Dear Dannie :

This is going to be a brief letter, but I do want to write you a brief letter before leaving on my weekend for Cuernavaca. I have been very busy, as all of us here have been. The worst of it is that I have not altogether been able to shake off this cold etc., in spite of the four days I recently spent in bed. I did not realize how persistent one of these infections can be. I am beginning to feel really better, but I must admit that I have kept going the last weeks under a good deal of difficulty.

Sir Reginald Leeper and his wife are arriving on June 4. I am planning to fly to New York on June 14 or 15, more likely on the 15th. I will let you know ahead of time when I will arrive and would appreciate your getting a room for me at the Carlyle for three or four days. I want to spend three or four days with you in New York and then I want to go to Washington on some Mexlight matters and also to talk about Cade, and I hope it will be possible for you to go over with me to see some of the people about Cade, even if it is only for a part of my stay there. I will have to leave for Toronto the night of June 25 by train and will return from Toronto on the evening of June 28 by train. I may have a few more days in New York and in Washington, if it is desirable, before returning to Mexico City. Mr. Maryssael and Mr. Martinez Tejeda, I think, would leave here around June 24 for New York and will go to Toronto on the train with me, the night of June 25. I think it is better that both of them go to these meetings.

Marion is well and sends her love. She had a letter from Hettie while she was at Chalott, and Marion says it was one of the very nicest letters she ever had. We have

We were out at Jimmie's house for the christening of the baby, and she really behaved wonderfully. Marilyn is really an unusually fine and attractive child. June seems to be over her troubles that laid her up for a few days, but she is having a few examinations to see what the trouble really was. Jimmie is very well.

I would like to write you about Cade matters, but I really have not been able to give much thought to it the last ten days. I will have to close this letter as there is a good deal of what to do.

Marion joins in love to you and the family, and I look forward to seeing you very soon. I am so happy that you are feeling better.
