PERMANENT RULES  
OF THE  
HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
1997-1998

HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 27  
AS AMENDED BY  
HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 54 AND HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 62

**I. RULES OF ORDER**

**Rule 1 - Convening of House**

The House of Representatives shall meet every Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday at 2:00 P.M., unless otherwise ordered. The Speaker or his designee shall take the chair at that time and shall call the House to order. At the beginning of each legislative day, the Speaker or his designee shall cause the names of the members to be called in alphabetical order. If a quorum is present, he shall proceed with the opening prayer, the pledge to the flag, and the business of the day.

**Rule 2 - Order of Business**

(a) After the convening of the House, the order of business shall include the following:

- (1) The minutes of the previous day shall be made public and posted by the Chief Clerk prior to the next legislative day. With the consent of a majority of members, the reading of the minutes for the previous day may be omitted.
- (2) Presentation of petitions, memorials, tributes, memoriams, citations or communications.
- (3) Reports from standing and special committees.
- (4) Introduction and first reading of bills and resolutions.
- (5) Consideration of agenda.
- (6) Consent calendar, or consent agenda, when available.
- (7) Announcement of committee meetings.
- (8) Announcement of agenda for next legislative day.

(b) The order of business may be changed when necessary by the Speaker unless a majority of the members present object.

**Rule 3 - Messages**

Messages from the Senate or from the Governor may be received at any time except when the roll is being called.

**II. DUTIES OF THE SPEAKER**

**Rule 4 - Order and Decorum**

(a) The Speaker shall preside and have general direction over the House Chamber, and shall preserve

order and decorum. In debate, the Speaker shall confine the members to the question under discussion. No member shall have the floor except when recognized by the Speaker, or when the Speaker grants open debate between members.

(b) Cameras, recording instruments, and similar equipment or electronic devices are permitted in the House Chamber only with the permission of the Speaker.

**Rule 5 - Questions of Order; Appeal**

The Speaker shall decide all questions of order. An appeal from his decision may be made by any member, if properly seconded. The appeal shall be upheld only upon the affirmative vote of a majority of the elected members. The Speaker shall not vote on any such appeal.

**Rule 6 - Temporary Presiding Officer**

(a) The Speaker may appoint a member to serve as the Presiding Officer to perform the duties of Speaker; but such appointment shall not extend beyond an adjournment or recess except when the Speaker takes a leave of absence, in which case he may name a member as Speaker *pro tempore* during such leave. The Presiding Officer shall not have authority to reassign any measure to a committee unless specifically required to do so by Rule 20.

(b) When neither the elected Speaker nor the appointed Presiding Officer nor the Speaker *pro tempore* is present, the House shall be called to order and presided over by the Senior Member of the majority party. The Senior Member shall serve in the interim as the Presiding Officer. The Senior Member is the member who has served in the House the longest current consecutive period of time. In the event more than one member has served the same length of time, the member originally sworn first shall be the Senior Member. If two or more members were sworn in at the same time, then of those two or more members the member whose name would appear first in alphabetical order shall be the Senior Member.

**Rule 7 - Signing of Bills, Resolutions and Other Documents**

The Speaker shall sign all bills and resolutions passed by the House. All warrants, writs and subpoenas issued by the House shall be signed by the Speaker and attested to by the Chief Clerk. In the absence of the Speaker, the presiding officer or Speaker *pro tempore* shall have authority to sign such documents.

**Rule 8 - Appointment of Committees**

(a) The Speaker shall appoint all committees and subcommittees.

(b) Where illness, stated conflict of interest, or other sufficient cause shall compel the absence or non-participation of any committee member, the Speaker, in his discretion, may fill such vacancy from the same political party as the absent or non-participating member, during said absence or period of non-participation.

**Rule 9 - Assignment of Bills and Resolutions to Committee**

The Speaker shall determine the principal objective of a bill or resolution and, subject to the provisions of Rule 20, assign same to the appropriate committee. All prefiled measures shall be pre-assigned to committees by the Speaker and each member notified in writing of assignments, unless the measure is introduced from the floor, in which case the Speaker shall at that time announce the committee to which the measure is assigned.

**Rule 10 - Setting the Agenda**

The Speaker may place an item on the Agenda only if the item is on the Ready List and has been requested to be placed on the Agenda by the prime House sponsor or floor manager. The Ready List shall consist of all items that have been reported out of committee or have been laid on the table.

**Rule 11 - Subpoena Issuance**

The Speaker may sign a subpoena if requested by a majority vote of a standing committee, a special committee, a joint committee, or task force, or any similar entity if the committee, task force or entity was created by the House of Representatives or an action of the General Assembly. Upon the majority vote of all members elected to the House a subpoena shall be signed and issued by the Speaker, presiding officer or Speaker *pro tempore*

**III. RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF MEMBERS.**

**Rule 12- Attendance of Members**

(a) No member shall knowingly absent himself or herself from any session of the House without notifying the Speaker that he or she is unable to attend. A member who is absent without notifying the Speaker may be considered in contempt, and may be subject to the censure of the House.

(b) Each member shall answer each roll call from his or her assigned seat in the chamber.

**Rule 13- Quorum**

Twenty-one members of the House shall constitute a quorum. The House shall not convene without a quorum. In the absence of a quorum, the Sergeant-at-Arms shall notify those members who are absent from the Chamber, but not from Legislative Hall, that their presence is required. Upon receiving the notification, the absentee members shall report to the House Chamber. After a proper interval for such notifications, the Speaker shall order a roll call of the House to ascertain if a quorum is present.

**Rule 14 - Addressing the House**

(a) When a member wishes to speak, such member shall rise but shall not proceed to speak until recognized by the Speaker. Upon acknowledgment by the Speaker, the member may be seated until called upon. If two or more members seek recognition at the same time, the Speaker shall determine who shall speak first.

(b) Remarks shall be confined to the subject before the House, or to the purpose for which recognition was obtained.

**Rule 15 - Decorum of Members on Floor of House**

(a) Each member shall conduct himself or herself in a dignified manner at all times.

(b) No member or other person may walk across the House Chamber, or converse privately, in such a manner as to interrupt the House proceedings.

(c) A member shall not be interrupted when speaking except for the following reasons:

(1) a call to order by the Speaker.

(2) a point of order by a member.

(3) a motion by a member to move the previous question, to adjourn, or to recess.

(d) A member shall not make derogatory personal comments about or to other members.

**Rule 16 - Rules of Legislative Conduct**

(a) A member of the House shall be subject to discipline by the House for the violation of any of the following Rules of Legislative Conduct, which shall be deemed to constitute "disorderly behavior" within the meaning of Article II, Section 9 of the Delaware Constitution. The Rules of Legislative Conduct are as follows:

(1) Restrictions relating to "personal or private interests" within the meaning of Article II, Section 20 of the Delaware Constitution and Chapter 10, Title 29 of the Delaware Code are as follows:

(A) A member who has a personal or private interest in any measure or bill pending before the House shall disclose the fact and shall not participate in the debate nor vote thereon; provided however, that (i) upon the request of any other member of the House, a member who has such a personal or private interest may nevertheless respond to questions concerning any such measure or bill, or (ii) a member who has a personal or private interest may add factual matter to the debate which he believes will correct wrong or false information. A personal or private interest in a measure or bill is an interest which tends to impair a member's independence of judgment in the performance of his or her legislative duties with respect to that measure or bill.

(B) A member has an interest which tends to impair his or her independence of judgment in the performance of his or her legislative duties with regard to any bill or measure when, (i) the enactment or defeat of the measure or bill would result in a financial benefit or detriment to accrue to the member or a close relative to a greater extent than such benefit or detriment would accrue to others who are members of the same class or group of persons, (ii) the member or a close relative has a financial interest in a private enterprise which enterprise or interest would be affected by a measure or bill to a greater extent than like enterprises or other interests in the same enterprise, or (iii) a person required to register as a legislative agent pursuant to Chapter 16, Title 29 of the Delaware Code is a close relative of the legislator and that person acts to promote, advocate, influence or oppose the measure or bill.

(C) If the member is present, the disclosure required under paragraph (A) shall be made in open session, (i) prior to the vote on the measure or the bill by any committee of which the member is a member, and (ii) prior to the vote on the measure or bill in the House. Disclosure may be made by written statement submitted to the Chairman of a committee or the Speaker of the House, and read in open session in the committee or the House as the case may be. If the member is absent when a measure or bill is voted on which would have required disclosure required under paragraph (A), then the member shall make the required disclosure as soon as possible upon returning to committee or House.

(D) For the purposes of this Rule:

(I) A "close relative" means a person's parents, spouse, children (natural or adopted) and siblings of the whole and half-blood.

(II) A "private enterprise" means any activity, whether conducted for profit or not for profit, and includes the ownership of real or personal property; provided that "private enterprise" does not include any activity of the State of Delaware, any political subdivision or any agency, authority or instrumentality thereof.

(III) A person has a "financial interest" in a private enterprise if he or she, (i) has a legal or equitable ownership interest in the enterprise with a fair market value in excess of \$5,000, (ii) is associated with the enterprise and received from the enterprise during the last calendar year or might reasonably be expected to receive from the enterprise during the current or the next calendar year income in excess of \$5,000 for services as an employee, officer, director, trustee, or independent contractor, or (iii) is a creditor of an insolvent private enterprise in an amount in excess of \$5,000.

(IV) A “person” means an individual, partnership, corporation, trust, joint venture and any other association of individuals or entities.

(2) A member shall not receive unlawful gratuities in violation of Section 1206, Title 11 of the Delaware Code.

(3) A member shall not receive a bribe in violation of Section 1203, Title 11 of the Delaware Code.

(4) A member shall not profiteer in violation of Section 1212, Title 11 of the Delaware Code.

(5) A member shall not engage in conduct constituting official misconduct in violation of Section 1211, Title 11 of the Delaware Code.

(6) A member shall not fail to comply with the campaign finance disclosure requirements set forth in Chapter 80, Title 15 of the Delaware Code.

(7) A member shall not fail to comply with the financial disclosure requirements of Chapter 58, Title 29 of the Delaware Code.

(8) A member shall not appear for, represent, or assist another in respect to a matter before the General Assembly or one of its committees for compensation other than that provided by law.

(9) A member shall not release, without authorization of the Ethics Committee, any confidential matter pertaining to proceedings of the Ethics Committee.

(10) A member shall not knowingly file a false statement with the Ethics Committee or the House in connection with any proceeding involving a Rule of Legislative Conduct.

(11) A member shall not engage in conduct which the House determines (i) brings the House into disrepute or (ii) reflects adversely on the member’s fitness to hold legislative office.

(b) A member shall be subject to sanction for any disorderly behavior occurring subsequent to being elected to the House.

(c) A complaint alleging a violation of a Rule of Legislative Conduct shall be filed in writing by a member with the Ethics Committee for investigation and recommendation to the House as to disposition. A complaint must be accompanied by a written statement signed by any person, sworn under oath, setting forth the facts supporting the complaints. No such complaint shall be considered by the House prior to its consideration and recommendation by the Ethics Committee.

(d) If the Ethics Committee recommends some disciplinary action with respect to a complaint, it shall present a resolution to the House requesting that the House conduct a proceeding to consider the matter. If the Ethics Committee votes to dismiss a complaint, and there are no votes against dismissal in the Committee, the House shall take no action with respect thereto. If the Ethics Committee votes to dismiss a complaint, but there are dissenting votes in the Committee, the House may consider the matter upon the motion of any member of the House, approved by a majority vote of the House. In any proceeding before the House involving an alleged violation of a Rule of Legislative Conduct, the accused member shall be given an opportunity to be heard after notice, to be advised and assisted by legal counsel, to produce witnesses, and offer evidence and to cross-examine any witnesses. A transcript of any such proceeding shall be made and retained; and rules of procedure for ethics violations as may be adopted by the House shall apply.

(e) If the House finds by a majority vote that a member has violated a Rule of Legislative Conduct, it may impose such disciplinary action as it deems appropriate; provided that no member may be suspended or expelled without the vote of two-thirds of the members of the House concurring therein.

#### IV. BILLS, RESOLUTIONS AND OTHER MEASURES

##### Rule 17 - **Resolutions and Other Measures; Definitions**

(a) The following types of resolutions may be considered by this body:

(1) **Simple Resolutions:** A Simple Resolution is an expression of a majority of members on a specific subject, and deals with the internal affairs of the House only. The effect of its passage does not go beyond the bounds and the authority of the House.

(2) **Concurrent Resolutions:** A Concurrent Resolution is used to accomplish the same purpose in relation to the entire General Assembly that the Simple Resolution achieves for either the House or Senate singly. It must be passed by both the House and Senate to become effective. A Concurrent Resolution adopted by the General Assembly does not become a statute, nor does it have the force and effect of law, nor can it be used for any purpose which requires the exercise of legislative power.

(3) **Joint Resolutions:** A Joint Resolution is the most formal type of resolution, and is addressed to matters which are not internal affairs of either the House individually, nor the internal affairs of the General Assembly as a whole. It is of no legal effect unless passed by both Houses and approved by the Governor. Although a Joint Resolution is not a law, it is employed to provide for temporary measures; and has the force of law while in effect for a wide variety of limited purposes. A Joint Resolution is effective only for the General Assembly in which it was passed and approved. The requirement of the Governor’s signature for Joint Resolutions stems from its original use in instances where it was expedient or necessary to express the joint will and action of the General Assembly and Governor combined.

(b) Each member of the House may issue tributes and memoriams at any time during his or her term of office. Tributes and memoriams shall be sequentially numbered by the Chief Clerk and made a part of the House Journal. Each tribute or memoriam shall be signed by the prime sponsor, the Speaker and the Chief Clerk. The Speaker, or his designee, shall cause to be read into the permanent record of the House such tributes and memoriams as have been filed with the Chief Clerk. Tributes and memoriams shall not require a vote; however, at the time such items are officially read into the record, any member may comment on the tribute or memoriams. Tributes and memoriams issued when the House stands in recess or adjournment shall be administratively managed by the Chief Clerk, who shall cause such items to be made a part of the official proceedings of the House.

(c) In lieu of tributes or resolutions, each member may issue "Certificates" in the name of the House of Representatives in a format to be approved by the Speaker.

(d) A measure, as used in these Rules, means a bill, resolution, amendment, motion, or other questions before the House.

#### **Rule 18 - Preparation and Custody**

(a) Each bill and resolution shall be introduced with as many backed copies as are deemed necessary by the Speaker. The original of the bill or resolution shall at all times remain in the custody of the Chief Clerk of the House or the Chairman of the committee to which it has been assigned. A "duplicate" backed copy may go (on request) to the following: the Speaker, the Sponsor, and the Division of Research. Upon introduction of a bill or resolution a copy shall be delivered to every member. Copies shall also be delivered to the Division of Research.

(b) No bill or joint resolution shall be introduced into the House unless it be "prefaced" by a brief statement of its purpose which shall be known as the title; and the bill or resolution shall also contain the text of such bill or resolution in full. Each bill or resolution shall have an appropriate enacting or resolving clause. If a bill by its terms requires an extraordinary majority for enactment, such vote requirement shall be announced by the Speaker prior to roll call, and such vote requirement should be plainly indicated on the bill. At the end of each bill or joint resolution introduced, the author shall include a brief synopsis of the intent of the bill or joint resolution. In the lower left hand corner of page one shall be the initials of the unit preparing the bill or resolution, the initials of the drafter, and the initials of the typist; and, if prepared by automatic equipment, the identification number.

(c) If a bill or resolution provides for the appointment or selection of members to a committee, task force or similar entity, there shall be a brief synopsis of the need for the creation of the task force or similar entity. A copy of such bill or resolution shall be delivered to each person who is to make an appointment or selection; and delivered to any person designated in the bill or resolution to be a member of the committee, task force or similar entity. Such bill or resolution shall contain the criteria for the selection of the chairman and members of the task force or similar entity.

#### **Rule 19 - Introduction of Bills and Resolutions; Filing With Clerk**

(a) Each bill or resolution shall be numbered in order as introduced, beginning with HB 1 for House Bills, HR 1 for House Resolutions, HCR 1 for House Concurrent Resolutions and HJR 1 for House Joint Resolutions; and the original backer shall contain the signatures of all the sponsors of the original bill.

(b) Every bill or resolution shall be introduced by:

(1) Filing it with the Clerk of the House not less than one hour prior to the opening of the session by one of the two following procedures:

A. the sponsor's written direction to the Chief Clerk;

B. verbal approval from the sponsor to the Chief Clerk (original bill must be signed by the sponsor before start of session);

(2) Introduction from the floor while the House is in session if permitted by the Speaker.

(c) At the beginning of the day's session following the filing of a bill or resolution with the Clerk, the Clerk shall read the bill or resolution into the record. A bill or resolution that is filed with the Clerk of the House while the House stands in recess, in adjournment, or is not otherwise meeting, shall be given a number and entered upon a docket kept for that purpose.

(d) Introduction of a bill or resolution shall be considered the first reading, of that bill or resolution, unless otherwise ordered by the House. The bill or resolution shall be read by title only, or by reference to the prefile list, and then be assigned by the Speaker to its appropriate committee.

(e) Resolutions of condolence, congratulations or other non-controversial subject matters may be considered as part of the Consent Calendar without being assigned to a committee, unless any member objects. A suspension of the Rules is required in order to consider any other type of resolution without referring it to a committee.

(f) The prime sponsor or sponsors of a bill or resolution shall be the member or members who have responsibility for the drafting and introduction of a bill or resolution. The prime sponsor(s) of a bill or resolution is that House member listed first to the right of the word "sponsor" on the upper right side of the first

page of a bill or resolution, and the names of each member after the first which are joined by the word “and” or the symbol “&”. The floor manager of a House bill or House resolution shall be that member whose name is listed first to the right of the word “sponsor” in the upper right side on the first page of a bill or resolution. A joint sponsor is any member of the House or Senate whose name is printed on the measure after the name of all prime sponsors. A co-sponsor is a member of the House or Senate whose name is not otherwise shown on the measure, but who signs the backer of the measure.

(g) The chairman of the House standing committee to which a Senate bill or resolution has been assigned shall also be the floor manager of that measure, unless he or she declines to serve, or defers to a House sponsor. If the committee chairman declines to serve as floor manager, the Speaker shall designate a House member to be the floor manager of that measure.

(h) In order to withdraw his or her sponsorship of a bill or resolution, a sponsor shall submit to the Chief Clerk a written notice for this purpose. The written notice shall then be attached to the original of the bill or resolution.

**Rule 20 - Assignment to Appropriations Committee**

Each bill or joint resolution, whether emanating from the House or the Senate, containing an appropriation or which may involve any net financial loss or obligation on the part of the State, including transportation trust funds, if any, of \$50,000 or more in any one of the next three fiscal years (which has been previously referred by the Speaker under the Rules to any committee of the House other than the Committee on Appropriations) shall, after the same has been reported back to the House, be referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

**Rule 21 - Fiscal Notes**

(a) No bill or resolution either authorizing expenditures, or increasing or affecting the transportation trust fund, or reducing revenues as described in Chapter 19, Title 29 of the Delaware Code shall be placed before the House for consideration unless accompanied by a fiscal note.

(b) (1) All legislation proposing new fees or increases in existing fees charged by any state agency shall include therewith an explanation of:

- (A) the expected total amount of funds to be generated by the proposed fee or fee increase;
  - (B) the purpose of the proposed new fee or fee increase;
  - (C) a general identification of the persons, business entities or organizations affected by the legislation;
  - (D) the impact of the proposed new fees or fee increases on these affected persons, business entities or organizations;
  - (E) the intended use by the agency of the revenues generated by the new fees or fee increases.
- (2) The Office of the Controller General shall conduct such review or audit of the information offered by the state agency pursuant to (b)(1) as is deemed necessary to evaluate the information required therein, and shall issue a written report of its findings. The written report of the Office of the Controller General’s findings shall be attached to the legislation, by the sponsor of the legislation, prior to the legislation’s initial committee consideration in the house of origin.

(3) The House may waive the requirements of this section as to any specific legislation pending before such House by a vote of the majority of all members elected to the House.

**Rule 22 - Final Readings and Consideration by House**

(a) When brought before the House for consideration, each bill and joint resolution shall be given its final reading by title, unless the Speaker directs a reading in full.

(b) Each bill or joint resolution in order to pass the House shall be read on two different days of the session unless a majority of the members elected to the House determine otherwise, or unless the bill or joint resolution is on a Consent Agenda or Calendar, and voted on by a single vote. No bill or joint resolution shall be brought before the House for passage on the same calendar day it is reported out of committee, nor in the absence of the prime sponsor without his written consent.

**Rule 23 - Amendments**

(a) An amendment to a measure shall be introduced by prefiling the amendment if the amendment changes the nature and intent of the bill or resolution; or may be introduced when the measure is being discussed on the floor, if the amendment makes only technical corrections and does not change the nature and intent of the bill or resolution.

(b) When an amendment to a bill would significantly change the nature and intent of the bill, such amendment shall contain a brief synopsis outlining the basic changes incurred.

(c) When an amendment to a bill would change its fiscal impact by increasing expenditures or reducing revenues by \$50,000 or more, a new fiscal note shall accompany the amendment.

(d) If a bill becomes significantly changed by amendment, the Speaker may reassign the amended bill to committee. The title of a bill or resolution shall not be amended.

(e) All prefiled amendments shall be acted upon in numerical order before final action on the main bill or resolution, when the prime sponsor of the amendment is present.

(f) An amendment previously attached to a bill in either house may be stricken from the bill by:

- (1) An amendment which directs that a specific House or Senate amendment be stricken; or
- (2) An amendment which reverses the directions given by the amendment being stricken.

(g) An amendment to an amendment shall only be considered prior to the adoption of the amendment it is amending. However, an amendment once passed may be removed by a subsequent amendment.

**Rule 24 - Substitute Bills**

(a) A substitute bill may be introduced by a prime sponsor of the bill for which it is a substitute and shall be assigned to committee and follow the same procedure as other bills.

(b) Once introduced, the substitute bill shall render null and void the bill for which it is a substitute.

(c) The title of a substitute bill must be identical to the title of the bill for which it is substituted.

**Rule 25- Petition of Bill or Resolution Out of Committee**

Every bill or resolution which has been in committee for a period of more than 12 legislative days, except those assigned to the Appropriations Committee pursuant to Rule 20, shall, upon written request of the majority of the members elected to the House, be reported to the House for a decision as to its further disposal.

**Rule 26 - Voting**

(a) Except as provided for in Rule 46 or Rule 47, each bill or joint resolution which comes before the House for final action shall be acted upon by a separate roll call vote.

(b) The names of the members of the House shall be called alphabetically, except for the Speaker who shall vote last; and each member shall, without debate or comments, answer “yes”, or “no”, or “not voting”, from his or her respective seat.

(c) No member shall be permitted to change his or her vote after the roll call has been announced by the Chief Clerk.

(d) A roll call may not be laid on the table.

**Rule 27 - Striking a Bill or Resolution**

Only a prime sponsor of a bill or resolution or a member authorized by a prime sponsor in writing can strike said bill or resolution. A bill or resolution may not be stricken once it has been voted upon. Upon the expulsion, death or resignation of any member from the House, any bill not yet acted upon by the House which has that member as the only sponsor shall be stricken.

**V. COMMITTEES**

**Rule 28 - Standing Committees**

(a) The standing committees and subcommittees of the House shall include members of both political parties and shall be appointed by the Speaker. The Speaker shall designate a chairman, and may designate a vice chairman who shall act as the chairman of the committee in the chairman’s absence, for each committee and subcommittee he appoints. The Chief Clerk shall keep a list of current standing committees and members appointed thereto.

(b) The following standing committees and subcommittees shall be appointed by the Speaker at the beginning of each General Assembly.

Standing Committees:

- (1) Agriculture
- (2) Appropriations
- (3) Bond Bill
- (4) Business/Corporations/Commerce
- (5) Corrections
- (6) Economic Development, Banking & Insurance
- (7) Education
- (8) Environmental Management
- (9) Ethics
- (10) Health & Human Development
- (11) House Administration
- (12) House Rules
- (13) Housing & Community Affairs
- (14) Judiciary
- (15) Labor
- (16) Land Use and Infrastructure
- (17) Natural Resources
- (18) Policy Analysis and Government Accountability
- (19) Public Safety
- (20) Revenue & Finance
- (21) Transportation

(c) The membership of the House Administration Committee shall be the Speaker, Majority Leader, Majority Whip, Minority Leader and Minority Whip. The Majority Leader shall be the chairman of the House Administration Committee.

**Rule 29 - Appointment of Special Committees**

The Speaker, on his own initiative or upon order of the House, may appoint Special Committees.

**Rule 30 - Ethics Committee**

(a) The Ethics Committee shall be a standing committee consisting of five members, three appointed by the Speaker and two appointed by the Minority Leader, at the beginning of each General Assembly.

(b) The powers and duties of the Ethics Committee shall be as follows:

(1) to recommend to the House, from time to time, such rules of conduct for members of the House as it shall deem appropriate;

(2) to issue written advisory opinions upon the request of any member as to the applicability of any Rule of Legislative Conduct to any particular fact situation;

(3) to investigate any alleged violation by a member of any Rule of Legislative Conduct and, after notice and hearing, to recommend to the House by resolution such disciplinary action as the committee may deem appropriate;

(4) to report to the appropriate federal or State authorities any substantial evidence of a violation by any member of any law involving a Rule of Legislative Conduct which may come to its attention in connection with any proceeding whether advisory or investigative;

(5) to maintain a file of its proceedings and advisory opinions with a view toward achieving consistency of opinions and recommendations. Upon the request of a legislator involved in an advisory opinion, to publish that advisory opinion;

(6) to follow such rules of procedure for ethics violations as may be adopted by the House, and to establish such other procedural rules as shall not be inconsistent with the rules prescribed by the House;

(7) to act only upon a majority vote of its members; and

(8) such other duties and responsibilities as may be assigned by the House from time to time.

(c) All proceedings before the Ethics Committee in connection with an advisory opinion shall be confidential subject to the following: (i) the member involved may waive the privilege of confidentiality, (ii) the proceedings shall no longer be confidential and may be made public in any subsequent disciplinary proceeding if the member acts in disregard of an advisory opinion, and (iii) the Ethics Committee shall maintain records of its proceedings and advisory opinions which shall be available for reference by the Committee, subsequent Committees and their staff.

(d) The Committee may undertake an investigation of an alleged violation by a member of any Rule of Legislative Conduct only upon a written complaint submitted by a member of the House. The complaint must be accompanied by a written statement signed by any person, sworn under oath, setting forth the facts supporting the complaint. In any such investigation or proceeding, the accused member shall be given an opportunity to be heard after notice, to be advised and assisted by legal counsel, to produce witnesses and offer evidence, and to cross-examine witnesses. A transcript of any such proceeding shall be made and retained. In any such proceeding the rules of procedure for ethics violations as may be adopted by the House shall apply.

(e) A member of the Committee shall be ineligible to participate, as a member of the Committee, in any Committee proceeding relating to his or her legislative conduct. In any such case, the person appointing that member (either the Speaker or the Minority Leader) shall designate a member of the House to act as a member of the Committee in any Committee proceeding relating to the legislative conduct of such ineligible member. A member of the Committee who has been found by the House to have violated a Rule of Legislative Conduct shall be ineligible to serve again as a member of the Committee.

(f) A member of the Committee may disqualify himself or herself from participating in any investigation of the conduct of a member of the House upon submission in writing and under oath of an affidavit of disqualification stating that he or she cannot render an impartial and unbiased decision in the case in which he or she seeks to disqualify himself or herself. If the Committee approves and accepts such affidavit of disqualification, the chairman shall so notify the person appointing that member (either the Speaker or the Minority Leader) and request that person to designate a member of the House to act as a member of the Committee in any Committee proceeding relating to such investigation.

(g) Any member who acts in good faith reliance upon any written advisory opinion of the Ethics Committee rendered to that member shall not be subject to any discipline by the House with respect to the matters covered by the advisory opinion; provided there was a full disclosure to the Ethics Committee of all facts necessary for the opinion.

(h) The Committee may function without regard to recess periods or adjournment.

**Rule 31 - Joint Committees**

The House of Representatives and the Senate by mutual agreement may establish a joint committee or committees. The House members of any Joint Committee shall be appointed by the Speaker, unless otherwise provided by statute.

**Rule 32 - Quorum on Committees**

Four members or a majority, whichever is less, of the members of any committee, subcommittee or special committee shall constitute a quorum.

**Rule 33 - Committee Meetings**

(a) During the legislative sessions, each standing committee of the House shall be assigned a regular meeting time by the Speaker. This shall not preclude the option of a committee chairman to cancel a regular or special meeting or call additional meetings when necessary, provided that such special or additional meetings are not scheduled during regular meeting times of standing committees. No committee meetings shall be held while the House is in session without the consent of the Speaker.

(b) All committee meetings shall be chaired by the chairman, or in his or her absence by the vice-chairman, if any, if the committee does not have an appointed vice-chairman, then, the chairman shall designate a member of the committee to chair the committee in his or her absence.

(c) So far as may be applicable, the rules of the House shall be observed in the conduct of committee meetings.

(d) All committee meetings will be open to the public except that the committee chairman may call an executive session at which no final action may be taken. An executive session may be called for those purposes which are listed at 29 Del. C. § 10004 and for the purpose of requesting the issuance of a subpoena pursuant to

(e). This subsection may be waived by a majority vote of the committee.

**Rule 34 - Deliberative Process and Procedures of Standing Committees**

(a) Each bill, resolution or other legislative matter assigned to a standing committee shall pass through a prescribed deliberative process before being brought to the floor of the House, unless it is sooner petitioned out of committee. Such deliberative process shall include regularly scheduled, pre-announced meetings whereby the committee or subcommittee, after notice to the sponsor, makes time available for each formal sponsor to explain the legislation and answer possible questions, considers an analysis of the proposed legislation and receives testimony from the general public.

(b) On the last legislative day of each week, each standing committee shall release a Committee Agenda which shall include, among other things, all matters to be considered by the committee at its next meeting; and any other announcements from the committee including the times, places and dates of future meetings.

(c) Minutes shall be recorded for each formal standing committee meeting, and the results of any committee votes shall be included. If a measure is tabled, reasons for such action shall also be included. Committee members who dissent from any committee decision shall be permitted, in the minutes, to state such dissent and the reasons therefor.

**Rule 35 - Passage of Measures Out of Committee**

(a) Bills and resolutions shall be reported out of any committee or subcommittee by 4 members thereof or by a majority of the full committee or subcommittee members present, whichever is more, by signing the backer. A bill or resolution may be tabled in any committee or subcommittee by 4 members thereof or by a majority vote of the full committee or subcommittee members present, whichever is more.

(b) All bills and resolutions shall be acted upon by the appropriate committee within twelve legislative days after being assigned to that committee.

(c) The Chairman shall return the bill or resolution to the Chief Clerk within two legislative days after a bill or resolution has been voted out of committee.

(d) If a bill is unacceptable to the committee, a substitute bill may be introduced or the committee chairman, on behalf of the committee, may offer one or more amendments which shall take precedence in floor action over any other amendment(s). If the committee amendment(s) fails, the bill may be reassigned to the committee by the Speaker.

(e) Upon a majority vote of the full committee, a subpoena may be requested by the committee and presented to the Speaker for consideration pursuant to Rule 11.

**Rule 36 - Committee Reports**

Each bill and resolution reported out of committee may at the discretion of a majority of the full committee or the committee chairman have a printed or typewritten report which includes a summary of the committee's discussion of the legislation. A copy of this report shall be placed in each member's agenda book when the legislation appears on the agenda.

**Rule 37 - Committee Recommendations to Appropriations Committee**

The committee chairman on behalf of the committee shall make budgetary recommendations to the Appropriations Committee.

**Rule 38 - Committee of the Whole**

The committee of the whole shall mean and include a committee of the entire membership of the House, with the Speaker as chairman, called into session by the Speaker. So far as may be applicable, the rules of the House shall be observed in the committee of the whole.

## VI. MOTIONS

**Rule 39 - Debate and Vote on Motions**

(a) After debate or discussion, the motion shall be repeated by the Speaker before putting the question to the House.

(b) Every motion shall be decided in a fair and impartial manner by the Speaker. The vote of a majority of the members present shall prevail in the case of a motion to recess, incidental motions, subsidiary motions, or other motions presenting questions of a general procedural nature. The vote of a majority of the members elected to the House shall prevail in the case of privileged motions (except a motion to recess), main motions, or other motions presenting questions of a substantive nature. Such voting shall prevail unless contrary to these Rules, or unless it is in conflict with the statutes, or provisions of the Constitution, of the State of Delaware.

(c) The Speaker may cause, or any member may call for, a roll call, or division in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall be required to rise for the purpose of being counted by the Clerk of the House.

(d) At the request of any member, the vote on any measure shall be by roll call vote.

**Rule 40 - Precedence of Motions**

(a) If a question is before the House, no motion may be received except one of the following, and they have precedence in the order listed:

(1) to adjourn *sine die*. This motion is not debatable.

(2) to adjourn. This motion is not debatable and cannot be amended nor reconsidered.

(3) to recess. This motion is not debatable. This motion is passed by a majority of those members present.

(4) question of privilege.

(5) all incidental motions.

(6) to table.

(7) motion to call the previous question. A motion to call the previous question shall not be entertained except at the request of five members arising for that purpose and so indicating, and shall be determined by roll call vote without debate. When the previous question has been called and sustained, it shall not cut off action on amendments to the main measure; and the vote shall be taken without debate first on the amendments in order and then on the main measure.

(8) to limit debate.

(9) postpone to a day certain.

(10) to commit to committee.

(11) to amend. An amendment may be offered to an amendment, but no motion may be accepted which would amend an amendment to an amendment.

(12) to reconsider.

(13) to take from the table.

(b) No motion may be received after a vote upon the question then before the House has been called for by the Speaker.

**Rule 41 - Motion for Reconsideration**

(a) No motion for reconsideration shall be in order unless made on the same legislative day or on one of the three next succeeding legislative days. If the original vote was taken by a recorded vote of yes and no, this motion can be made only by a member who voted with the prevailing side; i.e., a reconsideration can be moved only by one who voted "yes" if the motion involved was adopted or "no" if the motion was lost. If the original vote was not taken by a recorded vote of yes or no, it is in order for any member to move for the reconsideration thereof.

(b) When a bill, resolution, report, amendment, order or message, upon which a vote has been taken, shall have gone out of possession of the House and been communicated to the Senate, or to the Governor, the motion to reconsider shall be accompanied by a motion in writing, attested to by the Speaker, to request the Senate or the Governor to return the same; which last motion shall be acted upon immediately and without debate, and if determined in the negative shall be a final disposition of the motion to reconsider.

**Rule 42 - Motion to Take From the Table**

(a) After a measure has been laid on the table, only the following persons may move to lift such measure from the table:

(1) In the case of a House measure, only one of the prime sponsors of the measure or a member authorized in writing by all the prime sponsors.

(2) In the case of a measure without a House prime sponsor, only the floor manager of a measure or a member authorized in writing by the floor manager.

(b) A motion to take a measure from the table may only be made on the same legislative day the measure is tabled (or if this motion is listed on the agenda). The motion is not debatable.

**Rule 43 - Suspension of Rules**

The suspension of any Rule requires the concurrence of at least a majority of the members elected to the House. This motion is debatable but does not permit discussion of the main question. It cannot be reconsidered, laid on the table, nor postponed indefinitely, and while it is pending no motion may be made except to adjourn. A separate suspension of the Rules is necessary for each measure.

**VII. CALENDAR AND AGENDA****Rule 44 - House and Calendar**

The Clerk of the House shall keep a House Calendar on which shall be placed the number and title of all bills and resolutions, the name of the prime sponsor, and the current status of each bill or resolution. Said bills and resolutions shall be kept on the Calendar and final action recorded.

**Rule 45 - Agenda**

- (a) The Speaker shall place items on the agenda pursuant to Rule 10 of these rules.
- (b) In lifting bills from the table, the motion to lift is the agenda item.
- (c) Any House bill amended by the Senate shall either be placed on the Agenda or assigned to committee, at the discretion of the Speaker.
- (d) Measures brought to the top of the Agenda for the day shall be permitted only to be:
  1. deferred to day certain two times only; or
  2. deferred to the end of agenda one time only; or
  3. laid on the table. A measure which has been on the table for six legislative days shall be returned to the Ready List; or
  4. brought to a vote.

**Rule 46 - Consent Agenda**

(a) Any member of the House may propose any bill or joint resolution for inclusion on a Consent Agenda for final reading. The proposal shall be made in writing to the office of the Chief Clerk on any day. All bills or joint resolutions on a particular Consent Agenda shall have the same vote requirements.

(b) A bill or joint resolution shall be removed from a Consent Agenda if any member objects to it being included thereon. In addition, a bill or joint resolution may not be included on a Consent Agenda if at the time of reading a Consent Agenda an amendment to it has been proposed.

(c) All bills and joint resolutions on a Consent Agenda shall be read and voted upon as a single group.

**Rule 47 - Consent Calendar**

(a) Any member of the House may propose any resolution for inclusion on a Consent Calendar for final reading. The proposal shall be made in writing in the office of the Chief Clerk on any day.

(b) A resolution shall be removed from a Consent Calendar if any member objects to its being included thereon. In addition, resolutions may not be included on a Consent Calendar if at the time of reading a Consent Calendar an amendment to it is proposed.

(c) All resolutions on a Consent Calendar shall be read and voted upon as a single group.

**Rule 48 - Announcement of Agenda, Delivery of Bills and Resolutions**

(a) The Chief Clerk shall lay upon the desk of the Speaker at the beginning of each day's session all bills, resolutions and motions pending before the House that day, properly arranged and classified.

(b) Prior to the beginning of each legislative day, the Chief Clerk shall provide to each member a printed copy by number, sponsor and/or title, of the bills, resolutions or other measures that are being placed on the Agenda for that legislative day.

(c) All enacted bills, concurrent resolutions, or joint resolutions originating in the House, or Senate bills or resolutions to which the House has added amendments or its concurrence, shall be delivered to the Senate by the Chief Clerk of the House or by the Bill Clerk within the three next succeeding legislative days.

**VIII. MISCELLANEOUS****Rule 49 - Offices, Parking Spaces and Seats**

Desks on the floor of the House, offices, and parking spaces shall be allocated to the members by the Speaker.

**Rule 50 - Authorized Manual of Parliamentary Procedure**

In all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Rules, the latest edition of *Mason's Manual of Legislative Procedure*, shall govern the House.

**Rule 51 - Chief Clerk and Assistant Chief Clerk**

The House shall elect a Chief Clerk and an Assistant Chief Clerk who, in the absence of the Chief Clerk, shall perform the Chief Clerk's duties.

The Assistant Chief Clerk, while serving as Chief Clerk, shall be compensated at a per diem rate as determined by the Speaker.

**Rule 52 - Supervision of Legislative Staff**

The legislative staff shall report to such supervisory staff as may be determined by the Speaker. The financial officer of the House shall maintain on file job descriptions for all positions within the legislative staff.

**Rule 53 - Registration of News Media**

- (a) Members of the news media shall be registered by the Division of Research.
- (b) Accredited representatives of the daily and weekly press, press associations, and of radio and television stations shall be accorded equal press privileges by the Speaker. Any person wishing to report proceedings of the House may apply to the Speaker for assignment of suitable available space.
- (c) On approval of the Speaker, radio and television stations shall be permitted to air and record sessions of the House.
- (d) Any use or reproduction of House tapes will require permission of the Speaker and the request shall be communicated to the Chief Clerk in writing. A fee may be charged for this service.

**Rule 54 - Registration of Lobbyists**

Lobbyists shall be registered by the State Public Integrity Commission pursuant to Chapter 58, Title 29 of the Delaware Code. No lobbyist shall be granted privilege of the floor unless so registered.

**Rule 55 - Privilege of Floor**

The privilege of the floor may be granted by the Speaker upon request of any member, unless an objection is sustained by a majority of members present and voting.

**Rule 56 - Expedited Procedures**

The Speaker may designate the procedure by which certain items are to be expedited. Such rules as would interfere with the introduction of and/or action on such items shall automatically be deemed suspended unless one or more members object to an item being determined by expedited procedures.

**Rule 57 - Persons on the Floor of the House**

- (a) No person may be admitted to the floor of the House while the House is in session unless specifically invited by a member and with the consent of the Speaker except the following: former Governors, former members of the House, former members of the Senate (but none of the foregoing has this privileged admission without consent if he is paid to act as a registered legislative agent as defined in Chapter 16, Title 29 of the Delaware Code), duly designated representatives of the Governor of Delaware, members of the House and the Senate and their staffs, staff members from the Division of Research, representatives of each Cabinet Department, reporters for each of the daily newspapers published in the State, a reasonable number of other accredited correspondents as determined by the Speaker and a reasonable number of representatives of radio and television broadcasting stations (together with necessary equipment) as determined by the Speaker.
- (b) No one other than a member shall sit in a member's seat while the House is in session.
- (c) No one shall be allowed to smoke in the House Chamber while the House is in session.

**Rule 58 - Non-Member Invited Speakers or Guests**

- (a) A non-member speaker or guest shall be allowed to address the House of Representatives provided they are noted on the agenda together with the name of the Representative sponsoring said speaker or guest and the time allotted for their remarks.
- (b) A speaker noted per subsection (a) of this rule shall be granted a time limit of one minute, three minutes or five minutes by the Speaker of the House.
- (c) On the day of the scheduled address, the sponsoring member shall be recognized and shall move that the invited speaker or guest be granted privilege to address the House and shall state the allotted time granted by the Speaker of the House.
- (d) The Speaker of the House may grant an unlimited amount of time for the Governor to address the House as deemed necessary by the Speaker or the members of the House.
- (e) This rule is only applicable to appearances by non-members giving remarks unrelated to agenda items and shall not be construed so as to limit the speaking time of witnesses to legislation.

**Rule 59 - Repeal or Amendment of Rules**

No motion, order or resolution to repeal or amend a Rule of the House may be considered or acted upon unless it has been submitted in writing to the House at least one day prior thereto, together with the written text of any proposed amendment. The repeal or amendment of any Rule of the House requires the concurrence of at least a majority of the members elected to the House.

**Rule 60 - Rules to be Printed**

These Rules shall be printed by the Division of Research, upon adoption, in a pocket-sized edition which shall also contain the following materials:

- (a) a list of the Officers of the House;
- (b) the membership of the Standing Committees of the House;
- (c) the Constitutional vote requirements for passage of legislation; and
- (d) requirements set forth elsewhere directly relating to House action such as the fiscal note requirement.

**Rule 61 - State Mail and Postage**

No House member or staff member shall use state mail services and/or state-paid for postage for his or her own personal use.

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO MEMORIALIZE THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO PASS AND SUBMIT TO THE STATES FOR RATIFICATION AN AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES TO PROTECT TAXPAYER RIGHTS FROM JUDICIAL TAXATION BY PROHIBITING COURTS FROM ORDERING ANY STATE OR POLITICAL SUBDIVISION TO LEVY OR INCREASE ANY TAX AND TO URGE OTHER STATES TO DIRECT A SIMILAR MEMORIAL TO CONGRESS.

Whereas, In a five-to-four decision on April 18, 1990, the United States Supreme Court extended the power of the judicial branch of government beyond any defensible bounds. In *Missouri v. Jenkins* (495 U.S. 33, 110 S.Ct. 1691 (1990)), the court held that a federal court had the power to order an increase in state and local taxes; and

Whereas, The unprecedented decision by the court in *Missouri v. Jenkins* violated a fundamental tenet of the separation of powers. No members of the federal judiciary, who serve for life and are answerable to no one, should have control over the power of the purse; and

Whereas, Section 8 of Article I of the Constitution of the United States vests with the legislative branch of government alone the extraordinary power to "lay and collect Taxes, Duties, Imposts and Excises, to pay the Debts and provide for the common Defence and general Welfare of the United States"; and

Whereas, The court's actions are an intrusion into a legitimate political debate over state spending priorities and not a response to a constitutional directive. Justice Kennedy observed in his dissent in *Missouri v. Jenkins* that "This assertion of judicial power in one of the most sensitive of policy areas, that involving taxation, begins a process that over time could threaten fundamental alteration of the form of government our Constitution embodies"; and

Whereas, It is a well-established maxim that whosoever controls the purse strings ultimately controls power, the ability of government to function, and the direction it shall go; and

Whereas, Since 1990, when the Supreme Court declared in *Missouri v. Jenkins* that the federal courts have the authority and power to levy and increase taxes, Congress has chosen not to intercede on behalf of the people to protect the democratic process that has been corrupted by the unconstitutional authority and power to tax which the federal courts have exercised; and

Whereas, The time has come for the people of this great nation and their duly elected representatives in state government to reaffirm, in no uncertain terms that the authority to tax under the Constitution of the United States is retained by the people who, by their consent alone, do delegate such power to tax explicitly to those duly elected representatives in the legislative branch of government who they choose, such representatives being directly responsible and accountable to those who have elected them; now, therefore, be it Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives concurring), That, pursuant to Article V of the United States Constitution, we memorialize the Congress of the United States to pass and submit to the states for ratification an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to read substantially as follows:

Neither the Supreme Court nor any inferior court of the United States shall have the power to instruct or order a state or political subdivision thereof, or an official of such state or political subdivision, to levy or increase taxes; and be it further

Resolved, That this legislative body requests the legislatures of the other states comprising the union to make similar applications to Congress for the purpose of proposing such an amendment to the United States Constitution; and be it further

Resolved, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to the President of the United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, each house of the legislatures of the other states comprising the union, and members of the Michigan congressional delegation.

The members of the House of Representatives were admitted and welcomed by the Lieutenant Governor. At the invitation of the Lieutenant Governor, Representative Spence and Senator Sharp joined her on the podium.

The Sergeant-at-Arms announced the arrival of the members of the Judiciary who were admitted and welcomed by the Lieutenant Governor.

The Sergeant-at-Arms announced the arrival of the Statewide elected officials who were admitted and welcomed by the Lieutenant Governor.

The Sergeant-at-Arms announced the arrival of the members of the Governor's cabinet along with the Presidents of the University of Delaware, Delaware State University and Delaware Technical and Community College who were admitted and seated.

At 2:08 p.m. Senator Voshell moved that the House and Senate meet in Joint Session for the purpose of hearing the State of the State Address by Thomas R. Carper, Governor of the State of Delaware. There was no objection.

Senator Voshell moved that the Lieutenant Governor, as President of the Senate, preside over the Joint Session. No objection - so ordered.

Senator Voshell moved that the Secretary of the Senate and the Chief Clerk of the House act as Secretaries to the Joint Session. The motion prevailed.

Senator Voshell moved that the President appoint a committee of four to escort the Governor to the Chamber. There was no objection and the President appointed Senator Thurman G. Adams, Jr., (Spokesperson), Senator Steven H. Amick, Representative Charles P. West & Representative Tina Fallon.

The President declared a recess at 2:09 p.m. to await the arrival of the Governor and the escort committee.

At 2:13 p.m. the Sergeant-at-Arms announced the arrival of the escort party with Governor Carper.

Senator Adams introduced the Governor to the Joint Session.

The Governor addressed the members of the General Assembly as follows:

Lieutenant Governor Minner, President pro Tem Tom Sharp, House Speaker Terry Spence, to our new Majority Leaders, in the Senate Bob Voshell, Senator Voshell; Representative Wayne Smith, to the Members of this new General Assembly, to our fellow elected officials, to the Members of the Judiciary, to Members of my cabinet, fellow Delawareans, ladies and gentlemen:

I stand before you today to report on the state of our state for a fourth time as your Governor, grateful on behalf of Lieutenant Governor Ruth Ann Minner and myself for the opportunity that you have given us to lead our state into the 21st century. These past four years, all of us have worked together to prepare Delaware to succeed in that new century and well beyond. Every member of this General Assembly -- and every Delawarean -- can take pride in what we have accomplished. By honoring our commitments to our residents, and delivering real results to secure the long-term future of our state, we are keeping Delaware first.

This afternoon, I'd like to take some time to touch on a few of our successes and to outline an aggressive agenda for 1997 and the years to come.

Today in Delaware, our economy stands among the strongest in the nation. January has been a month of more good news. The nation's top rating agencies re-affirmed our highest bond rating in state history. We are among the top five states in the nation for attracting new business growth and jobs. Our unemployment rate -- averaging under five percent again last year -- remains well below the national average.

Earlier this month, we welcomed proudly the production of the Chevrolet Malibu, Motor Trend's Car-of-the-Year, to the GM Boxwood Assembly plant, and we also helped unveil this month the brand-new Dodge Durango that soon will be manufactured at Chrysler's Newark Assembly plant. Both plants have seen fear and doubt transformed into hope and security. Thanks to a lot of people who refused to give up, the long-term future is bright for those facilities, and for the thousands of Delawareans who work there.

One of the reasons we've been so successful in attracting and retaining jobs has been our ability to create an environment in which businesses can grow and prosper. We've cut personal income taxes twice and pushed our top rate below seven percent for the first time in almost four decades. Reducing the personal income tax isn't all we've done to make our state more attractive for residents and for businesses. We've cut the gross receipts tax, the public utility tax, and unemployment insurance taxes. We've created a tax credit for new bank jobs, lowered the franchise tax for banks meeting a higher-income threshold, and increased and expanded the Blue Collar Jobs Tax Credit.

It's no wonder that the Fortune 100 ranks Delaware as the very best state in which to locate or expand a business based on tax policy. We are truly keeping Delaware first when it comes to creating a climate which fosters economic opportunity.

Thanks to a vibrant economy and a welfare reform plan that is a model for our nation, we've helped almost 6,000 Delawareans move from welfare to work. In an effort to lend a hand up instead of a handout, we are providing the health, education, and child care supports necessary to enable thousands of families to reach self-sufficiency through hard work and through self determination.

In education, we've raised standards in each of the core academic subjects and strengthened graduation requirements. Disruption prevention programs in all 180 public schools are helping to ensure that schools are safer places for children where they can concentrate on preparing for success in college or the job market.

With strong private-sector support, we've launched several innovative charter schools and also have introduced an element of competition in public education. Public school choice attracted more than 5,000 applicants in this its first year, with an overwhelming majority receiving their very first choice of schools. Access to the information highway in every public school classroom will become a reality by September of 1998.

To help protect our environment, we've slashed emissions into the air by more than half and into the water by more than 90 percent. At a time when development and growth seem to be encroaching on all sides, we have preserved nearly 30,000 acres of open space and prime farmland, and placed another 86,000 acres into agricultural districts, for future generations to enjoy.

All of this we have done, and more. But now is not the time to step back and congratulate ourselves. Rather, now is the time to forge ahead and recommit ourselves to confront the serious challenges that remain -- challenges that our forefathers 200 years ago could never have imagined:

How will we sustain our economic pre-eminence in a climate of fierce competition? How can we capitalize on the emerging shift in powers between the states and the federal government? How do we deal with a prison population that has increased by nearly 40 percent since the Lt. Governor and I took office in 1993? How do we tackle the intense social pressures that are tearing at the fabric of our families and neighborhoods? How will we balance the need for jobs with our pledge to protect the environment and to manage sprawl?

These challenges will require us to work together in unprecedented ways -- to roll up our sleeves and to tackle these thorny problems head-on. The decisions we make in the 139th General Assembly will largely determine the kind of place Delaware will be at the dawn of a new century.

Let me reiterate what I said a week ago. I want us to be first in the nation -- the place where other states look for answers to the critical challenges of our time.

We are fortunate to begin this new General Assembly in a position of strength. Because we have built on a strong tradition of sound fiscal management and maintained a vibrant economy, our revenue picture remains bright. The nation's most respected bond rating agencies reaffirmed that our economy is strong, it's diverse, and well-poised for continued growth. But we must remain ever-vigilant to ensure that we are not caught unprepared for the future.

In an effort to ease the burden of our residents while creating a healthy business climate, we have rightfully focused on cutting taxes. Just as important, we have provided reductions in a thoughtful and responsible way, ensuring that we could sustain these cuts over the long haul. I will continue to support responsible tax cuts when possible, and I will propose several today. But I will not allow us to sacrifice our ability to provide the services which Delawareans truly need.

With that thought in mind, our Administration will work with the Joint Finance Committee to craft a balanced and responsible budget which keeps spending growth under five percent, while fully funding the State's Rainy Day Fund. The cost of maintaining existing levels of service will consume most of our projected revenues, leaving relatively little room for new initiatives.

We all know that the budget-writing process will be fraught with pressures on both our operating and capital budgets. We are faced with rising student enrollment, requiring us to hire additional teachers and buy more classroom materials. Aging school buildings and more students will require capital investments exceeding \$200 million for schools over the next five years alone. Rising costs in our long-term care Medicaid population threaten to swallow up funds required to meet other vital needs. Keeping law-abiding residents safe from harm requires more prison beds on-line yesterday, not just today.

Later this week, I will send to the General Assembly a "completion" bond bill with no new projects. In doing so, I propose that we utilize additional revenues that emerge between now and June to finish some of our larger projects ahead of time, bringing them on line sooner, and saving millions of dollars in construction costs and interest payments to boot. Our tradition of solid fiscal management and planning has served us well - placing us among the top ten states in this nation. My proposals are designed to bring Delaware a step closer to the AAA credit rating that has eluded us thus far.

## CRIME

Regrettably, the fastest growing part of our state government -- here and elsewhere -- is criminal justice. No issues are of greater importance to Delawareans than crime and the safety of our neighborhoods. Fighting crime requires vigilance on many fronts. It involves the most talented professionals we have, and thousands of volunteers, as well. It begins in the home with parents teaching their children to respect the law, and extends to our schools and our neighborhoods too.

Over the past four years, Delaware has taken bold steps to keep violent criminals off of our streets, to prevent future crimes, and to spare future victims.

To better protect our communities, we increased mandatory sentences for habitual violent offenders, we convicted drug dealers who carry guns, and pedophiles who prey on our children. To make sure these laws are enforced, we've put more officers on the streets and invested heavily in technology to give law enforcement the tools that they need to do their jobs better.

It's not just more policing. It's better policing. We've brought new community policing initiatives to Kent and to Sussex county. In our fight against domestic violence, we've launched a new State Police Domestic Violence Unit, specifically charged with targeting domestic violence cases in each county. This session, I will propose legislation to further strengthen protection-from-abuse orders, as well as legislation prohibiting the possession of a gun by anyone convicted of a domestic violence crime.

Still, we must do more.

We have seen a disturbing rise in shootings this past year, especially in Wilmington. One major reason for this violence is the influx of guns and drugs into our state. As we all know guns and drugs too often go hand in hand. A few years ago, our law enforcement community warned us that Delaware was in danger of becoming a "source state" for illegal purchases of handguns. Those fears have come true. Since 1994, the number of firearms seized in criminal investigations and traced back to us, back to Delaware has increased significantly. Few, if any, of those guns were being used by their original owners.

Part of the reason for this trend is that Delaware has not kept pace with our neighbors. Unwittingly, we have created an attractive business climate for gun runners too.

Delaware is the only state in the region which does not require a criminal records check for the sale of used guns. Over half of all handguns sold in Delaware are sold by private citizens.

To make Delaware less attractive to criminals in the business of guns and drugs, I will propose legislation to require record checks on the sale of *all handguns* -- new and used -- in Delaware. I will also propose legislation to prohibit the possession of ammunition by convicted felons, as well as the possession of handguns where the serial numbers have been destroyed; and legislation that will require stolen guns to be reported to law enforcement.

Now, new laws alone will not get the job done. We need a concentrated law enforcement effort to attack this trade in our most vulnerable communities. This week, I will ask Colonel Alan Ellingsworth to convene a special meeting of our state's police chiefs to work on creating a new state strike force to better coordinate our resources in fighting guns and drugs. I will ask for the assistance of our congressional delegation and the Clinton Administration, as well.

We need to send a strong message to criminals from New York to Washington D.C.: when it comes to trading drugs for guns, Delaware is closed for business.

With tough new laws and more cops on the street, we have seen a corresponding increase in our prison population. Today, we have over 5,000 inmates in our prisons -- facilities which originally were designed to house only 3,100.

Until now, we have *talked* about the overwhelming cost of this expansion, both in terms of one-time capital expenditures and increased operational costs. Now, we are about to witness the fiscal reality of this initiative in next year's budget. Over 35 percent of my proposed capital budget, excluding transportation, will go to prisons. The Department of Corrections will need to hire almost 300 new, full-time correctional officers this coming fiscal year alone. That is more officers than the entire New Castle County Police Department and results in more new full-time positions than were recommended in the entire state budget last year.

As staggering as those costs are, we will be planning our next prison expansion soon after this one is completed if the growth in our prison population continues at its current rate. We *must* find ways to stem the rising tide of our growing inmate population.

The first question to be asked is: Who is this population, and why do they end up in our prisons? Statistics show a very high percentage come from poor, single-parent families, sorely lacking in educational or vocational skills.

Eighty percent of our prison population are serious drug abusers. Many who make up our prison population have been to prison before. Reflecting the national average, recidivism rates are often as high as 70 percent. In most cases, drug abuse plays a major role in repeat offenses.

What can we do to break this cycle? What works?

As many of you know, here in Delaware we have a tough, discipline-based drug treatment program that has become a model for this nation. Our Key and Crest initiatives have produced remarkable results on a small scale, attracting the attention of the U.S. Department of Justice, state criminal justice systems nationwide, and yes even the President of the United States.

Of the prisoners who complete our rigorous Key and Crest in-prison treatment and work release programs, 76 percent, 76 percent, were drug-free and 71 percent, 71 percent, were arrest-free after 18 months. Compare that with the recidivism rates of a control group where only 19 percent remained drug-free and only 30 percent remained arrest-free after those same 18 months.

Completion of the Key and Crest programs by inmates means 40 percent fewer crimes committed, 40 percent fewer victims, and 40 percent fewer prison beds for repeat offenders. For those reasons, I will propose in my recommended budget that we nearly triple the scope of these programs in fiscal year 1998.

As we move forward with our huge prison expansion effort, the time is right to set a new course for these prisons. I want to create a prison system where addicted inmates with a sentence of one year or more will spend the last year of their sentence in the Key drug treatment program, followed by the Crest work release program, and then aftercare. I want a prison system that will *demand* the discipline and the commitment that these proven programs require.

Our Key and our Crest programs are not right for everyone. For those who only spend a short time in our prisons, we must create a "no-frills" prison where inmates are expected to work and are afforded few privileges. We must impress upon these individuals that prison is not a place to which they want to return. The Department of Corrections has already begun developing such a plan that will be unveiled later this year.

We must also improve vocational training in combination with inmate work programs so that inmates may begin to work *for* society, instead of *against* society. To help accomplish this task, I will propose that we begin transferring the responsibilities for our prison vocational training programs from the Department of Corrections to our award winning vo-tech school districts. By utilizing their expertise, we can greatly enhance the quality of these programs.

I believe that this new approach to our corrections system will begin to turn the tide of Delaware's growing prison population. These are things we must do to help make our prisons a place where people become better citizens -- and not better criminals.

On this battlefield, we cannot afford to fail. But if we are truly to succeed, our efforts to fight crime must begin long before people reach our adult prisons.

We must redouble our efforts to stop today's generation of troubled youth from becoming tomorrow's prison population. Many of these kids have already shown a propensity toward crime and violence -- both in our schools and in our neighborhoods. They often end up in our juvenile facilities. For some, these crimes are so serious they can no longer be treated as kids. For them, we have no alternative but to sentence them -- and segregate them in -- adult prison. But for those who can be led more readily back to the right path, we must provide juvenile facilities that nurture, that educate, and that discipline.

In a few short weeks, our new Ferris School -- with its improved programming -- will open its doors and with it will begin a new chapter in youth rehabilitation in Delaware.

#### **YOUTH CRIME PREVENTION/EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION**

At Ferris and in our communities, our efforts to reduce crime must focus on children and on their parents. All the cops and prisons in the world won't protect us if we don't diminish the supply of new criminals.

We know the problems. Poverty. Too many children born out of wedlock. Absentee fathers. Too many children subjected to violence and neglect. Too many children who arrive at school already hopelessly behind. Too many children who leave elementary school and still can't read. Too many kids who don't know or obey basic norms of social behavior. Too many kids allowed to roam the streets unsupervised.

The obligation to address these problems starts with parents, with families, and with communities -- not with government. Government alone cannot substitute for the love of two fully committed parents mutually devoted to their child's success. But we can provide poor children the same educational opportunities as middle-class children, and by expecting all children to behave decently and to achieve at high academic levels, regardless of their class, their race or their gender.

Two years ago, our state launched a Comprehensive School Discipline Program that improves school safety, enables our schools to demand higher standards of behavior, and gives our most troubled youth the extra support that they need. Not only that, we've provided funds for extra instructional time and built momentum behind an effort to engage 10,000 Delawareans in school-based mentoring programs that help more kids to learn, to behave and improve their self-esteem.

These efforts improve lives. I'm convinced they also help to prevent crime.

This year, I am asking you, the General Assembly to take several additional steps to address the problems of at-risk children which lead to crime. These measures comprise a strong Youth Crime Prevention and Early Childhood Education agenda for our state.

To ensure that at-risk children get off to a good start, I am recommending the funding necessary so that all parents who need parenting education can get it. To better ensure that children arrive at school ready to learn, I am recommending expansion of the state's Early Childhood Program so that every four-year-old in our state who lives in poverty will soon have access to Head Start.

These pre-school investments must be followed up at the school level. American children spend far less time in school than their peers in Germany and Japan. The lengthy summer break especially harms poor children. All of us remember -- and many of us who have children in school now experience -- Septembers in public schools devoted to relearning what was known the previous May.

In the next century, academic achievement will be even more important, not less important, than it is today. It is time to recognize that if all of our children are to reach the rigorous academic standards that you and I have set, that our state has set, then we must provide many of them, many of those kids, with substantial amounts of extra learning time -- or be prepared to watch them fail.

To that end, I am proposing the funding necessary next year to provide a full month of extra instructional time -- 20 school days -- for the lowest achieving students in kindergarten through sixth grade. School districts may provide this targeted instruction during the summer, they may provide it after school, they may provide it on Saturdays, or provide full-day kindergarten. That is their decision.

As an integral part of this effort to improve academic achievement, I am also recommending expanded funding for the grants for additional schools that wish to start school-based mentoring programs to help struggling students.

And finally, I am proposing to strengthen the Comprehensive School Discipline Program by increasing base funding for Part II of that program to strengthen school partnerships with the Children's Department, with police agencies, and community-based organizations, and to increase the emphasis on prevention and on anti-drug efforts. These investments will help our schools better address the family and social problems that give rise to school disruption and to academic failure.

Coupled with a strong economy and our support for working low-income families, this Youth Crime Prevention and Early Childhood Agenda will do as much as anything our government can do to deter young people from lives of crime. If involved parents and caring communities also do their part, we can give our children a brighter future and at the same time make Delaware a safer place for all of us to live in.

## **EDUCATION**

Delaware is undertaking these prevention measures in the context of our State's overall education reform -- a program that focuses on two key words: standards and assessments.

Delaware was among the first states to adopt rigorous academic standards that clearly define what students are expected to know and be able to do at different grade levels in core subjects such as science, math, English and social studies.

These standards, our standards, have won national acclaim. They have been in the hands of Delaware teachers now for nearly two years. Special funding for professional development and new textbooks, tied to the state standards, has been appropriated by the General Assembly. The standards should now be entering the day-to-day lives of children in classrooms throughout Delaware.

Just as every meaningful human endeavor needs a standard or goal to meet, so too does it require a test of whether that goal has been reached. That is the job of educational assessments: to measure whether students are meeting the standards of academic achievement that we have set for them as a state.

Instead of simply asking students to complete multiple choice questions, these assessments also require students for example to write essays or to explain how they solved math problems. The end result should be a more accurate and rigorous method of evaluating performance that goes well beyond rote memorization to determine whether students understand the key concepts that they are learning.

In the Spring of 1998, the state will administer its first set of assessments tied to these core standards. The test will measure student achievement of English and of math in grades 3, 5, 8, and 10.

This next step will challenge our commitment to our children's future well being. We all know that unless there are consequences -- both positive and negative -- attached to any task, then that task is not taken seriously. Participants in the education system, starting with students, must be held accountable for whether these state standards are achieved.

At this critical juncture in Delaware's education reform, I am asking the General Assembly to take a limited, but profoundly important, step by requiring that the new state standards in the core subjects be designed to hold students accountable. That means that these tests should be capable of helping us to determine, for example, whether students go on to the next grade level, or receive a regular high school diploma. The new assessments should also be designed so that students can receive positive rewards for attaining quality scores, such as scholarships or merit diplomas. The decision as to how to use these accountability measures, and when they go into effect, should be debated and should be addressed over the next several years. However, the commitment to an assessment that enables Delaware to adopt such measure: should be made this year.

Standards and assessments produce high performing graduates in other nations because there is student accountability. The time has come for us to make our own commitment to accountability in Delaware -- and that time, my friends, is now.

That commitment to accountability must not just extend to students, but to parents and to our education system as a whole. We've taken steps to introduce more accountability through public school choice and through charter schools, more rigorous teacher certification standards, and the publication of better information about our public schools.

We've also cut down on regulation. We've empowered local school districts and schools themselves to make bold decisions without our micromanagement. By moving decisions closer to the people, we are creating a more responsive and effective local school system.

This year, I want us to make our state education agency even more accountable to the people of Delaware too. That is why I am asking you to create a Department of Education, headed by a Secretary of Education nominated by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. Our doing so will enable the people of Delaware to hold this governor and future governors directly accountable for how that agency performs, while giving you, the General Assembly, a better opportunity to fulfill your oversight function. Last week, the House passed legislation to do just that and you did so by an overwhelming margin. This week, I am asking the Senate to do the same.

A more effective state Department of Education can be the people's advocate in education, providing Delawareans with high-quality information about their local schools' spending practices, educational programs, and their performance. A more responsive and accountable Department of Education can also serve as a source of innovation and technical advice, and better meet the needs of local districts.

To meet the challenges of the 21st Century, Delaware must produce students with excellent skills. The way to accomplish that objective is to set high goals for our students and to be resolute enough to hold them, their parents, and our education system, accountable for meeting those goals. This is the year we must make that commitment.

### **STRENGTHENING OUR ECONOMY**

So much of our future depends on an excellent education system and the workforce it must produce. Developing that workforce is the key to a strong economy and keeping and attracting quality jobs.

When our Lt. Governor and I began our first terms, Delaware's economy was far less optimistic than it is today. But thanks to a bold strategy, undying enterprise, and a little luck, we've created an environment that gives every Delawarean a chance to find work and a chance to succeed.

Four years later, our economic goals have not changed. We must strive to make Delaware a place where parents can earn enough money to feed their children and provide them with good homes. A place where companies can take root, where they can grow, and where they can prosper. A place where individuals - bound only by the limits of their own enterprise -- forge better lives for themselves and for their families.

Four years ago, four years ago, we launched what we called a "grow our own" economic development strategy with four key elements: 1) fostering and expanding Delaware's existing businesses, particularly our small businesses; 2) investing in Delaware's infrastructure; 3) running a government that keeps taxes and red tape to a minimum; and, 4) creating a quality workforce. That strategy has not changed. As the 21st Century approaches, we must build on our economic strengths to ensure our prosperity.

One of the biggest strengths is a thriving financial services industry. That industry employs as you know more than 26,000 people today in our state and has added more than 2,500 jobs in the last two years alone.

We must continue to build on that success. On the first of this year -- with the help of the General Assembly -- we reduced the state's bank franchise tax and established a "challenge bracket" to spur further growth. This year, I will propose legislation to improve and make more efficient our banking regulatory process. And, I will continue to visit personally the top management at financial institutions all over this country to tell them about what we have to offer to them and their financial institutions right here in Delaware.

Banking isn't our only strength. Delaware also is the home of the highest number of scientists and engineers *per capita, per capita*, in this nation. To build on that advantage, I will recommend an additional \$4 million from the 21st Century Fund for our Advanced Technology Center initiatives which hold great promise for creating high-paying jobs in new technologies. And we're also moving forward, as you know, in our efforts to bring the high-tech semiconductor industry here to Delaware.

As we do so, we must continue to recognize the role that small business plays in forging a strong economy. To that end, I will recommend two new "storefront" Small Business Development Centers -- one in Dover and one in Georgetown -- building on the phenomenal success of the one-stop, storefront center we opened last summer in downtown Wilmington where over 2,000 people visited for help in starting and growing their own businesses in the last six months alone. We can and should replicate that success here in Kent County and in Sussex County.

We also have enjoyed tremendous success in improving access to capital, including venture capital.

Using only \$5 million in public moneys, we have leveraged more than \$100 million in public- and private-sector funding to help promising businesses to grow and to thrive. We will continue to support the Delaware Venture Partners initiative, the Delaware Innovation Fund, and the Delaware Access Program as they support the promising ideas of entrepreneurs and inventors, and their small, but growing companies.

During my first term, we cut business or personal income taxes in each of the last four years. This year, I will recommend that we reduce Delaware's public utility tax, and make that tax more equitable for purchasers of gas and electricity.

On the recommendation of the Unemployment Insurance Advisory Council, I am proposing that we reduce unemployment insurance taxes further, and raise the maximum weekly benefit for unemployed workers. In addition, to further reducing government red tape, I will recommend again the eliminating the Second Injury Fund for workers' compensation -- with no decrease in benefits.

Perhaps most importantly, we will remain vigilant in our efforts to provide a responsive, customer-friendly government which allows businesses to grow and thrive here, while meeting their responsibilities to us, the community. We want to build on the successes of General Motors, on Chrysler, on Playtex, Bio-Medic, Johnson Controls, Zenith Products and others. In keeping with those successes, I am proposing an additional \$10 million for the Delaware Economic Development Office's Strategic Fund.

As some of you know, the first time I ever saw Delaware was from a military aircraft as a young naval flight officer all of 22 years old. I was struck then, as I am now, by the natural beauty of this state. From the rolling hills of the piedmont in western New Castle County, to the vast stretches of fertile farmland south of the Canal, to the miles of sun-drenched beaches along the Sussex coastline, Delaware is blessed with a picturesque landscape that few states can match. I learned after living here just a short time that Delaware also is blessed with communities and a quality of life that have made it a wonderful place to live, a wonderful place to raise a family.

One of the biggest challenges that we face today is to preserve this small wonder of a state -- preserve our precious farmland and our agricultural industry, along with our open spaces and our natural areas, while maintaining a vital and expanding economy.

We cannot continue with the current sprawling development pattern in Delaware and preserve our natural resources and community character. It's that simple. Sprawl eats up valuable farmland, open space, and natural habitat. It stresses our existing transportation system and is more expensive to service with water and sewer facilities.

My Cabinet Committee on State Planning Issues has developed a set of goals for Delaware through a series of statewide workshops and a number of public meetings. Some of you have participated in those. The Shaping Delaware's Future goals are the blueprint guiding our state's capital investments, as well as our assessment of the counties' comprehensive land use plans.

Our state goals seek to guide new development to existing towns and communities and to designated growth areas by targeting state infrastructure to those areas. The more difficult and controversial task is to discourage and restrict development outside of those growth areas. It is this process of directing and restricting growth that poses our biggest challenge. In order to be successful, we must do it with a sense of balance and a sense of fairness. We must recognize the property rights of farmers and of landowners. We must maintain our vital economy, and, at the same time, we must protect open spaces and the character of our communities.

I recognize the tremendous interest of this legislature, of all three county governments, of our business community, and thousands of other Delawareans in how Delaware grows and how we use this land of ours. Each of us has our own ideas about the best way to move forward. There are some areas of agreement and, you know and I know, there are some sharp areas of disagreement.

I believe the time has come to try and forge a consensus. The Delaware Public Policy Institute has offered to sponsor a summit for that very purpose. Its success requires that we trust each other to do what is right for Delaware. Today, I am putting my full support behind this effort. I urge you, the Members of this General Assembly, and everyone who shares my view to do the same.

One critical area where we know we must find consensus is transportation. The most common complaint that we hear from residents of communities confronted with new development near their homes is traffic.

Building a transportation system which supports our vital economy and which provides adequate mobility for our citizens is not easy. If it were, somebody would have done it a long time ago. We are now playing catch-up to development that has occurred over the past decade or more.

For us to be successful, Delaware's Transportation Trust Fund must have adequate resources to unclog congested intersections, to preserve and maintain the capacity in our existing system, and to expand capacity in growth areas. At the same time, we must realize that we cannot build ourselves out of all of our traffic problems. We need to provide transportation alternatives too that preserve capacity on our roadways, while giving us cleaner air to breathe.

The capital budget which I'll submit this week will include a proposal to increase revenues for transportation. I recognize that there are many opinions inside this chamber, and outside of it, on how to provide more revenues for transportation. I believe the best way to guarantee funding for needed transportation projects is to enhance the existing dedicated user fees already supporting the fund, while holding the line on operating expenses paid for by that fund. I hope the General Assembly will come to share that view once all the alternatives have been carefully reviewed and fully debated.

To meet the challenges of managing growth well, we need the very best efforts of all Delawareans. In Delaware, we have a history of working together, a history of taking decisive action. When confronted with a problem or challenge, we pull together, Democrats and Republicans alike, public sector and private sector, we pull together to find solutions that work. I pledge to you my very best effort on this difficult front and ask of each of you the very same.

Ladies and gentlemen, I have shared with you this afternoon a snapshot of the preeminent position that Delaware enjoys today among all the fifty states. I have shared with you, as well, my candid views on some of the steps that we need to take over the next few years if we truly are to help lead this nation of ours into the 21st century. Whether it's fighting crime, whether it's making sure that kids stay in school and out of trouble, or fully implementing standards and assessments in education, injecting greater accountability throughout our school system, or balancing the need for a strong economy with our desire to ensure that Delaware remains a special place to live and to work, the challenges that we face are not easy ones.

Let me end my remarks to you this afternoon with a simple observation: I stand before you today as the last governor of this century and the first governor of the next.

Our first four years of working together were filled with accomplishment in which each one of us can take pride. Now, as we look forward to welcoming the next century, we are fortunate to have the talent and resources to overcome some of the most difficult challenges that face our state and this nation of ours. The question confronting us is this: "Do we have the will?" I believe we do.

The agenda I have outlined for you today builds on our successes and seeks to add to them. I recognize that some of the issues I have discussed are controversial ones. Some will require difficult choices from each one of us. But that is our task, our responsibility to the people who elected us, just as it has been for Delaware governors and for legislators for over 200 years.

Our own history beckons us, not to look back, but to move forward, not to settle for mediocrity, but to be the best. Working together, we will lead this nation into the 21st Century, confident in the strength and the ability of the people that we serve, committed to keeping Delaware first.

NATO will invite a number of nations from among the new democracies of Central and Eastern Europe to begin the formal process of joining the Alliance at a summit to be held in Madrid, Spain, this July. It is generally understood that the Republic of Poland will be among those nations invited to join the Alliance.

The Department of State recently submitted a report to Congress that explores the rationale, benefits and costs associated with the enlargement of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. I have included a copy of that report for the members of Delaware's legislature who have expressed an interest in this foreign policy matter.

Thank you, again, for advising me of the sentiments expressed by members of the Delaware State House of Representatives on behalf of the Republic of Poland and the enlargement of NATO.
