Downes Elementary to offer Chinese immersion program

Man assaulted, robbed on Delaware Avenue

Four men, one armed with a handgun, attacked and robbed another man in downtown Newark early Monday morning, police said.

The 24-year-old victim was walking in the 100 block of Delaware Avenue at approximately 1:35 a.m. when he was approached from behind by a man wielding a gun.

The victim, a graduate student at Wilmington University, was shoved to the ground, and three more men repeatedly punched and

kicked his face, said Master Cpl. Gerald Bryda, a spokesman for the Newark Police.

The robbers stole a wallet and cell phone before the victim was able to break free and run away.

The armed suspect is described as a light-skinned black man, approximately 20 years old with a thin build and loose braids. He was seen getting in a dark four-door sedan before leaving the area.

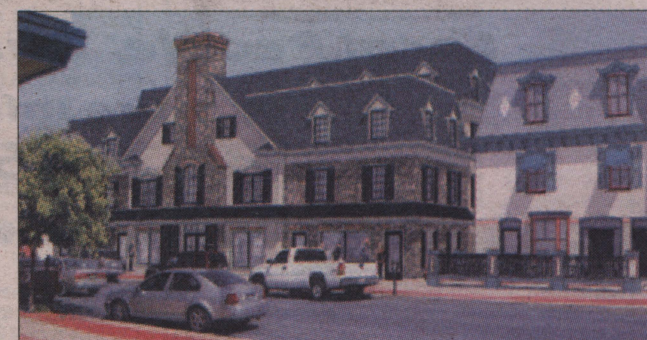
A demolition project necessary to make way for two new housing complexes in downtown Newark will begin later this month.

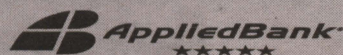

'Madea' went to jail, but accused shoplifter went to Kmart

A Wilmington woman faces shoplifting, weapon and terroristic threatening charges after allegedly stealing numerous items – including the DVD “Madea Goes to Jail” – from a local store.

Newark Police Cpl. James Spadola said two officers were summoned to Kmart at College Square at about 4:30 p.m. Feb. 13 by a loss prevention specialist who watched the suspect stuff several items into a tote bag, then leave and re-enter the store – still carrying the stolen items.

Deborah Johns, 51, of Wilmington, was charged with shoplifting, possession of a weapon by a person prohibited and possession of a weapon in a safe school zone as well as terroristic threatening. When she was stopped by police, Johns was in the second part of her spree, having stolen the DVD as

well as jeans and a hoodie, according to Cpl. Spadola. Officers searching her tote bag also found items allegedly taken earlier, the corporal said. They included underwear, a watch, batteries, headphones and a portable CD player. Also in the tote bag was a 4 1/2-inch knife, Cpl. Spadola said.

The terroristic threatening charge was the result of the suspect's tirade as she was led out of the store, during which she hurled racial and sexual insults, he said. She was arraigned and released on \$6,200 unsecured bail. A condition of her bail is that she stay out of Kmart.

Police charge couple with growing marijuana in Robscott Manor home

Two people are facing drug charges after police busted a marijuana growing operation in their Robscott Manor home, investigators said. Jerry Carletti, 34, and his girlfriend, 28-year-old Abbie Deardorff, are accused of running the operation while their 1-year-old child lived in the house. Acting on tips from the public, New Castle County Police raided the residence in the unit block of Gill Drive Feb. 15, said police spokesman Cpl. John Weglarz Sr. In the basement, they found equipment used to grow marijuana, including a water filtration system, lights

and planting materials, as well as handwritten logbooks and several dried up plants, Weglarz said. Upstairs, officers seized 1,200 grams of marijuana, which was packaged in bags and hidden inside a freezer, a kitchen cabinet and a safe. The safe, which was found in a crawl space in the master bedroom, also contained a .22-caliber rifle and nearly \$3,000 in cash, Weglarz said. Carletti and Deardorff were each charged with possession with intent to deliver marijuana, second-degree conspiracy, possession of drug paraphernalia and endangering the welfare of a child. Both were released after posting a \$13,200 bond.

Frat house break-in probed

Newark Police are seeking the person who entered a home on Kershaw Street rented by Theta Chi Fraternity and stole four photographs documenting the fraternity's history. Cpl. James Spadola said the burglary occurred between 10:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Monday. The photos, taken from the living room, depicted the Theta Chi classes of 1979, 1982, 1998 and 2008. This is the traditional Rush Week at University of Delaware. No other crimes involving fraternities or

sororities have been reported as of Tuesday, Cpl. Spadola noted.

Laptop delivered, temporarily

A resident of West Knoll Apartments on Elkton Road told police that someone stole a laptop computer that a courier left outside his door sooner than expected. Cpl. James Spadola said the owner was not expecting delivery of the laptop until last Feb. 13, and alerted police after tracking the package and learning it was delivered Feb. 8. The computer was valued at \$3,700, the corporal said.

Bus-stop fracas involves three

Newark Police responded to Academy and Courtney streets early Sunday to quell a fight that apparently spilled out of a University of Delaware bus, according to Cpl. James Spadola. Two of the three subjects face charges of disorderly conduct and underage consumption of alcohol. “The scene was chaotic,” he said. “The fight started over someone mouthing off to one of the kids’ girlfriends.”

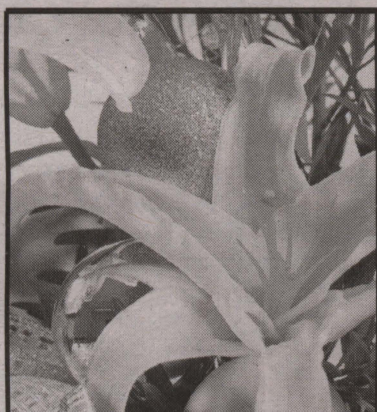

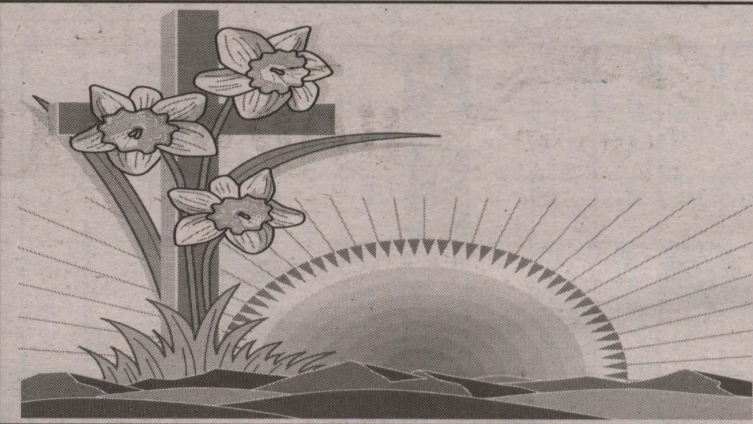
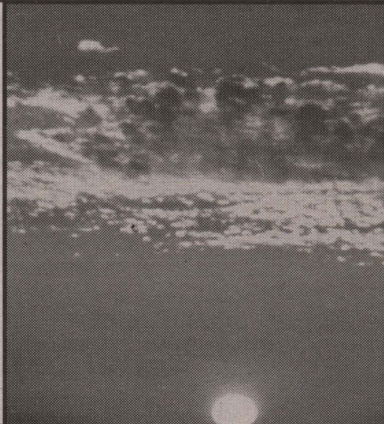

Newark girls prepare to make big splash at state championships

Most swimmers usually get their first competitive experience as youngsters on a team at their local swim club during the summer months. The weather is ideal, the water is refreshing, and the pressures of school, like the swimmers themselves, are on vacation. The focus is on fun, with mental stress virtually nonexistent.

But as swimmers move on to higher levels, those beautiful summer days turn into long hours spent practicing and competing in hot natatoriums during the cold winter months. There are pressures to choose social activities over extra swim sessions, and it's a constant challenge balancing schoolwork with training time. The focus turns to winning and dropping time. It becomes mentally grueling.

It takes a special mindset to go along with physical talent to be a successful high school swimmer. Jordan Sawyer is one of those swimmers. The Newark High senior started swimming competitively at Maple Valley Swim Club when she was 7 years old. She is now preparing for her final swim meet as a Yellowjacket – not just physically, but mentally.

"The mental attitude," she answered when asked the most difficult aspect of swimming. "The ability to push through the hard times is the most challenging. When things are tough, it's easy to give up."

Sawyer earned a varsity letter all four years at Newark. At the recent Blue Hen Conference Championships, the co-captain finished second in the 100-yard freestyle (57.55) and third in the 50 free (25.84), despite being on vacation and "out of the water" for 10 days leading up to the event. At the state meet, she is hoping to top last year's performance, when she placed fourth in the 50 free.

"I think I have a chance to win the 50 free, but I definitely want to place in the top three in the 50 and the 100 free," said Sawyer, who will also swim two relays at states. "For most people it's about individual goals and getting a best time. My goal is more time-based than placing or beating someone else."

Sawyer and eight of her Newark teammates are preparing for next week's DIAA State Championships after finishing second overall behind Charter School of Wilmington – Newark's lone regular-season loss was

to Charter – at the conference championships. Blair Melcher's first-place finish in the 100-yard breaststroke combined with second-place finishes in all three relays fueled the Yellowjackets' strong showing.

"We have more depth this year," fourth-year coach Bryan Stambaugh said of his team's impressive finish.

And it's that depth that the coach hopes will enable his team to finish in the top five at states.

"The keys are getting as many swimmers back to the state meet finals and getting all three relays back," he said. "This year, we have more girls who can swim more events and do well."

Two of those girls are juniors Gabby DeAngelis and Zoe Coffing, whom Stambaugh pointed to as being pleasant surprises.

"Gabby has dropped a tremendous amount of time and become someone we could rely on in the dual meets," Stambaugh explained. "Zoe got a concussion during the fall playing volleyball and missed the first month of the season. She is beginning to get back in the groove and should be ready for states."

Sawyer will be ready too, both physically and mentally. And then when she climbs out of the pool for

the last time as a scholastic swimmer, she'll have an important decision to make: whether to swim in college at Delaware or Drexel.

"I had always planned on going to Delaware," said Sawyer, whose entire family is affiliated with the university in some way. "But my former coach at the Western YMCA, Adam Braun, is now the assistant coach at Drexel. I would love the opportunity to swim for him again, but I was always set on Delaware, so it's making my decision tough."

The band plays at concert halls, theaters, schools, museums, hospitals and sporting events. It has also presented the "Star-Spangled Banner" at Philadelphia Phillies and Baltimore Orioles games and NASCAR's Dover 400.

The quintet also performs

patriotic songs and fan favorites at significant military ceremonies. Recently the band participated in the opening of the Fisher House at Dover Air Force Base and the merger of Naval and Air Force Bases in Charleston, S.C. to form Joint Base Charleston.

Fahrenbacher started playing the tuba nearly 37 years ago when he was 10 years old. He began performing in Air Force bands in 1994. Prior to the Brass Quintet, he has performed in the USAF Band of Flight and the USAF Band of Pacific-Asia.

Fahrenbacher said has

been in the Heritage Brass Quintet for nearly eight years.

He said he and his fellow band members rehearse

almost every day, but he also sets aside time to practice individually.

"I try to work an hour or two every day every week,"

Fahrenbacher said. "When we rehearse as a group, we rehearse the concert music like you hear tonight."

Goal is younger language immersion

Downes Elementary School in Newark will offer immersion in Mandarin Chinese, and Pulaski Elementary School in Wilmington will offer immersion in Spanish.

"The idea is to start with the youngest kids in the school," said Wendy Lapham, a spokeswoman for the Christina School District. "It grows with that class as they move up in elementary school."

Students will be able continue their immersion experience through elementary school and into middle school. Starting in high school, they will be able to receive Advanced Placement credit for their language study.

The immersion program began as an initiative by Gov. Jack Markell in 2012. The state invested \$1.9 million in the program and hopes to reach approximately 10,000 students in K-8 immersion programs by 2022.

In order for schools to be involved in the program, they have to apply for a series of grants to finance it, Lapham said.

The program kicked off during this school year with three elementary schools throughout the state. Next fall, there will be 12 schools involved, including the two in Christina.

One school already offering the Chinese immersion program is the McIlvaine Early Childhood Center in Kent County's Caesar

Rodney School District.

Ronald Gough, a spokesman for the Caesar Rodney School District, said the school has approximately 100 kindergartners participat-

ing in the program.

"It's received so many positive accolades from parents, children and the community," Gough said.

of 2,760 square feet of retail space on the first floor and 22 two-bedroom apartments upstairs. It will replace the vacant building that Gecko Fashions, Cat's Eye Hair Salon and the Marine recruiting station once occupied.

A nearby complex at 21-27 Choate Street will be a 7,000-square-foot building consisting of five, three-story townhouses and be named Choate Street Townhouses. The townhouses will each have four bedrooms and attached garages.

The site will replace the former Casablanca Restaurant that is currently used for storage.

The housing complexes will have a density of approximate-

ly 25 units per acre, in close comparison to the new Campus Edge Apartments located at 210 East Delaware Avenue, officials said.

The project will occupy a total of 1.079 acres, but a half acre of the site is presently leased to the city as part of Municipal Parking Lot #4. That agreement will remain intact, and the new project will allow city parking officials to reconfigure the lot to slightly increase the number of parking spaces.

City Planning Director Maureen Feeney Roser said she expects the demolition will only last a couple of days. She said the entire construction project should be completed in 11 months.

"The plan is to move on it as quickly as possible," she said.

When the Newark Academy closed in 1898, the growing public high school moved to the Academy Building on Main Street. Newark High moved again in 1925 to a new building on Academy Street and moved again to its present complex on East Delaware Avenue in 1955.

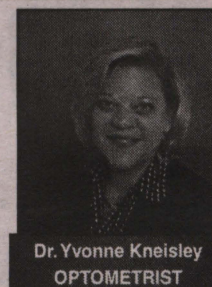

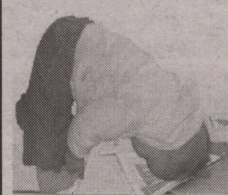
