SIR,

By an act of the General Assembly of the State of Delaware, passed at Dover, February 8, 1827, it is made the duty of the Executive to transmit "to the Executive authority of each of the Territories of the United States, and to the Executive authority of each State of the United States, which has not heretofore been furnished with them by this State, for the use of such Territories and States respectively, three copies of the laws of this State that have heretofore been enacted, and also three copies of all laws that shall hereafter be enacted, annually, and request a like interchange from them."

In pursuance of this act and by order of the Governour of this State, I herewith transmit to the Executive authority of *the State of Alabama* for the use of that *State* three copies of the laws of the State of Delaware, passed at the last session of the Legislature. If the *State* over which you preside has not heretofore been furnished by this State with a complete copy of all the laws of the State of Delaware, I shall endeavour to supply any deficiency as soon as I may be informed of it. Enclosed I send you a schedule of all the laws of the *State* of *Alabama* received at this department for the use of the State of Delaware, and respectfully request that such volumes or pamphlets of the laws of *Alabama* may be furnished to this State, as are not mentioned in that schedule.
