and the Government here now over loan
for 11 millions seems to be composing
itself but I do not know the details
yet.

I'm glad to get good news of
Buchanan. I haven't seen Frances
since we are back. There have been
lots of parties recently but I haven't
felt much of an inclination to them
as I am getting back to normal
slowly. The politics come back pretty
strongly and the vicious circle of
news & politics continues but I feel

still have to spend too many hours

feel much encouraged tho.

I gather from your letter that
your father is well, and that makes me
