## A washout?

### Sandy hits the region, Newark mostly spared

Fierce winds and rain started pelting Newark Sunday and continued into the workweek, closing many local businesses, schools and government organizations, and – perhaps most disappointing – canceling the city's annual Halloween Parade.

Early in the week, as Hurricane Sandy – a.k.a. “Frankenstorm” – raged up the East Coast, the approaching storm drew comparisons to the “The Perfect Storm,” the Nor’Easter that struck Massachusetts on Halloween nearly 20 years ago that was later chronicled in a bestselling book and blockbuster film.

On Monday, city officials urged residents of Newark's low-lying, flood-prone areas to leave their homes before Hurricane Sandy struck. Winds upwards of 50 miles per hour and up to 10 feet of rain were expected to pound the region overnight Monday and into Tuesday, causing major power outages and possible damage to homes.

Fortunately, many of those fears proved futile: damage to local homes as the

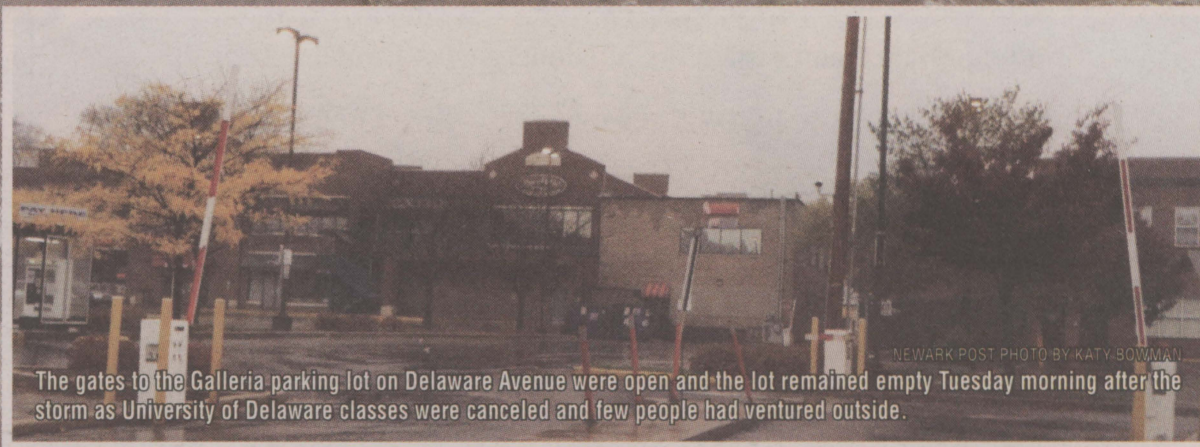

result of the storm was minimal, and no city residents lost power for more than an hour, city officials said.

"Overall, Newark did very, very well," Carol Houck, Newark's city manager, said Tuesday. "We have very minimal power outages and limited flooding. The flooding we did have subsided very quickly. Probably around 8 o'clock last night, it started to go down, and we never really had to shut down any streets. We were very fortunate in the way that (the hurricane) hit, and

very proud of our crew for the way they responded to anything that came up."

While residents of the area's proven flood zones were urged to evacuate Monday before the storm, there is no way to measure how many of them actually left their homes, said Newark Police spokesman Lt. Mark Farrell.

"We did send out (automated) calls to people in the flood plain, advising people, 'If you're in an area in the flood plain and don't (evacuate), we might not be able to get to you (in an emergency),' but we have no way

to track who heeded those warnings," he said.

Ultimately, no one called to request help with an emergency evacuation during the storm, Farrell said, and despite heavy rain and wind in the area Sunday through late Monday night, none of the city's flood-prone areas ended up flooding.

Houck said there was one power outage affecting a few homes on Orchard Road that she knew of, and a tree that did some damage to a home in Arbour Park before the storm hit on Sunday. But otherwise, the city was spared, she said.

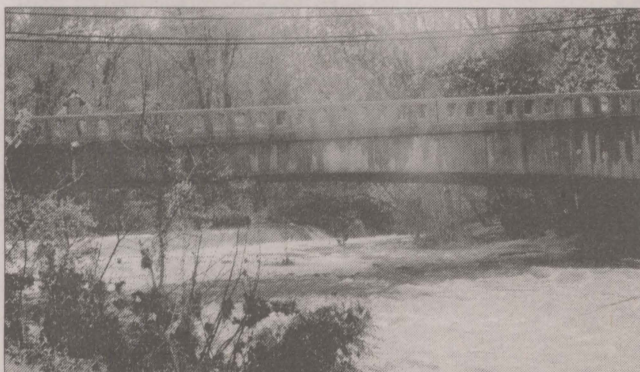
"I'm just so thrilled; I can't even tell you," Houck said. "For the amount of damage that we were preparing for and the winds we had and the way everybody prepared, I'm feeling real fortunate that we're in this position. I know there are other municipalities that weren't as fortunate as we were."

The City of Newark's Municipal Building and Alderman's Court were closed Monday and Tuesday, and would reopen

Wednesday. Anyone with court appearances or other city business that were scheduled for Monday and Tuesday should call city hall to reschedule, Houck said.

Classes at the University of Delaware were canceled Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday due to the weather and resumed Thursday.

As of last notice, Christina School District had canceled

classes and afterschool programs for students through Wednesday.

Many locals stayed connected on social-media sites through the storm, and seemed to be riding out the hurricane from the comfort of their homes.

"My power, thus far, has never gone out in a storm (knock on wood!). But even if it did, I have a book-light, flameless candles, a battery-operated lantern, and hundreds of books. As long as I have something to read I will never be bored," Sandra Waller, a resident of Buckingham Place, wrote on the Post's Facebook page Monday night as the eye of the hurricane headed for Newark.

"Ate homemade chili and cornbread. Husband and daughter playing chess," wrote Cathy Platt Irwin.

Another matter of pressing concern to local families following the storm was whether there would be a Halloween in Newark this year. Houck, who said she had gotten several calls about whether trick-or-treating would be permitted in the city on Wednesday, left it up to residents to decide if they wanted to give out candy. Most residents didn't let the hurricane dampen their plans.

So overall, things are slowly getting back to normal in Newark. The major struggle for residents now is going to be raking up all those leaves.

**Woman dies in I-95 crash**

A Maryland woman died Oct. 24 after the car she was driving veered across several lanes of I-95 southbound near the Route 896 exit in Newark and was struck by a bus, police said.

Toni Marie Koetzle, 24, of Haleshorpe, Md., was driving a 1997 Chevrolet Monte Carlo southbound in the right lane of the highway around 5:30 p.m. Wednesday when, for an unknown reason, the car suddenly veered left and traveled across several lanes of I-95, according to a news release from Delaware State Police.

As the car entered the left lane, a 2008 Prevost Bus driven by Mamadou Badine, 47, of Maryland, struck it, police said. The bus was operating as a Bolt passenger-service bus.

The impact caused the Chevrolet to spin onto the grass median where it overturned and finally came to rest on its wheels. The bus also traveled onto the grass median before stopping.

Koetzle was pronounced

dead at the scene. She was not wearing a seatbelt, police said.

The passenger, Trae Miller, 41, of North East, Md., was flown by Delaware State Police Trooper 4 helicopter to Christiana Trauma Center, where he remains in critical condition. Miller was wearing a seatbelt.

Two of the bus passengers were transported to Christiana Hospital Trauma Center where they were treated and released.

Three lanes of I-95 southbound and one lane of I-95 northbound were closed for about four hours while troopers investigated and cleared the crash.

**15-year-old killed while crossing Route 40**

A 15-year-old girl was killed Oct. 24 while crossing Route 40 in Bear.

The crash occurred around 9:27 p.m. when Christiana Townsley, 15, of Manheim, Pa., attempted to cross the westbound lanes of the highway, west of Quintillo Drive, police

said. As she ran north from the grass median onto the roadway, she was struck by a 2008 Nissan Altima traveling westbound in the center lane.

Katelyn Nelson, 25, of Elkton was the driver, police said. No charges have been filed.

Townsley was transported to Christiana Hospital Trauma Center, where she was pronounced dead.

Nelson was not injured in the crash.

The westbound lanes of Pulaski Highway were closed for more than an hour troopers investigated and cleared the crash. The Delaware State Police Collision Reconstruction Unit officials are still investigating the incident.

Police are reminding pedestrians to use caution when walking on or near the road. Anyone who must cross a road should make sure to look left, then right, then left again before proceeding. Pedestrians should also wear light-colored clothing and reflective materials, and carry a flashlight for added safety, police said.

**Naked man arrested on Main Street**

Newark Police arrested a 25-year-old Newark man early Tuesday morning for public nakedness, said department spokesman Lt. Mark Farrell.

Around 1 a.m., police responded to report of a naked man near at 54 E. Main Street near the crosswalk area in front of the Galleria, Farrell said. When officers arrived, they found Shawn Randles, 25, standing naked in the middle of the road, with a female companion photographing him.

Randles told police he was shooting a movie for an art class at the University of Delaware. Police charged him with disorderly conduct and gave him a summons to appear in court at a later date.

**Man arrested for seventh-offense DUI**

Police arrested a 43-year-old Newark man Oct. 26 for seventh-offense DUI and driving while having an open container of alcohol.

Around 1:30 p.m., a Newark Police officer on patrol observed a man in the Suburban Plaza parking lot moving his car from spot to spot, getting out each time and appearing to look inside vehicles' windows, said Newark Police Department spokesman Lt. Mark Farrell.

The officer approached the man, later identified as John A. Boulden, and found him to be under the influence of alcohol, Farrell said. Upon further investigation, the officer discovered that Boulden had been arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol six times before, and that he was also violating the terms of his probation, Farrell said.

Boulden was arraigned through JP Court and committed to Howard Young Correctional Institution in lieu of \$6,000 bond.

**Newark woman charged with assaulting police officer**

A 21-year-old Newark woman was charged Oct. 26 with assaulting a University of Delaware Police officer

after she allegedly refused to leave Klondike Kate's, police said.

The incident happened around 12:30 a.m. when the 26-year-old officer, who was working on an unrelated complaint at Klondike Kate's, was advised that a female suspect was causing a disturbance at the bar, said Newark Police Department spokesman Lt. Mark Farrell.

The officer asked the woman, Denisse Martinez, 21, a UD student from North Bergen, N.J., to leave the premises, but she refused. When the officer tried to take her into custody, she struck him in the head and bit him on the left hand, Farrell said. Officers finally got her under control and charged her with second-degree assault on a police officer, resisting arrest, offensive touching on a law officer and disorderly conduct. She was released on \$10,750 unsecured bond.

The officer sustained a puncture wound to his left thumb, Farrell said. He was treated at Newark Emergency Room and released.

## Police ask public to help ID Newark bank-robbery suspect

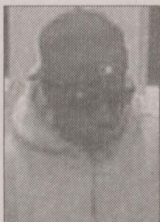
Troopers are asking for the public's help identifying a suspect in a bank robbery that occurred Tuesday. The incident occurred around 11:37 a.m. Tuesday at the M&T Bank at 102 Astro Shopping Center in Newark.

## Elkton-area man gets 6 months for rampage

An Elkton-area man received a six-month jail term Oct. 26 for beating his wife during a rampage in which he also stood accused of attacking his mother and then leaving her alongside a highway near Rising Sun.

Cecil County Circuit Court Judge Jane Cairns Murray imposed a five-year sentence on Carl Wayne Ewing, 28, of the 800 block of Blue Ball Road, and then suspended four and a half years of it.

Ewing will serve his six-month term in the Cecil County Detention Center, where he will be eligible for the work release program.

The judge allowed Ewing to remain free on \$200,000 bond until Nov. 2, when he must report to the county jail to start serving his term. Murray ordered Ewing to serve three years of supervised probation after his jail release.

As one of the conditions, Ewing must participate in anger management counseling, treatment he already started of his own volition last month, according to his assistant public defender, Edwin B. Fockler IV.

Ewing pleaded guilty to second-degree assault in July and, as part of a plea deal, prosecutors dropped several related charges, including false imprisonment, reckless endangerment and first-degree assault.

Ewing's second-degree assault conviction relates only to the assault on his 27-year-old wife.

On Oct. 26, moments before his sentencing, Ewing told the judge, "I apologize to my mother and wife for the actions that I took. It was a bad judgment day. I don't act like this normally."

Prosecutors have given the following account of the incident:

Ewing repeatedly punched his wife's face and body inside their 1999 Ford Taurus about 10 a.m. on Jan. 16 after forcing her into the car.

That attack took place outside Union Hospital in Elkton, where Ewing had driven himself and his wife after the couple had a heated argument inside their home near Rising Sun earlier that morning.

Ewing had traveled to that hospital for treatment because, during the argu-

ment, he had threatened to commit suicide.

Ewing changed his mind, however, after arriving there and, instead, he forced his wife back into the car and attacked her before driving away.

Later that morning, Ewing stopped on the shoulder of Joseph Biggs Highway near Washington Schoolhouse Road, south of Rising Sun.

There, he smashed a tire iron against his wife's chest and face. Ewing also threatened to kill her — and then commit suicide.

After receiving a phone call from Ewing's wife, his 49-year-old mother rushed to where he had stopped alongside the highway.

Ewing later punched his mother in the face and body, after his wife was able to escape, and then he drove away, leaving his mother on the ground alongside that road.

Motorists stopped, and

Ewing's mother was later treated at Union Hospital in Elkton, where his wife also received treatment.

Police arrested Ewing later that day.

Ewing's wife, who is pregnant with the couple's fourth child, spoke on his behalf at sentencing on Friday.

"Normally, he is not like that. He's been my husband for 11 years, and he's a great man," his wife said, telling the judge that she and her children rely

on Ewing for many things.

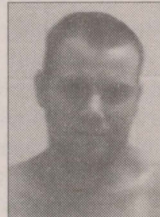
Fockler also told the judge that the assault was an isolated incident, summarizing, "It was a single day action."

The other person who spoke on Ewing's behalf at sentencing was his mother, who told the judge that she has Stage 4 lung cancer and that her son takes care of her.

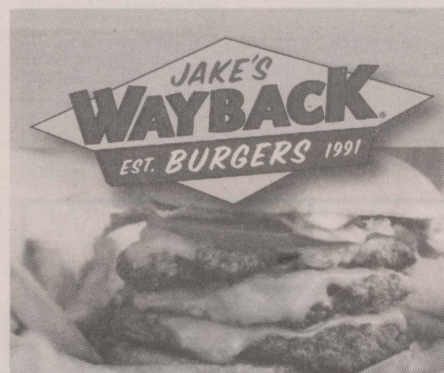
She, too, contended that Ewing's actions on Jan. 16 were out of character for him.

After imposing the sentence, which fell short of the state's recommendation of three years of active incarceration, Murray urged Ewing to abide by all conditions of probation, including "no hostile contact" with the victims.

The judge ordered Ewing conduct himself as "a good son, a good husband and a good father."

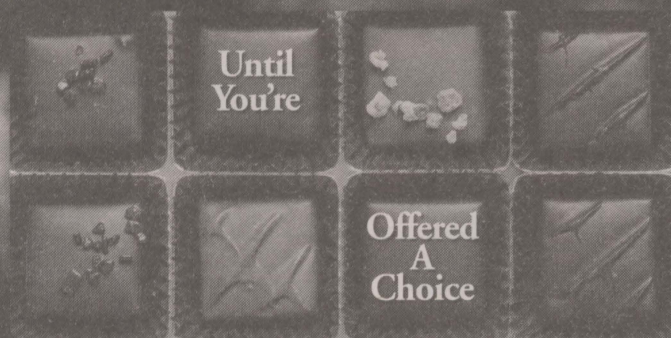

## Out of the Attic

**Rittenhouse Motor Co.,  
Academy St. - 1961**

This week's Out of the Attic item is a photograph of the Rittenhouse Motor Company published in the 1961 edition of the "Street Map of Newark, Delaware and Surrounding Area."

Cyrus E. Rittenhouse entered the retail automobile business in 1923 when he opened his Rittenhouse Motor Company dealership at 24 S. College Ave. in

Newark between Main Street and Delaware Avenue, selling the Durant and Star brands.

Later, he affiliated with the Chrysler Corporation and sold Dodge and Plymouth vehicles. He purchased a tract of land behind the National Guard Armory at the corner of Academy Street and East Delaware Avenue, and sold the portion of the lot closest to the Armory to William Hamilton, who built and operated the Perfelo Printing Company.

Rittenhouse built and moved into the right section of the pictured store in 1941. This was built with an open-wood truss design to have a two-car showroom with center entrance and office and a service shop behind it.

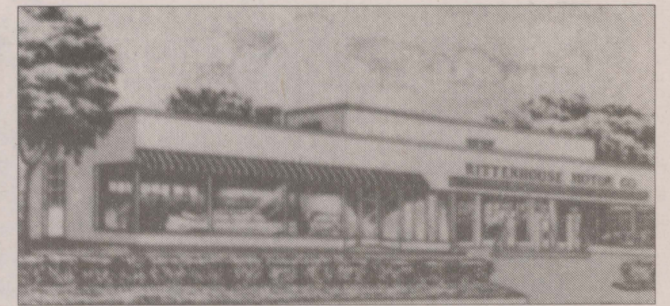
The left section was completed in 1950 to make space display three more cars and have more service bays.

Rittenhouse died in 1950, and family members – notably his sons Donald and Julian and son-in-law Robert

Dutton – continued the business. The dealership relocated to a new facility at 250 Elkton Road in 1964.

New owners bought the business in 1996 and continued it on Elkton Road as Newark Dodge until 2009, when they merged it with their other dealership on East Cleveland Avenue to become Newark Chrysler, Jeep, Dodge.

The Elkton Road auto dealership facility has since been razed and a new apart-



ment and retail complex opened in the fall of 2012 as Rittenhouse Station.

The family wishes to thank the staff of Millcroft for their care and compassion.

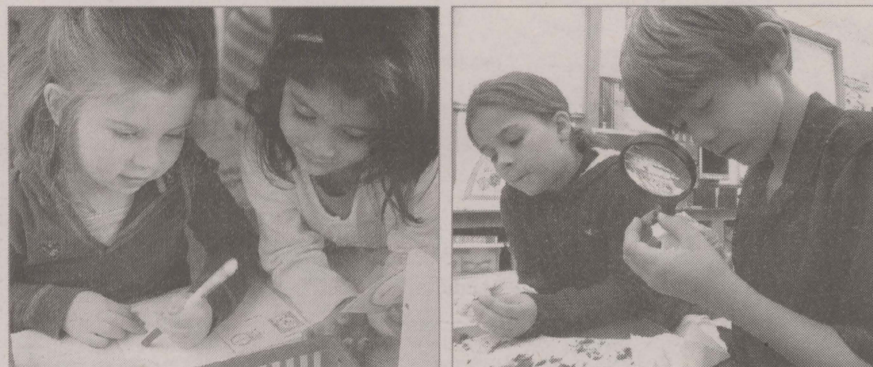

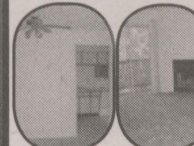

## THE YANKEE CHEF

## Tiramisu with a kick of pumpkin

Tiramisu is Italian for "make me happy." And the jolt one receives from this dessert is the reason for the nomenclature.

It is fairly new to the cooking arena, since only about the late-'60s has it been offered up to chefs to interpret on their own. And here is The Yankee Chef's inter-

pretation. Though I don't use ladyfingers in my presentation, I use something even better: molasses cookies.

I think these go perfectly, flavor-wise, with the other levels of taste and the texture is slightly firmer with a little crispness from the edge of each cookie that helps tie everything in. Although

I don't soak the cookies in coffee, I add the flavor of espresso AND soak the cookies in another New England mainstay: rum. If you are underage and would love to enjoy this dessert, simply omit the rum and add a few drops of almond extract with the real maple syrup. It will be just as delightful.

## YANKEE PUMPKIN TIRAMISU

1 cup canned pure pumpkin  
1 tsp. cinnamon  
½ tsp. ginger  
1 cup heavy or whipping cream, divided  
¼ cup plus 1 tbsp. powdered sugar  
4 oz. mascarpone cheese  
¼ cup pure maple syrup  
1 ½ tbsp. dark rum  
4 oz. broken molasses cookies



In a medium mixing bowl, mix pumpkin, cinnamon and ginger until combined. In a smaller mixing bowl, beat 1/2 cup sugar with a hand-held mixer until soft peaks form. Gently fold whipped-cream mixture into pumpkin mixture. In an additional mixing bowl, combine mascarpone cheese and remainder of powdered sugar. Beat until combined, then add the remaining 1/2 cup whipping cream and beat until mixture is thickened. In a small bowl, whisk together maple syrup and rum.

**To assemble:** Place half

broken cookies into the bottom of each serving container (makes about four). Drizzle about one teaspoon rum mixture onto cookies. Add pumpkin filling on top of cookies, then top with two additional broken cookies. Drizzle 1 tbsp. rum mixture onto these cookies as well. Top with the remainder of pumpkin filling. Dollop the mascarpone topping onto the pumpkin filling and spread evenly. Refrigerate for at least four hours (can be made one day ahead). Sprinkle with pumpkin-pie spice prior to serving.

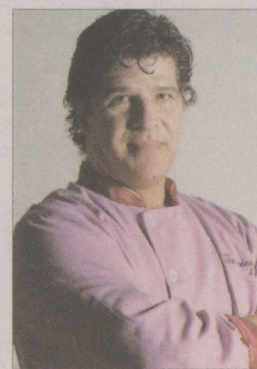

# 'Learning the game accidentally'

## Program helps kids learn soccer while at daycare or preschool

Kids start playing sports because sports are fun. And when the fun stops, the kids stop playing. Soccer Shots was founded in an effort to make sure a child's first exposure to sports is a good one.

One of the fastest growing sports organizations in the country, Soccer Shots offers more than 60,000 kids ages 3 to 8 an opportunity to learn the game of soccer while already at daycare or preschool. In other words, they bring the program to kids.

"We want a child's first experience to be a fun one, not a traumatic one," said Kevin Schneider, co-owner of the local Soccer Shots franchise. "We want children to have an absolute blast learning the basics of the sport."

Kevin, 32, along with his brother Doug, 35, run the Newark-Bear area Soccer Shots program. Together, the brothers have more than 30 years of soccer-coaching experience. The Newark residents were three-time All-State players at Wilmington Christian School and then went on to successful careers at Messiah College in Pennsylvania, with Kevin starting on two teams that won Division III national championships.

Doug played college soccer with the three founders of Soccer Shots, and when they approached him in 2004 about starting a local franchise, he wasn't in a position to make the commitment. But he knew

his brother might be.

"I thought it was a phenomenal idea and was excited about it," Doug said. "I didn't want to let it slip by so I approached Kevin and suggested to him, 'You get it going, I'll help you get it started, you can build it and maybe sometime down the road it will make sense for me to come on board in a full capacity.'"

Kevin was fresh out of college and didn't hesitate in making his decision to become part of the company, which now has programs in 30 states.

"The thought of owning our own business was very attractive," Kevin explained. "We have both loved soccer since we were kids and both enjoy working with kids."

Doug came on board full-time in 2009 and runs the Chester County locations, while Kevin focuses on 24 locations that involve more than 300 kids in the Bear-Newark area. The players are taught by experienced, paid coaches who not only know the game, but are imaginative



and patient, creating fun and interactive games.

"The kids have lots of fun imagining they are in space while they are dribbling a ball, or, my personal favorite, being chased by the Cookie Monster," said coach John Gilroy. "These games also involve learning good values and manners, such as sharing, saying 'please' and 'thank you,' working as a team and learning good sportsmanship by cheering for each other. These are all important qualities for such young athletes."

Alexa Watkins, whose daughter has been involved in the program for two years, feels strongly that children learn best through play.

"I have seen some soccer programs focus on skills, drills

or competitive games, which in my mind isn't a fun way to learn," she added. "Soccer Shots makes the learning process fun and exciting without the pressure of competitive games. My daughter leaves smiling and excited to go back the next week."

The sessions are held once a week for 30 to 40 minutes and each season lasts eight to 10 weeks depending on the location.

Justin Bredeman, one of the Soccer Shots partners, hopes the company will add 20-30 franchises per year over the next five years.

"Soccer continues to be a passion for many adults and children," Bredeman said. "If

you're delivering a consistently excellent service to children at a reasonable price in a convenient way, you will have customers."

Here locally, Kevin and Doug continue to stress the fundamental concept of their program that keeps customers

coming back.

"The emphasis is on having fun, almost learning the game accidentally," Doug reiterated.

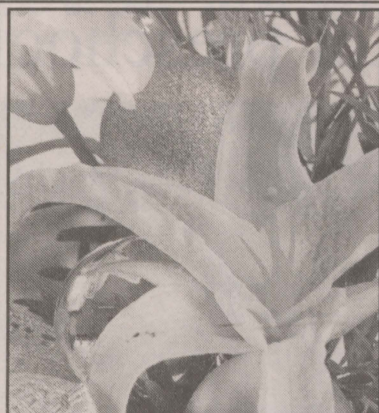

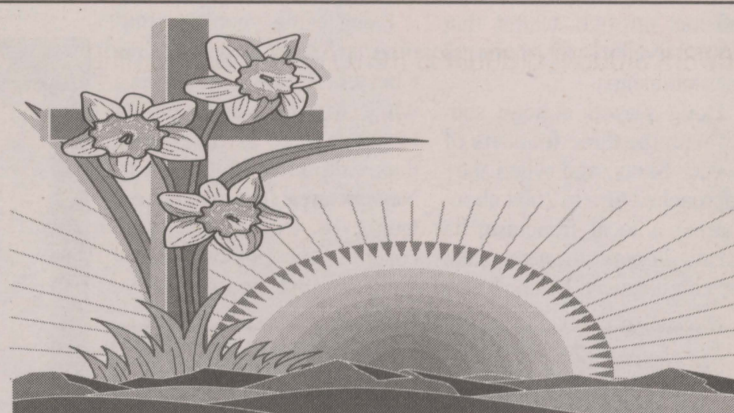

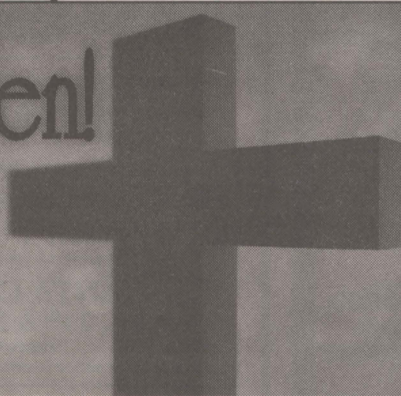

Carly Calhoon of Newark was recently inducted into James Madison University's chapter of Beta Gamma Sigma, an international honor society for business students.

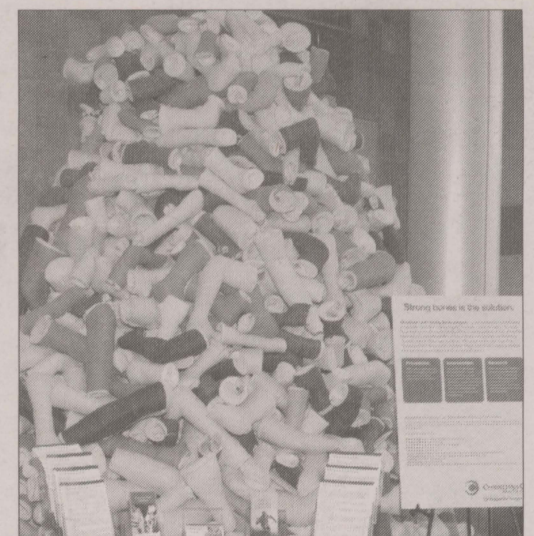
Calhoon is on track to graduate in May 2014 with a degree in international business and marketing.

The Delaware Mentor Program (For Women in Transition) provides BWCI inmates with an extensive 12-week curriculum designed to help women take a look at their core issues, develop an understanding of how choices and resulting consequences can impact their lives, set new goals for their lives, and begin to acquire the values, knowledge and skills required to become productive members of the community.

Community volunteers help teach the curriculum.

The mentoring program started in 1992 after then-Gov. Castle brought together a group of correction officials, social-service providers, criminal-justice advocates and female offenders to discuss and address the issues of female offenders.

The result of this collaboration was the Delaware Mentor Program. Since that time, more than 1,000 women have successfully completed the program.

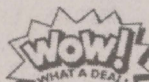

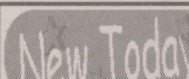

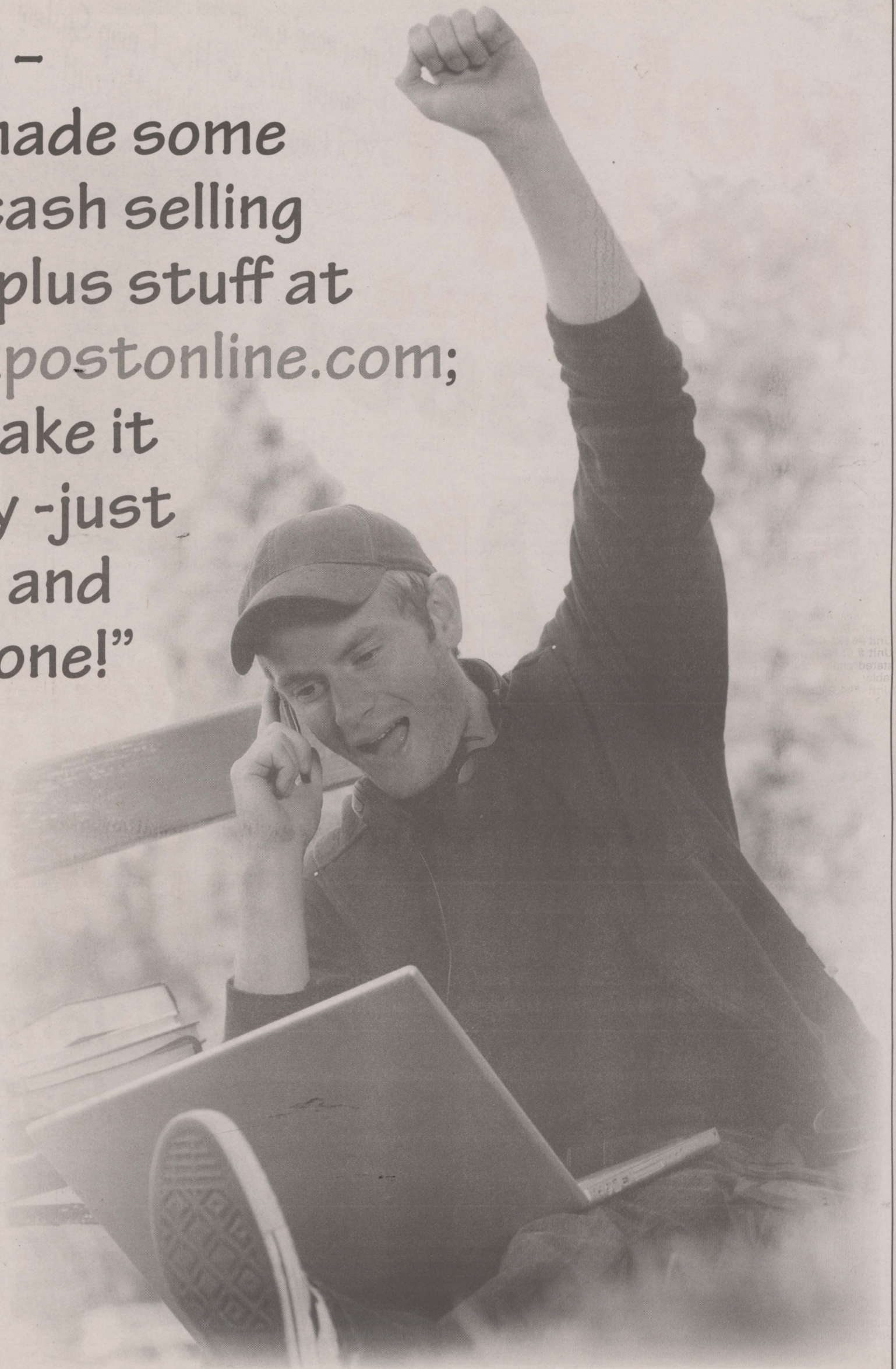
