Any person who is employed for compensation paid by others than the Legislature and whose employment calls for or includes activity in or about the House of Representatives in regard to legislation must register with the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives. Such person shall disclose in the detail deemed by the Chief Clerk necessary, the following information which will be recorded in a register kept by the Chief Clerk: (1) the name and address of the registrant; (2) the name and address of the registrant's employer including any association, organized group, State agency or office, or labor

union, and in case of multiple employers a sufficient number so identified as to indicate the class or classes registered with whose interests the registrant is concerned; and (3) the subject or subjects of legislation to which his employment relates.

A person to whom this requirement of registration applies may not appear before a House committee in pursuance of his employment until he is registered except upon special invitation of the committee, nor shall he in such pursuit try to influence the legislative judgment or action of a member of the House.

A person who is registered under this rule, or who should be registered under it, when appearing before a committee shall disclose to the committee those in whose interest he speaks, the purpose of his appearance and when he or the person for whom he appears has a pecuniary or other special interest in a measure or proposal different than the public generally, which is not apparent from his testimony, the fact thereof. Further, in pursuance of the employment for which he is or should be registered he must not knowingly furnish false information or make a false statement which is material and relevant to any matter with an intention to, or which he should know will have a tendency to influence the judgment or action of the House or of a committee thereof.

University of Delaware Newark, Delaware 19711 Commission on The Status of Women Rep. John P. Ferguson Legislative Hall Dover, Del. 19901 Dear Representative Ferguson:

The Commission on the Status of Women of the University of Delaware, composed of and representing students, staff, professionals, faculty and administrators, is vitally interested in the proposed budget for the University of Delaware. As members of the University of Delaware President's Commission, we are charged with stimulating thinking on basic social changes as newly defined roles for men and women emerge and with analyzing the status and progress of women as students and employees of the University.

We know you are interested in maintaining a state university that is open to all segments of Delaware Citizenry, that has the best educational opportunities on all levels for Delaware students of all ages, and that provides employment opportunities equal to other components of the state. We also know the high expectations of people for leadership in the state with limited financial resources. However, the commission on the status of Women is very concerned about the proposed level of state support for the university in fiscal year 1977 and the way the cuts will affect the university and all the programs and people that are part of it. We appreciate your very difficult position of having to balance a budget and yet fund the state's many requests to maintain our excellent state services, but we would like to point out that the university in general and all its constituents will suffer in comparison with other universities and in the role it performs for the state if we are funded at the proposed level.

Specifically the cuts may especially impede the progress that has been made in the status of women at all levels in the university. New doors are being opened in employment both by legal rulings and by changing attitudes but without its proposed budget the university will not be able to hire either to replace or to fill new positions. This will, of course, take its toll on all levels—staff, professional and faculty. Worse still, in order to balance its budget, the university will have to eliminate positions and when all areas are scrutinized the largest number of cut backs that will be seen possible will be in the staff—mostly women.

The university is proceeding on its way with the very long

overdue and needed upgrading of clerica. anks, consisting mostly of women, and this cannot be financed with the present proposed state funding for the university.

Expansion of Women's Studies, a relatively new area of study at the university, will be impeded as will be many creative areas that strengthen the university and make it an important part of our society as it keeps up with basic social changes.

We thank you for your consideration of this very important matter—important to all citizens of Delaware, men and women, boys and girls who are our future students, employees and voting citizens. The Commission on the Status of Women represents the fulfillments of potential in men and women in our constantly changing society and urges you as a representative of the people of Delaware and their best interests to help the university provide for the future of the state.

Representative Plant requested that the following Editorial be made part of the record, An Editorial from The Morning News, Wilmington, Del. Wednesday May 26, 1976. Headline "How Can We Accept Corrections Bullying?"

We confess to almost total frustration over this state's bland acceptance of a corrections system dominated by legislative arrogance and ignorance.

Governor Sherman W. Tribbitt is being driven into a corner by the bullies of the legislature and may well dump Paul

Keve as acting prison commissioner.

Mr. Keve knows what prison administration is all about, but like all people he is not indispensable. The questions are: Who comes after Keve? And what happens then?

The answers are: More of the same. And probably worse.

As we write this, a supplemental appropriations bill is before the legislature to provide the corrections department with \$600,000 needed to meet its needs for the year. If it isn't passed soon, the June 15 payroll won't be met. The straight talk of it is that certain powerful legislators are holding the bill for ransom. They want Keve out. They want him out so they can have a yes-man in charge.

And what do they know about prison administration? Almost nothing.

Some have relations who are disgruntled employees of the corrections system, or former employees who were discharged.

The governor deserves credit for having had the gumption to stick by his appointee. But he also shares some of the responsibility for not having cracked down on the arm-twisters in the legislature for their intrusions into operational procedures.

They wrecked the reorganizational plan in corrections a year ago. Tribbitt should have vetoed the legislation, but he signed it and we were given a reorganization plan that provided no salary for the commissioner, no secretary, no business manager and no funds with which to reorganize. If ever there was a literal exercise in legislative irresponsibility, this was a classic case.

No state can have administration by the legislature.

What we have in Delaware are people like J. Donald Isaacs, owner-operator of a 600-acre grain and beef farm; Thomas B. Sharp, a sheet metal foreman; Charles Hughes, operator of a security service, and others like them, insisting on knowing all the answers to a problem that demands professionalism.

The governor can solve the problem for good.

Let him nominate one of the above as commissioner of corrections.

The system will go to hell in no time, but it might teach Delaware the lesson it needs so desperately to learn.

I was distressed to read in the paper that you have opened the previously closed meeting between your committee and my office to the public. Perhaps you and other committee members misconstrued the role of my office in the Farmers Bank investigation in particular or its role in criminal cases in general. It is the function of my office to investigate allegations of criminal conduct and in that regard we are prohibited from disclosing details substantially prejudice the successful completion of such investigations, it also would severly impact prejudicially upon the rights of those being investigated.

As you know, the genesis of my investigation into Farmers Bank matter was a formal complaint by the State Auditor of criminal conducy. That investigation has been ongoing since February 1, 1976, and may result in criminal charges within the next few months. I have apprised the Governor, and any members of the General Assembly who have asked that my investigation will also result in a thorough report on the reasons for the Bank's present precarious financial condition. In my talk with you yesterday, I asked about confidentiality at our meeting and you advised that you could not guarantee that members would not disclose matters discussed at that meeting. In view of that disclaimer, I would have required absolute confidentiality at that meeting; otherwise, the meeting would serve no useful purpose.

I believe the General Assembly has the right to ensure that the truth is brought out concerning the Bank's decline. I also believe that my already-on-going investigation will bring out that truth and any concurrent investigation by the General Assembly will substantially prejudice the possibility of reaching that truth and would be a duplicitous effort - wasting taxpayer's money.

Therefore, since I cannot disclose the details you apparently want in order to evaluate whether to conduct your own investigation, I can see no purpose in meeting and withdraw my consent to meet under the present situation.

The Reading Clerk read the following Veto Message into the record, from the Governor at 2:15 p.m.

June 7, 1976

To The House of Representatives of the 128th General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On May 27, 1976, I received House Bill No. 1131 entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 10, TITLE 14, DELAWARE CODE RELATING TO VOCATIONAL-TECHNICAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS."

I have decided to return this bill without my signature for several reasons.

House Bill No. 1131 does not have attached to it a fiscal note of the Controller General as required by §1904, Title 29, Delaware Code. While at first blush, it would seem that since the funding of such is by a New Castle County assessment on real property and therefore would have no impact on the State budget, in the final analysis we all realize that there are direct General Fund appropriations for the operation of the three vocational-technical schools in the proposed F.Y. '77 budget in excess of \$6 million and that additional State Funds would be needed were I to sign this measure into law.

The recent bill, Senate Bill No. 575, as amended, allowing an 8 cents/100 tax on assessed valuation of real property in the county was expected to be sufficient for the operation of the vocational-technical schools of the three districts. It has been explained that the bill was not costed-out with the realization of this consolidation bill. Were this bill to become law, there would be an additional dollar impact on the taxing authority of the district to the amount in excess of \$300,000 for F.Y. '77.

The 8-cent level in short was not projected to cover the operation of a consolidated leveled-up Vocational-Technical

School District which this bill would have created.

With this in mind, it would seem that the legislature would very much want to see the projected fiscal impact this bill would have created and for this reason I deem the absence of the fiscal note significant and not de minimus.

Similarly, I have been advised that the rules and regulations of the Department of Health, Education and Welfare would require significant shifting of programs, students, teachers and administration within such a consolidated district and all without sufficient time to allow a smooth and orderly transition.

I wish to state that a county-wide district which would deal with the specialized needs of Vocational and Technical Education would appear to be a good idea and I shall create without delay a Study Commission to examine the problems and propose a method to create such a district as envisioned in theory by this bill with the mandate that they draft legislation to accomplish this at the earliest moment during the 129th General Assembly.

I shall direct the Study Commission, however, to do more than was envisioned by this present piece of legislation, for I personally feel that a major problem must be dealt with in the Vocational Technical area in the immediate future. Presently, there is a greater demand for a Vocational Technical Education than can be accommodated by the present system (nor was such demand to have been met by the bill before me at this time) and, therefore, I will expect the Study Commission as an integral part of their mandate to address themselves to proposing the means for providing a Vocational Technical Education for every youngster desiring that education throughout this State.

The Reading Clerk read the following veto message from the Governor at 1:38 p.m.:

To the House of Representatives of the 128th General Assembly of the State of Delaware

On June 3, 1976, I received House Bill No. 790 entitled:

"An Act to Amend Chapter 21, Part XI, Title 21 of the Delaware Code Relating to the Priority of a Claim of an Insured Person Over the Subrogation Claims of an Insurer; and Arbitration Rights as to Losses to a Motor Vehicle."

I am returning this bill without my signature, not because I am opposed to the concept of this legislation, but because of technical problems it will probably cause and also because of the need to review and resolve the whole broader problem area of whether or not subrogation should be eliminated in our automobile "No-Fault" law.

It is my understanding that this legislation was intended to assure that our insured motorist would be paid first from any available automobile liability insurance, ahead of the claim of the insurance companies enforcing their subrogation rights for claims they have paid to their own insureds in the same accidents. This is a concept with which I fully concur. However, the bill as drawn will cause serious problems that may well cause the elimination of the intercompany arbitration system now in effect as to such subrogation claims and thereby instead of permitting this efficient cheap method of determination of such claims, force these subrogation claims to be filed as Superior Court cases leading to enormously increased expense and a substantial future burden on our already overburdened Superior Court system.

Representative LeGates, the sponsor of the legislation, has requested that I veto this legislation and he and I have therefore determined that the best course of action here is to request Insurance Commissioner John F. Richardson to form a commission composed of members of the public, not only this question of the priority between insureds and insurance companies enforcing subrogation claims, but also the broader question of whether or not there should be an elimination of such subrogation claims entirely in our auto-no-fault law and related matters. The Commissioner has agreed to promptly

form such a commission and it will recommend legislation by January 1, 1977. Hopefully, it will adopt the same type of thorough approach to this problem exhibited by the Medical Malpractice Review Commission I appointed last year where representatives of the public and legislative sectors joined with various interested parties in coming up with a comprehensive legislative suggestion early enough in that session to permit its careful review and thereafter receive the appropriate action by the legislature.

At your request we checked large and small departments and came up with the answer, unanimous, that the basic personnel work is now being done in the departments and can be done more efficiently and without additional help if the bill is passed to return personnel responsibility to the departments. One secretary of a large department said, "We can do it ourselves a helluva lot more efficiently." Another said that "We do all the work, but the Personnel Office makes the decisions and then we have to redo the work." In the Legislative Council-Comptroller General's Office, with 23 employees, Mrs. Maggie Smith does all the personnel work, including payroll, and she says it takes only 35 percent of her work time.

Among those we talked to in addition to Mrs. Smith were John Bryson, Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control; Richard Haber, Director of the Division of Highways—both of whom were emphatic for the change—and Herb Dayton, of the Department of Public Safety. All of these agencies have their own personnel sections which would not have to be expanded should the personnel bill pass.
