We both have a very real longing to spend a little time among old friends and associations and it looks now as though I might have the leisure to be able to do so during the second half of this year.

I have just returned from another trip, and a very brief one, to New York and Washington but I did not get to Wilmington as I was away only for a week. I stopped at the Air War College in Alabama, at Maxwell Field, on my way back to deliver an address, and I am sorry to say that I am not any more optimistic concerning the world situation than I have been in the last two years.
