

Vikings, Yellowjackets Walloped By Foe With Blue Hen Conference Cage Openers

Both Christians and Newark High School were walloped last Tuesday night in their Blue Hen Conference basketball season openers. Coach Ron Miller's Vikings lost a hard-fought battle to Brandywine by 69-50, and Coach Francis Fulghum's Yellowjackets were handed a 70-31 lacing by the Green Knights at Mt. Pleasant.

At the new Christians gym, a pair of tall, talented Bulldogs—6-2 Steve Jackson and 6-7 John Schroeder—rang up a total of 40 points—more than enough to win without the added scoring contribution of their teammates.

The Brandywine eagles prevented the Vikings from scoring a field goal in the first quarter. Coach Ken Eggleston, 6-1, and a starter for Newark High School last season, but a transfer student at Christians this year, scored the Viking scoring with 11 points. Eggleston contributed two points to the Christians cause in the first quarter by sinking a pair of foul shots.

At Mt. Pleasant, Ricky Hicks led the Yellowjackets scoring with four field goals and a successful foul shot for nine points, with Norris Saunders and Dave Dolgas sharing runner-up scoring honors with seven points each.

Boston University To Face Blue Hens In Rutgers' Role

The University of Delaware football schedule for 1964 through 1966 includes one new opponent—Boston University—a major college team which replaces Rutgers, a traditional Blue Hen opponent, in 1963.

A major-college rival to be met on a regular basis is Villanova, which last played Delaware in 1962. The Hens will play Villanova away in '64 and '66, at home in '63.

A third major on the Delaware schedule is Buffalo, which has faced the Hens during the past three seasons.

The remainder of the schedule is composed of Middle Atlantic Conference rivals Lehigh, Lafayette, Bucknell, Temple, Gettysburg, and Hofstra.

For the first time since 1937, Delaware will not meet Lehigh in the season opener this year, nor in the two succeeding years. Delaware and Lehigh have met early in their respective seasons during every year since 1950, but the Hens and Eagles will play each other in mid-season during the three-year period of the current schedule.

Hofstra, a team which Delaware last met in 1961, will replace Lehigh at the opening-day rival.

There will be five home games in 1964, and this year's home opener, on Sept. 26, will be played in the newly-planned Delaware Stadium, which will have some 13,000 seats.
