Dear George,

I have received copy of your confidential letter to Mr. Graydon dated May 10th, dealing with the dollar purchases in Mexico with particular reference to the I.E.M.

During the visit of Messrs. Baker and Chapman of Westinghouse Electric International Company on May 16th, I mentioned I.E.M. They told me that they were not very much interested in this factory, which, in their opinion, is mainly the creation of Sir William Wiseman of Kuhn Loeb & Company.

It is true that they have given licenses to the factory but they have no other financial interest in it. They also informed me that Mr. White had accepted the job of General Manager of I.E.M. without consulting Westinghouse.

To sum up, they practically declined all responsibility for the existence of this enterprise.

It is rather curious to note the mentality of these gentlemen and to understand the meaning of all this. Have they been let down by Mr. White?
