Winter Quarters January 17 1862

Drummontown accomac Co Camp wilkes va

Dear Sister

I received your Letter and was glad to hear from you and to hear that you was well we are Still on the eastern Shore of virginia the most god for Saken part of the Country i ever Saw i have had very good health until now and i have had a very bad Cold But it is got Better the peopple is very poor Down here and in the inteior part of the State they are in a Starving Condition you Said alfred Sent his love to me you Can tell him for me that his Love was not accepted By me tell him that I will never write to him until he writes to me if that is never

My remarks are few and Brief as the preacher Says i wish you would Continue to Send one a paper if you think the cost will not over run the probbit and Lend me a few Stamps and make affred pay for them i can get paper and every thing Else i want But Stamps and the Stores Does not keep them our Rigement has Been accepted for three years there is a great many to Be mustered out on fray Day Lewis Buckley for one the man you Spoke of inyour Fast Letter he is Consumfled we had a hard Battle the other Day in which the Second Delaware Rigement was ingaged a gainst Capl Snown's Battery B pernell Legien the fight fasted 20 minutes and we quit with Gold hands

tell Sarah wood and marget Crpppps that Samuel Biddle and me has got a pair of fine yong Gentlemen But they are Black But never mind that for we have got scrubbing Brush and are Scrubbing them white

tell maggie Crosson that I am much a Blige to her for writeing to me
