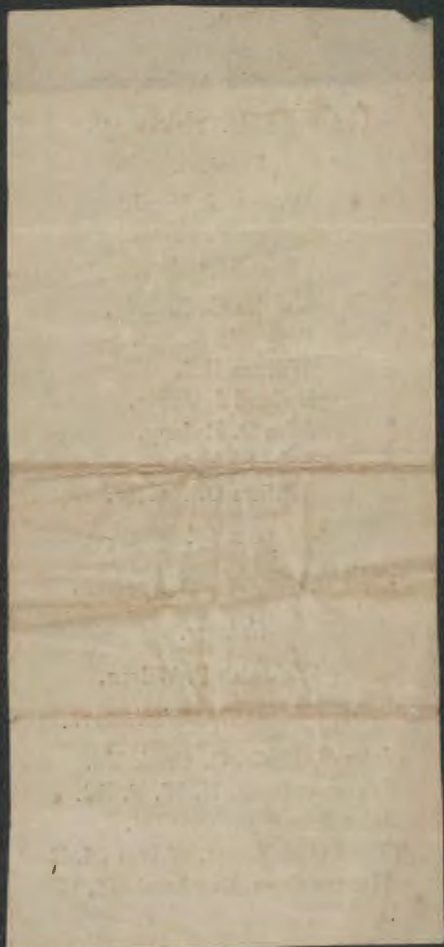

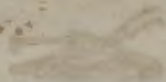

Article 11 of the Constitution

That the Executive Power shall be vested in the President of the United States.

He shall hold his Office during the Term of four Years, and until his Successor be chosen.

He shall, before he enters on the Execution of his Office, take the following Oath or Affirmation.

I do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will faithfully execute the Office of President of the United States, and will preserve, protect, and defend the Constitution.

He shall receive for his Services a Compensation, which shall be ascertained by Law.

He shall have Power to grant Reprieves and Pardons for all Offences against the United States, except in Cases of Impeachment.

He shall have Power to fill up all Vacancies that may happen during the recess of the Senate, by granting Commissions which shall expire at the End of their next Session.

He shall have Power to grant and receive Ambassadors and other public Ministers.

He shall have Power to make Treaties, provided two thirds of the Senators present concur.
