Dear Dunn:

I am sending you herewith a copy of my letter of November 23rd to Judge Moore. I believe its more pessimistic note is justified by a realistic analysis of the developments which we have had to face recently. While I am still uncertain as to the real nature of German-Italian commitments, I think this is a position which must be watched very closely. And one thing we know already, and that is, we cannot depend altogether on what we are told either by the government in Berlin or that in Rome. We have to read the story in the developing facts. One thing I think is clear, and that is the mutual distrust in Berlin and in Rome is just as great as ever.

I am sending you herewith a few clippings from the London TIMES which may be of interest.
