# A weekend for the little ones!

espite heavy rain, United Way of Delaware volunteers met over the weekend at Iron Hill Park to begin constructing the state's second Born Learning Trail, in support of early childhood education. # **Claymont Steak Shop** coming to Amstel site

At Monday night's meeting, the Newark City Council voted to grant The Claymont Steak Shop a Special Use Permit for the sale of beer and wine in their new location at the Amstel Square building on the corner of Amstel Avenue and Elkton Road. The 3,891 square-foot restaurant will seat 66 customers with an additional 16 seats on an outside patio for seasonal dining.

The décor will be based on the style of the original store, located on Philadelphia Pike in Claymont, but with a modern flair, owners said. Also like the original location, the new kitchen will be the base of Demi's Flavors, a high-end catering business named after the owner, Demi Kollias. Opening is scheduled for September

The Claymont Steak Shop will feature eat-in, take-out, delivery, and catering services. Proposed hours are the same for both locations: Monday to Thursday, 11 a.m.-11 p.m.; Friday to Saturday, 11 a.m.-12 a.m.; Sunday, 11 a.m.-9 p.m. To make sure operations run smoothly, owner Demi Kollias will initially manage the Newark location.

The addition of alcohol is new to Claymont's menu and is based upon

# Newark Film Festival enters its fifth year

Entering its fifth year, the Newark Film Festival will run from Thursday, September 10 thru the following Thursday, September 17 at the Cinema Center 3. Highlights of the festival will be featured at the Delaware Art Museum in Wilmington the weekend of Sept. 25-27.

"The theme of our festival again is 'Movies that Matter,' in the words of some of our regular attendees," says producer Barry Schlecker. . "That's what drives our film

selection, to presents films that leave a lasting impression."

Last year, over 30 films were featured, including works by Delawarebased filmmakers. The Visitor, starring Richard Jenkins in his Academy Award-nominated role, was among those featured.

Wilmington Trust is this year's corporate sponsor. Up to 30 additional sponsors will be highlighted through 30-second commercials produced by local filmmakers.


The full roster of movies will be announced later this summer.



# High-rise hotel on August city planning agenda

It will be August before The Newark Planning Commission will get a look at plans for a six-story extended-stay hotel near the site of the Howard Johnson motel at 1119 S. College Avenue. The project was taken off the July agenda, at the request of the developer.

Developers are seeking a major subdivision and special permit for the 101-room Candlewood Suites Hotel at the site that would actually be located on Welch Tract Road.

Word of the hotel's plans has been circulating for a couple of months and neighbors have expressed concerns about a high rise close to homes, as well as complaints about the Howard Johnson's. Newark Planning Director Roy Lopata says the site is zoned for a six-story building and noted that newer hotels built in the area, such as the Embassy Suites, have been multi-story structures.

Candlewood Suites is a part of the Intercontinental chain that includes Holiday Inn.

The company describes Candlewood as high-quality accommodation that caters to mid-market business and leisure travelers looking for a multiple night hotel stay. It is a fast-growing part of Intercontinental, with 213 hotels and 228 in the development pipeline.

In July, the Planning Commission will also take a look a rezoning of a 1.16 acre property at 136 Elkton Road. The proposed project includes mixed use commercial and residential space, with 14 apartments on the upper floors.

A third project before the commission is a mixed use project at the current location of the Formal Affairs store at 129 E. Main St. Plans call for a three-story commercial/residential building with six upper floor apartments.

The commission will meet in City Hall Council Chambers on Elkton Road at 7 p.m. on the 7th.

# Newark man shot on Wilmington street corner

A Newark man was listed in critical but stable condition, after being shot here. Wilmington Police were called to the area of 30th & Madison Streets in regards to shots being fired.

As officers arrived in the area and searching for a possible scene, they were notified of a gunshot victim who had arrived at the Wilmington Hospital via private vehicle. They learned that a 20-year-old Newark, resident was suffering from a gunshot wound to the back of his head.

The victim was then transported to the Christiana Hospital where he was listed in critical, but stable condition. The bullet did not penetrate the skull, police reported. All parties involved in the incident have been less than cooperative in the investigation and the identity of the man has not been released.

# Elkton man arrested in exposure case

An arrest has been made in an incident of indecent exposure in the Nottingham Green neighborhood in Newark. On Wednesday, around 7:40 p.m., a Newark Police Officer was on patrol in the Suburban Plaza Shopping Center.

He noticed a silver Volvo occupied by a white male who matched the description of the suspect in the Indecent Exposure incident that occurred in the neighborhood. The driver was contacted by the officer, who noted the driver

was a white with male short brown hair. average frame, in his early 30s, with tattoos on his left arm. His physical appearance was an exact match to the description

provided by the 10 and 11 year old girls in Nottingham Green.

The driver was identified as Joshua W. Goldstein, 34, of Appleton Road, Elkton, Md. During an interview with a detective. Goldstein acknowledged his involvement in the incident. He was charged with four counts of Indecent Exposure 1st Degree, and was committed to the Howard Young Correctional Facility in default of \$2,000 secured bond. Goldstein was also ordered to have no contact with the victims, and if released, must be in his home between the hours of 8 p.m. and 6 a.m.

# Skateboarders cause damage

Police were dispatched to investigate a criminal mischief complaint at the Amstel Square Apartments at 57 Elkton Road. Owner Timothy Thompson showed officers scratch marks and a visible wax residue, that were apparently caused by the bottom of a skateboard, on some cement barriers and a black railing on the north side of Amstel Avenue. Thompson told police that he believes the marks were made between June 9 and June 16 and that he has not seen any skateboarders on the property. The approximate repair cost is \$500.

# Former employee suspected in theft

On Tuesday, June 16, Newark Police responded to a theft report at Porter Ford, 600 Ogletown Road, Newark. Service manager Jim Murphy stated that a Lenovo 3000 N500 laptop computer worth \$539.40 had been taken from an unsecured tech room. Murphy told police that the computer was placed in the tech room at 5:30 p.m. the night before, but found that it was missing at 9:30 a.m., the next day.

Though all service bay employees end their shifts p.m., a former employee, Christopher Corbitt, was observed in the service area. Corbitt had no scheduled meetings or business that day, according to Murphy. Corbitt had been fired on June 10 for stockpiling new parts from the dealership by lying that he had installed the part and hiding it in his toolbox. Murphy said that he feels Corbitt is the only person capable of committing the theft and does not suspect any of the employees. A record search of Corbitt revealed that he was arrested in 2002 for attempting to steal an Acura car engine from the dealership where he was employed. A warrant application for Corbitt has been filed with the Justice of the Peace.

Police found the operation was complete with grow lamps, egg crates, plastic plant pots, 26 pounds of marijuana and a large amount of marijuana seeds. New Castle County undercover

# **Incoming freshman get early orientation**

elaWorld 101, which runs from June 23-July 22, is a series of oneday orientations designed to welcome new students and parents to the University of Delaware. Offered weekdays excluding Friday, July 3, when the campus will be closed for the Independence Day holiday weekend -- a student's DelaWorld 101 day begins at 8 a.m. in the Trabant University Center and wraps up at approximately 5 p.m.

A record number of freshmen in the Class of 2013 will join a large number of transfer students participating in DelaWorld 101 this summer, Faye Duffy, senior associate director of undergraduate admissions and director of

DelaWorld, said.

"More than 3,900 freshmen and more than 300 transfer students have been assigned a date to attend DelaWorld," Duffy said. "This is the largest freshman class ever."

After a general welcome at 8:15 a.m., students and parents will be separated, with specific programs for each audience.

DelaWorld student leaders will be on hand to help make sure that incoming freshmen and transfer students feel welcome in their new home at the First State's flagship uni-

"We have 15 DelaWorld leaders, and the Honors Program also has a cadre of Honors orientation leaders. not to mention a host of students assisting the Registrar's Office," Duffy said. "Overall, there are about 150 UD staff, faculty and students who are involved in some capacity during each DelaWorld Day."

Among the freshmen for fall 2009 will be 123 international students, a 300 percent increase over last year, said Amy Foley, senior associate director of admissions.

"Many students who are completing the Conditional Admissions Program through the English Language Institute have been invited to DelaWorld for the first time," Foley said. "Close to 40 students have been scheduled for the first week of DelaWorld, allowing them to attend orientation, meet other members of the freshman class and receive academic advising before flying home for the summer."

New students will be able to discuss their fall course selections with an academic adviser and explore specific information sessions on campus diversity, services for students with learning disabilities and student life.

Another traditionally popular part of the program is DelaWorld Fair, where new students can meet with representatives from athletics, music, religious organizations and student media, a session topped off with free ice

Students also will be introduced to the city of Newark and opportunities at UD for travel, service learning, career development, academic enrichment and wellness programs.

For parents, DelaWorld 101 affords the opportunity to meet other parents and to attend sessions on academic and student life and campus safety.

The new student orientation also is a chance for parents to obtain answers on billing, financial aid, housing, student health, computing, banking and

the May 2009 financial statements, which showed that results were \$2 million below estimates for the first four months of the year. Most of this shortfall, \$1.535 million. is because of utility net revenues being down. Electric consumption is 2.5% below budget estimates and water revenues are down \$576 thousand because of lower volumes and the late changes to the budgeted rate increases. Though sewer margins differ by \$858 thousand, due to timing differences, these same margins could help matters in the coming months. The report states. "The decline in sales volumes across all three utilities indicates that the economic recession is significantly affecting consumer behavior.'

On the plus side, operating expenses are \$243 thousand below budget estimates, with the Water, Sewer, Police and Public Works Departments all coming in below budget. Offsetting these areas are Finance, Electric and Parking, which are over budget due to annual contracts made earlier in the year.

Though cash on hand is \$12 million, the cash balance has declined \$2.4 million since the year began and is an important concern for the Council. Council Member David Athey suggests having a game plan put in place to prevent drastic changes having to be made later in the year. Councilman Pomeroy strongly suggested that the Council must re-evaluate all possible options.

# Wilmington and Newark residents accused of stealing 100K from elderly

New Castle County Police arrested two men for stealing more than \$100,000 from at least eight elderly victims. One of the suspects is also wanted as a fugitive in Pennsylvania for similar crimes.

On April 1, County Police responded to a home in the 200 block of Laurel Avenue, northeast of Newark, for a report of a fraud investigation involving an 85-year-old male victim. When officers arrived, they contacted the children of the victim who reported one of the two suspects approached the victim and convinced him to allow them to complete a painting project at the home.

Originally, the victim agreed to pay the two suspects \$500 for the work they did. After completing the work (and some unapproved "work" on the roof), the suspects charged the victim \$4,000. One of the suspects returned to the home 10 days later and issued another contract for additional work and charged the victim another \$6,400 for the same work completed 10 days prior.

Officers investigated this incident and contacted a special investigator from the Senior Protection Section, of the Delaware Department of Justice. Based on the joint investigation, police and investigators learned that three male suspects had been working together and cashing multiple checks at a local check cashing business. This investigation led the officers to an additional seven victims who live in the following communities: Gwinhurst, Greenmount, McDaniel Crest, and Swanwyck.

In each case, the suspects approached the victims and indicated they were professionals who noticed their roofs

or chimneys were in need of repair. In some cases, they would tell the unsuspecting victim they would face fines if the work was not completed in a timely manner. The suspects would verbally provide a price in the range of \$100-\$300 and after completing the work, billing the victims thousands of dollars.

During the course of the investigation, officers uncovered a number of other victims who reside in the following locations: Newark, Norwood, PA, and Haverford, PA.

The suspects, who listed a Newark address for the business, fled the state before the officers could arrest them. Investigator later received a tip that indicated the suspects were in Fairfax County, Va. This information was passed on to the authorities in Virginia in the beginning of June.

On June 10, 2009, two of

On June 10, 2009, two of the three suspects were arrested as fugitives in Virginia and later returned to Delaware after they waived extradition. Fairfax County authorities are now looking at the suspects for home improvement fraud cases that occurred in their jurisdiction as well.


The following men have been charged with eight counts of home improvement fraud, eight counts of conspiracy and one count of theft:

- Alexander Patterson, 42, who resides in the 1100 block of S. College Avenue in Newark

- Alexander Williamson, 22, who resides in the 2000 block of Jackson Avenue in Wilmington.

Both men have been arraigned and committed to the Howard Young Prison after failing to post \$35,000 secured bail. William Patterson is also being held as a fugitive from Pennsylvania for similar crimes.

The third suspect, Robert Gregg,48, remains at large and may possibly be in Missouri. # Blue tops Gold in clash of gridiron sta

For the past 54 years at the end of every football season in stadiums all over the Diamond State, thousands of Delaware senior football players have walked off the field after their final regular season games hoping to have the opportunity to strap on their helmets and play in front of family and friends one last time at the annual Blue-Gold All-Star Football game.

But for Blue defensive lineman Josh Watson, playing in the annual game meant much more than that. The 6foot-5 255 pound Watson's Dickinson team did not win a game this past fall, so when the final horn sounded and

On Gold's next possession, a fumbled snap deep in its own end forced quarterback Kenny Anderson (Middletown) to kick the ball out of the end zone for a safety, putting Blue up 12-0 with just over seven minutes remaining in the third

Gold tried to put together one last scoring drive with 7:52 remaining in the fourth quarter, but Blue's other defensive lineman from Dickinson, Eddie Stewart. sacked Glasgow's Chris Cruz to force a fourth and long at the Gold 34-yard line. Cruz dropped back to pass but was

Then I was a chaplain at the University of Delaware, I was invited to give a brief talk during the preschool orientation program.

I was introduced as a clergyman, and I saw the eyes of the 25 students glaze over – they thought they knew the content of my talk before I said a word: "Students, welcome to the University. The problems of late teenagers have been very important to me ever since I was one. You are a kid and a young adult all at the same time. Semester after semester, I helped roommates pack up and return to their disappointed and/or angry parents. (Nine times, two in one semester.) I also attended funeral services for five friends who had gone home in a hearse.

I didn't mention this in my orientation talk, but it was all there in my head and heart. I read to them a newspaper article about what had happened to some incoming U of D freshmen the year before.

They had either been invited-

or invited themselves- to an offcampus party, replete with kegs, booze, booming music, and raucous shouting. It was cool, it was great, it was amazing! Two days on campus and they were already in! Then someone called the police.

The article concluded with a description of some freshmen "kids" in a corner of the apartment – crying and sobbing! A 240-pound would-be football player was shaking with grief, "I'm going to be kicked out! I'll never play football again!" One girl/woman was chanting. "How will I tell my parents? I'm not even done unpacking!" Some just stared at the wall, wailing. Underage drunks!

I looked up at my late-teenage audience and said. "They were disgusting! They knew what they were doing – and did it! The risk was the thrill – the possibility of getting caught was a delicious part of the whole adventure of Party Roulette! They broke the Eleventh Commandment of 'Thou shalt not get caught!' Well, they were! Boo hoo!"

"So if you do play the game and get caught for God's sake, don't cry! That's disgusting!"

I sat down to a response of total silence.

Good!

A shaken faculty member came up and presented me with an Orientation Week tee shirt with a goofy-looking Blue Hen on it.

I had tried.

# Letter-writer says Bauscher deserves praise

Delieve every tax-paying citizen of Newark owes John Bauscher a debt of gratitude for his attempt to raise the public's awareness of the request by Council to "tax...any activity... within the limits of the City." The City's printed response to his commentary was to tie John Bauscher's good name to the "unique demands of rental properties on municipal services", essentially fear-mongering to the tax-paying residents that the tenant population is the cause of the problems in our fair City.

The City fails to identify in their response the fact that single-family rental properties pay not only their full complement of real estate taxes and fees for all municipal

services, but also "rental permit fees" of the same magnitude again, effectively subsidizing the tax rate for everybody else. The City further fails to identify in their response that John Bauscher's rental permit fees, as a single-family landlord, are more than four times higher per unit than the City charges the more than 30 large rental corporations who actually account for the overwhelming quantity of the permitted tenant population.

Although the rental permit, fees are included in Section 17 of the Municipal Code, "for the purpose of protection of public health, safety and welfare", the City does not justify in their response that a tenant places more of a burden on municipal services than a permanent resident, and further that John Bauscher's tenants, in particular, place more than four times more burden on municipal services than tenants in an apartment complex.

The City will most likely promise that they will not abuse this new taxing author-

Tip 1. Subscribe to Two Cent Tips for Delaware. UD

Tip 2: Don't go "shopping". If you don't go shopping you won't spend money. The less often you go to the store the more money you will save. If you shop with a plan and a list of items needed you can get in and out of a store quickly with just those items purchased. Everyone in the class agreed the more times they went to the store they were more likely

to buy things they did not need.

Tip 3: Shop for the Right
Reason - If shopping is filling a need other than acquiring needed goods and services, look at why you shop. Some people shop to socialize, for a reward, as an antidote to depression, to booster self-esteem or self-assertion and

Tip 4: Take care of what you have. There is one thing we all have that we want to last a long time - our bodies. Simple attention to the proven preventative health practices will save money. Good diet, exercise, adequate rest, needed immunizations and proper dental care will go a long way to helping to keep our bodies healthy. Apply that same principle to the upkeep of

# UD Ginn suspended for DWI incident

Ginn, 32, was stopped by University of Delaware police for driving the vehicle the wrong way down a one-way street in Newark early Friday morning, June 19 and later released.

He will be arraigned at Court 40 in Newark on driving under the influence and the traffic charge at a later date. In addition to his suspension, Ginn will immediately enroll in the University of Delaware's Substance Abuse Program for Faculty and Staff and follow its requirements fully. He will be required to sign a waiver so that his attendance at these mandatory counseling sessions can be reported to the UD Director of Athletics and Recreation Services.

He will also be subject to all restrictions outlined by University policies related to the driving of UD vehicles. A former standout quarterback and the 1999 team captain for the Blue Hen football team, Ginn currently has the second longest tenure of any member of the UD football staff and will begin his 10th season with the Blue Hens this fall.

He currently serves as the Blue Hen wide receivers coach and passing game coordinator and has previously held the roles of offensive coordinator, quarterbacks coach, and running backs coach. "Brian is a terrific young coach, an exemplary employee, and a great mentor for our players," stated University of Delaware Head Football Coach K. C. Keeler. "This was his first offense, but he made a very poor decision and will pay the consequences. We take this type of situation very seriously for our coaches and players."Delaware will begin pre-season camp in August and will begin the 2009 season Sept. 4 at home vs. West Chester.

He earned two letters, becoming the first black student-athlete to earn that distinction at UD in 1951. He entered the U.S. Army 82nd Airborne Division and left the service as lieutenant and later rose to the rank of Major with the National Guard. He worked for the Delaware Department of Welfare as a case worker and later served 30 years with the United State Postal Service, retiring in 1989 as director of employee labor relations for the state of Delaware and the eastern shore of Maryland.

# Man wanted for trespassing




- 1. Where is the practice located? Is there ample parking?
