I understand that the reason why
the lands are not sold is owing to a sup-
position that they will be more valuable but
sure I would remark that lands will increase
in the same ratio elsewhere & it is folly
for us to lay out of money which we could
apply to a better advantage.

from us on a farm she appears to be very
happy. Mr Claypoole is very industrious &

share of the estate to apply on his farm.

If the estate cannot be settled in any
other way - if the lands in Pen^d & wife admit
of a division I will apply for it & sell it
for what it will bring - if anything will -
if not I will know what to depend upon.

Should you be in this part of the world
at any time we would be glad to see you.
We are situated in the midst of a fine cattle
growing country every year our lands are becoming
more valuable - Sarah has just returned
from visiting Eliza they were all well. Mary
will stay with Eliza a short time. I told
her I was going to write to you about the estate
she wished me to wait till she came back
that will be with Sarahs.

Please write soon & say what news
from your brother Thomas we heard he was going
to be married. I am writing more like a old
acquaintance than a stranger but I hope you
will excuse the liberty. Sarah wishes to be
remembered to Mrs. B.

Dear Sir-

In reply to your favor recd this Morning, I can say, that I think some one has done the purchasers of the Abbone lands, great injustice. I believe them too honorable men, to do as you were led to fear; at any rate, they are too responsible and intelligent to get themselves into such difficulty.

Richd Gardner tract was sold to the Commissioners for taxes &c &c.

John Dorsey " not advertised or offered for sale, not applied by the Commissioners, it being sealed; & for the same reason no one bid anything for the Gardner tract.

The tracts sold for much less than I expected. I should have bid them in, probably, had I been present; but I arranged all my other tax sales business, and as I had no instructions as to these lands, I left them to whoever were disposed to purchase, as I had on that day to go to

Sheranton. I believed, from what he said, that Mr.
Brown would purchase them; though he did not
say that he would. It will require three hundred and
fifty six dollars, seventy cents, to redeem them; as you
will see by the enclosed transcript, which I have made
out, as the amount is higher than you might otherwise
have expected. I have no doubt, but that on properly
to redeem these lands I can prevail upon each purchaser
to convey all his interest to you. They will do it probably,
subject to the lien of the bond, and your quittance or agreement, by
acceptance of the assignment, to pay, the bonds for the supplies, f
called for.

If therefore, you desire this, you can deposit the \$356.70
in the bank of the Northern Liberties to my credit, (asking the
agent to notify me of the fact,) and I will go on and
purchase in the tax title as I have opportunity, of each purchaser.
Let me hear from you, by return of mail, if you please.
