Council race heats up in District 5

District 5 residents will go the polls Tuesday to fill the seat vacated by Councilman Ezra Temko, who announced earlier this year he would not seek a third term.

The polling place, First Presbyterian Church Memorial Hall at 292 W. Main St., will be open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The race took an unexpected turn Monday when one of the three candidates, William "Ed" Smith IV, dropped out, citing health and family reasons.

"It would be better for me to withdraw my candidacy for city council at this time. To do otherwise would be unfair to all concerned," Smith said in a statement. "I apologize to all parties for the late timing, but am convinced it is better to do so now rather than not being able to fulfill the requirements of serving on city council."

His departure leaves two candidates

vying for the position, which represents the northwestern part of the city, including neighborhoods such as Fairfield, West Branch and Christianstead.

The candidates met Saturday for a community forum at the Unitarian Universalist Fellowship of Newark church.

Celeste, a DuPont engineer from Fairfield, said one of the biggest issues facing Newark is traffic congestion, a problem that will be compounded once the University of Delaware's science and technology campus opens on the site of the former Chrysler plant.

"Looking to the future, traffic will be more difficult," Celeste said.

He called for a re-examination of the old Newark Beltway plan, a controversial idea first proposed in the 1960s that called for diverting through-traffic away from the center of town. He said that while it is not feasible to implement the

The party's over

Resident complains about aftereffects of rowdy St. Patty's Day festivities

Norma Ringel recently moved back to Newark, and she doesn't like what's become of her hometown.

"The university has grown, and the town has declined," Ringel told Newark City Council members earlier this week.

Ringel attended the council's March 26 meeting to complain about how University of Delaware stu-

dents behaved in her Haines Street neighborhood on St. Patrick's Day.

"The party started at 10 a.m. two doors down," Ringel said.

By 2 a.m., a block party was in full swing with students reportedly vomiting and passing out in Ringel's boxwoods.

"There was no respect for our yard," she complained.

"The next day, there was a lot of trash to pick up. ... I really urge the city to do something about this. I

believe the university is trying, and I believe it's out of control on the city's streets."

Councilman David Athey (District 4) also noticed the uptick in parties on St. Patrick's Day along Kells Avenue near his home. He called this year's festive Irish holiday the "perfect storm" because it fell on a Saturday and the weather was warm and sunny.

"I don't recall even three or four years ago being the situation it is now," Athey said.

The city partners with the university's police department

Christiana welcomes alumna back into the fold

Spring is here. You can feel it in the air, see it in bloom, and hear it in the below of "Play ball!"

At Christiana High School, baseball players are donning new uniforms — just as several Vikings teams did this year — and were greeted with freshly painted dugouts and a new fence topper. Softball players can see the construction of their new dugouts in between swings during batting practice with their new Jugs machine.

Fans enjoy sitting in new, handicapped-accessible bleachers and buying snacks from a renovated concession stand.

The new looks are just part of several transformations taking place in the Christiana athletic department.

It's a time of change in Viking Land, and the person behind those changes is one

of their own.

Elizabeth Moodie — she was known as Dale Colalillo in high school — was a three-sport star at Christiana in the early 1990s. The all-state catcher went on to play softball at Delaware, and then, after graduation, was hired as a sports director at the Western YMCA.

In the fall of 2008, she was hired to teach at Glasgow High School, and then, that spring, became head lacrosse coach at Christiana. The following fall she was offered an opportunity to teach business technology at her alma mater.

It was an offer she couldn't refuse.

"This is very interesting," she recalled of her reaction to the opportunity. "I recognize the teachers, the classrooms, the old desks and of course, the athletic fields."

Being a former student gave her a leg up on most new teachers.

"Being a new educator to a building always

has an acclimation phase," Christiana principal Kris Diviny said. "It takes a while for the educator to understand the culture of the building and become woven into the fabric of that culture and the building. Elizabeth, being a proud Viking graduate, already had a clear understanding of all that our Vikings can accomplish, and was fully invested in our school's success. She brings passion, hard work, and faith and hope that Christiana will be a school of choice."

It didn't take long for Moodie to become entrenched in her passion. She immediately became an assistant field hockey coach and continued in her role as head lacrosse coach later that spring. This past summer she accepted the job as athletic director, making an already busy personal and professional life even busier.

"My greatest challenge on a personal level is managing my time and balancing

my roles as athletic director, teacher, mother and wife," said Moodie, who has relinquished her coaching duties. "There is a lack of time to do everything and figuring out how to balance it all is a challenge at times."

As athletic director, Moodie created a lengthy list of changes she wanted to make. But she quickly realized there was a shorter list of changes that had to be made.

"I want our coaches to balance their emphasis on winning and teaching life skills and sportsmanship," she explained. "The focus should be on educational athletics. I place a lot of emphasis on the way my teams represent Christiana High School, and less emphasis on their on-field success."

Moodie said one of her immediate goals is for the school to receive its first sportsmanship award, an annual recognition by the Delaware Interscholastic Athletic Association to schools that dis-



play positive sportsmanship on and off the court.

"Sportsmanship is a priority for me," Moodie said. "There are certain things I want to see, that I want Christiana to be known for. Do they play hard? Do they respect the officials? I think it starts with me and then the coaches I select."

Moodie is determined to

check off all of the items on her to-do list, no matter how long it takes.

"Can you feel the Viking spirit?" she asked.

Yes, you can.

entire plan, parts of it could still be viable, such as widening the one-lane underpass on Casho Mill Road.

He also suggested installing speed cameras as a way

to free up police officers for more serious crimes.

Chapman, a financial planner from Fairfield Crest, said he sees fiscal stability as one of Newark's biggest issues. The city needs to diversify its revenue sources, he said.

of the Chrysler plant something that can benefit both parties.

Many of the questions from the audience revolved around student rental housing. The issue has been the subject of much debate recently, and last month, council approved stricter limits on apartment density.

Celeste said while is sympathetic to residents' concerns about student encroachment, he doubts there is much the city can do to stop it.

There are a lot of students who do not want to live on campus, and they don't have anywhere else to go. I don't know how you block that," he said. "I don't see a feasible way to prohibit students and still be the USA."

Chapman suggested the city instead look at ways to address the problems caused by an influx of students moving downtown.

"My concern on this issue goes beyond the type of residents in this area, and I want to focus on what seems to be a systemic problem of increasing automobiles, traffic and parking that our infrastructure cannot handle," he said.

Councilmen Doug Tuttle and Stu Markham are running unopposed, so there will be no election in their districts.

to provide extra coverage during homecoming weekend. Athey suggested a similar partnership should be put in place for St. Patrick's Day.

Mayor Vance Funk indicated the city increased police and zoning enforcement patrols over the holiday weekend. He told Ringel that he'd ask zoning inspec-

tors to start regularly patrolling her neighborhood.

Four years ago, the city started a weekend inspection program for zoning code enforcement.

"We got complaints from residents about the condition of rental [properties occupied by university students] on the weekends, and we were mandated to do something about it," explained Steve Wilson,

Newark's code enforcement supervisor.

One of the biggest complaints involved excessive garbage left behind after weekend parties held by university students.

Each weekend, at least one of the department's seven inspectors drives the city's streets looking for zoning infractions.

"It has morphed into not only

the rentals, but also the downtown businesses," Wilson said. "We [cover] the whole city at least once or twice during a month's period."

The St. Patrick's Day parties kept inspectors busy. The city issued 34 warnings for code violations on the Sunday after St. Patrick's Day. Typically, inspectors issue about a dozen citations each weekend.

"We will issue the property warning notices first, and then if there's no compliance, it's the inspector's discretion if he issues a citation for excessive garbage," Wilson explained.

The fine for excessive garbage is \$100 and can be appealed to the alderman's court.

Wilson warns Newark residents that there may be an

uptick in student parties on May 5 since Cinco de Mayo falls on a Saturday this year. His office is already making plans to bring in extra weekend inspectors.

"This is our fifth year into this, and we know pretty much where the big parties happen," Wilson said. "We're trying to be proactive and trying to get people to behave."

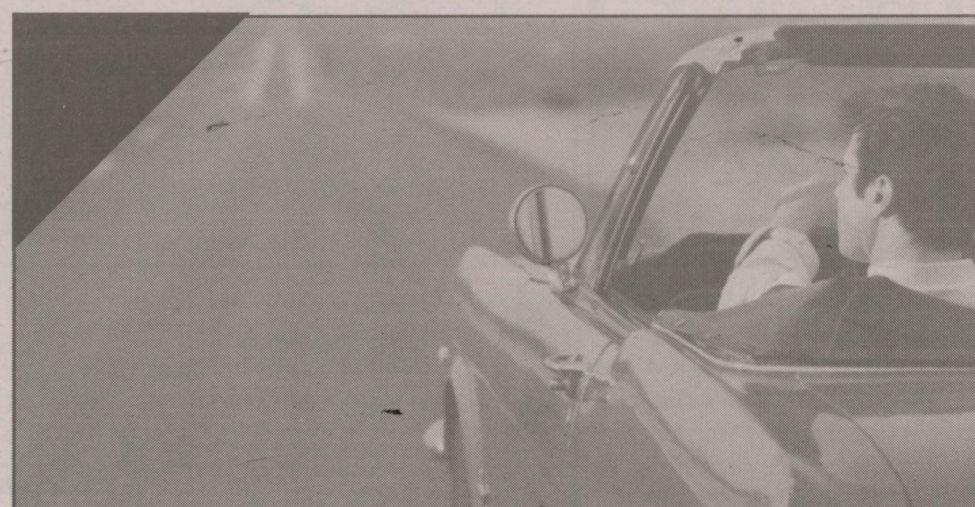

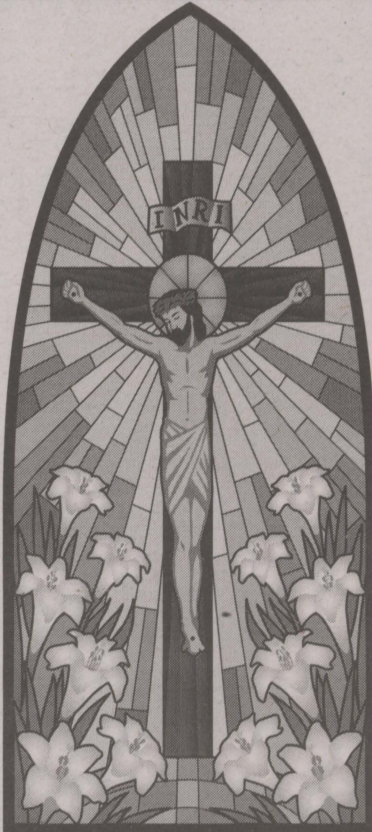

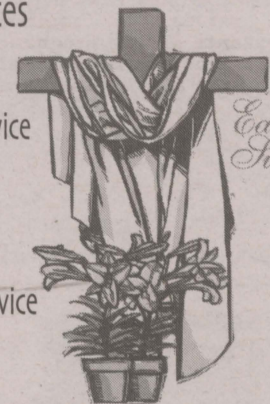

City looks to give skaters a place of their own

The city hopes to get skateboarders off the streets by giving them their own spots to pop and grind.

Last week, Newark's park officials announced plans to build two or three "skate spots" at several city parks. Handloff, Phillips, Kells, Fairfield and Lumbrook parks are possible locations.

The spots will be constructed out of concrete, measuring between 2,000 and 4,000 square feet — about the size of a tennis court. "Each will be designed with its own unique features," reads a fact sheet distributed at

last Thursday night's meeting.

The city is currently soliciting feedback on the potential sites before settling on final locations. The public is invited to submit their comments to the parks department via email (park-

srec@newark.de.us) by April 16.

"We figure through this process that there may be some really good reasons that are brought to us on why

we shouldn't (put a skate spot) at a particular location," said Charlie Emerson, director of parks and rec.

Newark has an estimated 1,300 skateboarders, but no skateboarding facilities. During the past five years, the police department has received more than 100 calls from residents and businesses complaining about skateboarders using parking lots and streets to practice their sport.

"We are here in support (of the skate spots) because of the problems we see in the downtown area," said Master Cpl. Gerald Bryda with the Newark Police Department. "We want to be able to give the skateboarders a tool. ... It's a tool for us to let the kids know we're not here to be

harsh law-enforcement officers — there's an alternative out there for them."

Newark resident Sami Abdel-Salam said skateboarding is sometimes affiliated with graffiti and vandalism and wondered if those types of property crimes might become a problem in the parks where skate spots are built.

"My concern is the displacement of those problems to other locations," Abdel-Salam said.

"We can't guarantee there won't be a problem," Emerson responded. "We have problems at our basketball courts; we have problems at our pool. ... I believe that by and large skateboarders get a bad rap."

Abdel-Salam lives near Kells Park and questioned if it's a good location for a skate spot because few kids live in the adjoining neighborhood.

Emerson said Kells and Phillips are on the list of potential locations because of their proximity to James F. Hall Trail.

Abdel-Salam also questioned the costs associated with maintaining the skate spots.

"These things will be designed so there's minimum maintenance for them," Emerson said. "We don't

anticipate any serious problems. They're going to be very sturdily built."

Other attendees had concerns about the lack of parking at some of the potential locations and if the skate spots would cause noise pollution.

Emerson conceded Newark's parks were built as neighborhood parks, meaning the city intended for residents to walk or bike to their nearest park, instead of driving and parking.

The parks' smaller sizes also explain why the city wants to build two or three skate spots versus a full-scale skate park.

"We don't really have space in our parks for a large facility like that," Emerson said.

All of the potential locations, except Handloff, have asphalt volleyball courts that aren't being utilized. If selected, those asphalted areas would be converted into skate spots.

The city has received an \$80,000 grant from the Delaware Land and Water Conservation Trust Fund to partially fund the skate spots. A private donor has pledged another \$40,000, with an additional \$40,000 coming from this year's capital improvement budget.

"My hope would be we

would be able to get this project going this year," Emerson said.

Newark skateboarders will be asked to provide input during the design phase.

There are approximately 11.8 million skateboarders in the U.S., according to a 2004 Sporting Goods Marketing Association Sports Participation Study.

Skateboarding is the third most popular sport for American teenagers, with football and basketball ranking first and second respectively.
