GOVERNOR'S MESSAGES

May 13, 1953

To the Honorable The House of Representatives of the State of Delaware Dover, Delaware

Gentlemen:

This is to advise that I have signed Senate Bill No. 181 in part and disapproved certain sections making appropriations of money.

The title of this Bill is as follows: "AN ACT TO AMEND TITLE 31, DELAWARE CODE OF 1953, ENTITLED WELFARE' BY CHANGING THE RESIDENCE REQUIREMENT AND INCREASING THE MAXIMUM AMOUNT OF ASSISTANCE PAYABLE UNDER THE AID TO THE BLIND PROGRAM, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS".

I disapprove of the last three words in the title which are as follows: "AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS". I disapprove of sections three and four having to do with specific appropriations for the fiscal years of 1954 and 1955.

This action is taken in accord with authority granted to the Governor under Section 18, Article 3, of the Constitution

of the State of Delaware.

In arriving upon this conclusion, I gave my careful consideration to the problem of the blind in our state and I might add this has been a problem which I have been interested in for many years.

The merits of this bill were discussed with Doctor Francis Cummings, Executive-Secretary of the Delaware Commission for the Blind and a full understanding with him reached

regarding my action on this bill.

The additional appropriations provided by this bill are over and above usual appropriations and are in the order of new and additional appropriations provided by the state. With the necessity of raising taxes in order to again place the state on a sound fiscal basis new and additional appropriations must be held to the minimum. These appropriations amount to

\$30,000.00 for the biennium 1954-55.

Since aid and assistance to the blind is a cooperative program supported by both public and private funds it is my belief and understanding with Doctor Cummings that the approved provisions of this bill may be effectively carried out in proper distress or hardship cases without the appropriations provided by the state even though such appropriations may have been desirable were additional state funds readily available.

I am advised that the approved features of this bill are most desirable and necessary in meeting more effectively the aid to the blind program and I want to congratulate the members of the legislature in acting favorably upon this measure containing these provisions.
