cecil County refill "growlers" with beer for customers.

The new law would have to be introduced by Cecil County lawmakers during the 2013 session and passed by the entire General Assembly before it can take effect.

Cecil County Board of License (Liquor) Commissioners Chief Inspector Earl Bradford and State Line Liquors owners Robert Murray and his sister, Marcella, explained the request to the county commissioners last month during a work session.

The pub brewery license legislation passed last year for Cecil

County does not allow retailers to refill growlers, which are usually half-gallon glass containers.

It only allows pub-breweries to sell and refill growlers with beer it produced. Currently, there are no pub-breweries licensed in Cecil County.

Bradford said last year's legislation was a "first step" and this year's request would be a "second-step" to open up growler business in Cecil County.

"We have a lot of support for this," Robert Murray said.

"This would be in a lot of additional excise and sale tax revenue," he added. "It's a good thing for everyone."

Murray said during the last two weeks he's been getting signatures of support of this legislation from customers at his Elkton Road store. "We already have 1,700 signatures," he said.

Bradford told the commissioners the proposed legislation could follow what was done last year in Baltimore City and Howard County.

State Line is specifically requesting legislation that allows them and other licensed establishments in Cecil County to fill and re-fill growlers for sale from kegs of craft/micro-brewed beer to customers to take home.

Murray explained that many of these craft beers are not available in bottles.

Bradford told the commissioners that the liquor board supports this request.

The draft legislation would limit the size of a growler from 32 ounces to 128 ounces.

The proposed annual fee to obtain a refillable container license would be \$50.

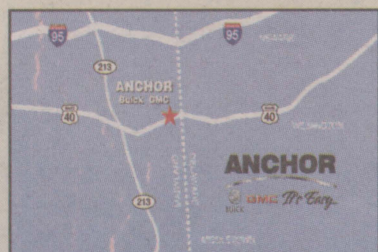
