Dear Dr. Dresel:

Marion and I left Mexico City Friday evening for Cuernavaca, which has an altitude of 5,000 feet, 2,500 feet less than Mexico City, and will be here until Monday morning.

I am sending you herewith a copy of a letter which I dictated this morning "To Whom it May Concern". If there is anything you should like me to add to this letter or if there is any suggestion which you may wish to make with regard to it please let me know and I will be glad to rewrite the letter. I am also sending you a copy of a letter which I have written to Nevil Ford, who is the Vice President of the First Boston Corporation, one of the leading investment houses in the United States, and a good friend of mine. He has a wide acquaintance in the medical profession in New York and among those who are interested in helping the hospitals in New York, and has raised and is raising a good deal of money for hospitals. I am also sending you herewith a copy of a letter which I have written to Arthur Dean, who is a good friend and the senior member of the firm of Sullivan & Cromwell in New York. This one of the leading law firms in New York, of which Mr. Foster Dulles was the senior member before he resigned from it to take important positions with our government of which you know. As soon as I hear from them I will let you know.

I wrote you from Mexico City after our return and you undoubtedly have this letter. Marion's pulse rate continues to be very satisfactory and is running as I said in that letter. She has not been taking any medication since we left New York except one dose of sodium phosphate during the trip down, and last night she took one of the bismuth powders which you gave her. She is really ever so much better but she continues to be bothered with gas. It seems to be gas which moves around her whole intestinal tract. It does cause her discomfort but so far as I can tell it does not seem to accelerate the pulse rate and the increase in the pulse rate after eating does not seem to be so noticeable as it was before. I would appreciate your sending me by air mail the prescription for the bismuth powders as she has only three or four left.

I will keep you advised as to developments.
