MA in Italian Studies 4+1 Option

Students pursuing the 4+1 MA in Italian Studies must take two of the ITAL4xx/6xx for graduate credit in their senior year. They must also begin research for their thesis proposal as part of their ITAL4xx/6xx in their senior year.
