
Dean Crossan College of Agriculture

One of the strongest undergraduate agricultural programs in the East, the College of Agriculture prepares students to enter any aspect of this diverse and challenging field. It offers programs ranging from agricultural engineering technology to plant and animal science and entomology. Concentration may also be arranged in wildlife conservation, landscape horticulture, or pre-veterinary instruction.

Agriculture is an important scientific discipline and its fundamental aim is to discover more efficient and economical means of producing food for a world with a growing population and dwindling natural resources. The objective of the College of Agriculture is to prepare students for a variety of career opportunities in individual enterprise, teaching, and public service. By providing a flexible program of study, the curriculum is designed to keep students up to date on the changes and improvements taking place in the agricultural industry. Because research continues to lie at the heart of agriculture, students are given opportunities to participate in scientific research. Faculty research is closely linked with the undergraduate teaching program. Ag students also have access to special on-campus facilities, such as a 400-acre experimental farm and Holstein and Guernsey dairy herds.

The Agriculture Science program also stresses the importance of social activities. Many clubs and organizations are available to students as well as the farmhouse and Alpha Zeta, a coed honors fraternity. Every spring the college organizes "Ag Day" which is sponsored by the university.

The need for agricultural jobs will continue to grow as technological advances increase the need for college-trained personnel.





College of Arts and Science

The College of Arts and Science, the largest and most diverse of the eight undergraduate colleges, represents the heart of the university. It offers over 60 majors ranging from biology and computer science to psychology and theater. Students are able to concentrate on one area of interest while taking general courses in several others resulting in a well-rounded education. Students enrolled in the College of Arts and Science fulfill general education requirements in three broad areas: Arts and Humanities; Behavioral and Social Sciences; and Natural Sciences and Mathematics. From these requirements students develop a heightened understanding of all of the aspects of human environment, intellectual curiosity, respect for fact, perception of the complexity of truth, skill in reasoning and concern for integrity and logical consistency. 


College of Business and Economics

Students receive a solid education from the College of Business and Economics and its excellent record for placing its graduates in jobs after graduation proves it.




Dean Murray College of Education

The College of Education is organized into two departments: Educational Development and Educational Studies. The program in careers as teachers of normal and exceptional children in kindergarten through eighth grade. The program in Educational Studies is for students who wish to apply the study of education to careers in business, law, journalism, politics and other fields. 
The College of Education also provides advisement and assistance to students in the College of Arts and Science who wish to be certified to teach in their field of study.














Dean Pipes College of Engineering

In addition to the college's four year degree programs, five year programs are offered jointly by each of the engineering departments and the College of Arts and Science. 
Admission to the program is competitive. Students learn to apply mathematics, science and engineering theories to solve technical problems. Instruction is carried out in the classroom and in the laboratory.

Engineering courses begin at the freshmen level. These courses deal with such subjects as chemical kinetics, digital systems, electrical networks, fluid and solid mechanics, material science thermodynamics, and transport phenomena. In general, sophomore and junior courses provide the background for application and design-oriented courses at the senior level.

The employment perspectives for engineering graduates remains structurally sound. They have a variety of career possibilities from which to choose and may specialize in research, construction, management, teaching, writing, or sales. 

The College of Human Resources offers programs that combine broad general education with professional preparation in an ever expanding field for men and women. 
College of Nursing


The first two years of the program include foundation courses in the natural, social, and behavioral sciences, liberal arts and an introductory nursing course. The third and fourth years of study include clinical and nonclinical nursing courses as well as liberal arts and science courses. The College of Nursing is extremely well connected to hospitals and other health care organizations in the Newark/Wilmington area. Students gain clinical experience through courses, research projects, or internships at nearby hospitals. Special facilities on campus include a simulated hospital, which consists of two nursing practice labs and a computer lab where all nursing students acquire basic computer skills.
















Dean Kelly College of Physical Education, Athletics and Recreation






