To the House of Representatives of the 122nd General Assembly of the State of Delaware:

There will be five Administration-sponsored bills which have passed the Senate and will be brought before the House of Representatives this afternoon. Because time is of the essence, a brief explanation about each bill follows:

Senate Bill No. 361 provides for a supplementary appropriation to the three County Departments of Elections. This is needed because of the reapportionment of the Senatorial and Representative districts which was authorized by the General Assembly and signed into law on July 13, 1964.

Senate Bill No. 363 provides for a supplementary appropriation to the office of Public Defender amounting to \$40,000. This need is brought about by the cases which have been referred to the Public Defender by the Superior Court Judges. In order for the Public Defender to operate as provided by law it is imperative that these additional funds be made available.

Senate Bill No. 362 provides for an appropriation of \$19,700 to carry on the Adult High School Evening Extension Program. This important program has been a resounding success throughout our State, with enrollment greatly exceeding anticipation.

We have a moral obligation to appropriate \$110,000 to the State Board of Education to support the program of Broadcast Educational Television. Senate Bill No. 364 will meet that obligation.

The Park Land Acquisition Bill, House Substitute No. 1 for House Bill No. 388, has been amended by Senate Amend-

ment No. 4 and has been sent to you by the Senate for your consideration. It is a highly significant Bill and the passage of it will set forth a program which will cause the 122nd General Assembly to be long remembered for its vision and wisdom. I urge its passage so that we may use the available funds for the embellishment of our beloved Delaware.
