Too tall

Chapel Street, from Main Street to Cleveland Avenue, in Newark was closed for nearly an hour on the morning of Monday, April 11th, when a southbound truck from Pennsylvania struck the CSX railroad bridge. No injuries were reported. Personnel from the City of Newark, DelDOT and CSX were on the scene to assess the damage. The tractor-trailer did not become wedged at the bridge and was able to back out. Newark Police said the accident damaged a cross beam on the underpass. It could not be immediately determined if CSX trains were delayed, due to the mishap. A CSX train did pass through Newark at 2:30 p.m. The operator of the truck was ticketed for inattentive driving.



Morehead sweeps field

Mark Morehead won a convincing victory Tuesday night in a four-way race for the 1st District Seat on the Newark City Council.

When the results were announced on Tuesday night, Morehead had racked up 303 votes or more than 65.4 percent, three times the number of runner up Robyn Harland with 99 votes or 21.4 percent. Kevin Brown recorded 48 votes, while Michael Conway came in at 13 votes.

The seat had been up for grabs after Councilman Paul Pomeroy decided not to run again, citing family and job responsibilities.

Morehead said he had no idea that he would win by the convincing margin, even during visits outside the district's polling place on Tuesday.

He did do his homework, noting that he knocked on 1,100 doors and placed signs at strategic locations in the district that includes the west side of Newark. Along the way, Morehead said he took extensive notes regarding the concerns of residents.

Morehead operates a home renovation company specializing in services to senior citizens.

Morehead won't have much time to savor the victory. This month, the council is expected to hire a new city solicitor, vote on a new rate design for the electric utility and consider the Campus Edge mixed-use development between Delaware Avenue and Main Street. The councilman-elect said he is studying the electrical rate issue and plans to do the same with Campus Edge.

Two new dining spots debut on Main Street

Two long-awaited restaurants are now open.

Chipotle Mexican Grill opened their doors on April 13. The establishment on Main Street organized a sneak preview for invited guests on April 12 by providing free food and drinks.

Chipotle Mexican Grill features burritos, tacos, and salads, which are created with the philosophy of "Food With Integrity", where the establish-

ment obtains the freshest ingredients possible from local and family farmers growing organic vegetables and raising antibiotic and hormone-free meats. For younger patrons, the restaurant also provides a Kid's Menu.

Don't look for photos or sombreros from Mexico. The décor at Chipotle is clean and some might say stark, with the wood tables and modern lighting.

The dining spot was a long time in coming to the city, due to parking waiver fees with the city and other issues. A compromise agreement was finally worked out with the city.

The franchise operates in long-vacant space that once housed the Copy Maven printing business.

Another business that took a while to come to the city also opened recently near Chipotle.

Cheeberger, Cheeburger is part of a mid-sized chain of restaurants featuring cheeseburgers, shakes and other items.

The restaurant, at the site of a diner on Main Street, also took a while to open, but diners have been steadily flocking to the location.

Door-to-door seller accused of swiping medicine

Newark Police have arrested Chelsea Kunupp, 19, of Wake, Virginia on charges of stealing prescription medication from a residence while soliciting for a magazine sales company. On Saturday, April 9th, Kunupp,

who sells magazines for Atlantic Circulation of York, Pa., went to the door of a resident in the Christina Mill Apartment complex in an attempt to sell the resident a magazine subscription. Kunupp asked to use the bathroom. After leaving, the victim discovered that his prescription medication was missing.

Kunupp, who did not have a permit from the city, was located by police and found in possession of the victims stolen prescription medication. Kunupp was arrested for Soliciting Without a Permit and Obtaining a Controlled Substance by Theft. She was released on \$350 unsecured bond.

In a release announcing the arrest, police noted that the City of Newark requires a permit for any business conducting door to door sales and requires solicitors to have a copy of this permit in their possession. The Newark Police Department also noted that it discourages residents from allowing persons they don't know into their homes and encourages residents to report all suspicious activity to the police.

Arts Alliance break in reported

Newark Police are investigating a break-in at the Newark Art Alliance, located at 276 E. Main St., that occurred on April 4.

The director of the Alliance told responding officers that the business had been open on April 5 and that two employees had left around 6 p.m. When the office was opened the next day, employees found that several locked desk drawers and lockboxes had been pried open and their contents emptied onto the floor. The business reported that \$223.00 in cash had been taken, but were unsure if any checks or credit card numbers had been removed.

A search of the premises showed that the point of entry was a rear glass block window that had been broken out with a brick. Several fingerprints were recovered from the broken lockboxes and a piece of cardboard used to hide the hole in the window.

No witnesses have reported seeing anything at the scene. The case has been turned over to the Criminal Investigation Department for review.

Shoplifter gets away with body lotion, condoms

Police are on the lookout for a shoplifter that stole over \$200 worth of merchandise from the Happy Harry's located at 124 E. Main St. The event occurred last Tuesday, April 5.

Employees with the store

reported seeing a black male running out of the store, onto Main Street, with merchandise dropping out of his sweat shirt as he fled. The suspect has frequented the store before and has been known to have shoplifted items from there previously.

An inventory count showed that the suspect removed three bottles of Nivea lotion, four bottles of Cetaphil lotion, and 13 large packs of Trojan brand condoms, worth a retail value of \$217.

The suspect is described as a black male, 6 feet to 6 feet 2 inches tall, approximately 220 pounds, wearing a black hooded sweat shirt, gray hat, and dark blue jeans.

An area check was conducted immediately after the report was made, but returned negative results.

Basin grates missing

Representatives of the Newark Public Works Department reported that sometime between March 22 and March 31 five brand new, cast iron catch basin grates were removed from a storage garage. The grates are valued at \$175 each and weigh over 100 pounds apiece.

Due to the weight of each grate, authorities believe that several suspects were involved in the theft.

Items missing from fire house

Aetna Hook, Hose, and Ladder Co. reported to Newark Police that 40 inch Sony Bravia television, worth \$900, and a

Lifepak 500 A.E.D. defibrillator machine, worth \$1,300, have turned up missing in a recent inventory of station equipment.

A representative with the fire department stated that the television had been placed in the chief's office in Station 9, located on Academy Street, while construction had been going on. The television is believed to have gone missing sometime around January.

The A.E.D. machine was part of the equipment load for Special Ops Truck No. 8, out of Station 8 on Ogletown Rd.

The report was filed in an effort to force the subjects who removed the items to return them, knowing that the police are now investigating the case.

Police: Student found with crack cocaine

Newark Police arrested Stephan Black, a 19-year-old Newark High School student, after he was found in pos-

session of 82 "rocks" of crack cocaine while on the school property. Black's address was listed as the 1000 block of Chestnut St., Wilmington.

The arrest was made at approximately 8:30 a.m. on April 7th by the School Resource Officer after he received information that Black was selling a small amount of marijuana to a 17-year-old student. During his investigation, the School Resource Officer (a Newark Police officer) contacted Black and discovered that he was in possession of the crack cocaine. Black was arrested on the below charges and was taken to Howard Young Correctional in lieu of \$65,000 secured bail.

The 17-year-old juvenile was charged with Possession of Marijuana and released to his parents. There is no indication that any crack cocaine was sold at the high school.

Newark lacrosse captains lead experienced team

Newark's boys lacrosse team knew coming into this season it had the experience

necessary to top last year's disappointing 5-10 campaign. With 10 starters returning on a senior-laden team the Yellowjackets are off to exactly the kind of start necessary to do just that.

Newark has already almost equaled its win total of last season having won four games heading into Tuesday's game against A. I. du Pont. The Yellowjackets are reaping the benefits of having 15 experienced seniors on the squad, led by co-captains Mike Mene and Nick Rybinski.

Mene led the team in scoring last year with 47 goals and 18 assists, and his play earned him his second first team All-Conference selection.

"Mike has been a standout player for Newark High for the past two seasons," Newark coach Mike Trego said of his co-captain, who carries a 3.9 GPA in the classroom. "Mike is the toughest player I have coached in 13 years. He is a natural leader on the field.

"Mike is a force that other coaches must plan their defense around every game. He draws the best defenseman in every game. Our players look to Mike to take over in a game in tough situations. He gives our team a sense of assurance when he is on the field."

Mene, who has 17 goals despite often being double-teamed, is joined on the offensive attack by junior Andrew

Diego and senior midfielders Ben Moyer, Stan Gourentchik and Kris Tompkins.

Rybinski leads a Newark defense made up of seniors Enoch Lee and Kyle Mooney, and juniors Abe Toure and Mike Powers.

"One of our goals this season is to have a much stronger defense than a year ago," said assistant coach Dan MacLeish, who Trego credits for the team's improvements on defense and faceoffs. "We will look for leadership from Rybinski and Lee to establish a hard-working team defense that thrives on hustle and communication."

Rybinski leads the team in groundballs, interceptions and takeaways, drawing praise from his coach.

Nick has really stepped up this year," MacLeish added. "He leads the defense with a good stick, fast feet, and a lot of hustle."

As Newark approaches the midway point of its season, Trego is please with his team's 4-3 record thus far, and cites the hard work that took place before the first faceoff was ever taken as being a key to the Yellowjackets' success.

"Thus far I am happy with the amount of hard work the guys have put into having a successful season," he said. "Coming off a down season a year ago, our team has responded by working hard in the offseason and preparing much better for this season."

Canines join UD Police

Scout and Panzer stand out in a crowd. They also command attention and generate instant respect wherever they happen to be working on the University of Delaware campus. Under the command, respectively, of Patrick McCloskey and Michael Crew, master police officers in the UD Police Department, the black and brown two-year-old German shepherds make up the first canine patrol unit at UD.

The officers and their canine partners recently received official recognition during a graduation ceremony held March 17 at Delaware Technical and Community College's Stanton campus.

"We completed the 26-week canine training course given by the New Castle County Police Department," Crew said. "We also received national certification from the National Police Canine Association."

Patrick Ogden, director of public safety at UD, said the new K-9 unit reflects the UD Police Department's commitment to pursue innovative crime reduction strategies and community policing initiatives.

"The unit will serve a dual purpose of explosive detection and patrol duty," Ogden said. "They will be a force multiplier for the entire UD and Newark community."

McCloskey said that training with Scout and Panzer began after the dogs were recommended for duty by trainers from the New Castle County Police Department.

"Although they are German shepherds, the dogs were actually born and bred in Holland," McCloskey said. "They are trained to detect a variety of explosives, and they can also help with area and building searches."

While training presents many challenges, perhaps the most significant is teaching the dogs what they need to know in a way they can understand, McCloskey said.

"Training kicks off with an acclamation period, where the officers and the dogs get to know each other," McCloskey said. "Because the breed tends to be very alpha, establishing the proper working relationship requires something of a balancing act."

With their ears raised and eyes taking in all the details of their environment, Scout and Panzer listen dutifully for commands from their police officer partners and handlers.

"You need to let the dogs know that you are the boss," Crew said. "They have to know that they are not in charge."

The dogs are trained to detect a variety of explosives, including black powder, C-4 (plastic explosive), TNT, denta sheet, a flexible explosive, ammonium nitrate and pyrodex, a smokeless black powder.

McCloskey said that besides detecting explosives and searching buildings and areas, Scout and Panzer can also track a missing person or track and apprehend a suspect fleeing a crime scene.

Spring is here and hints of an awakening landscape are everywhere. The spring blooming bulbs and early perennials are in full swing. The hellebores in my garden are covered with nodding white blooms, red-hued foliage, and they will continue to bud and bloom until more of my favorite spring plants come alive with color, form, and fragrance. Many summer blooming perennials are slowly sending up new stems and leaves and pushing through the soil; phlox, Joe pye weed, goldenrod, Echinacea, amsonia, bleeding heart, coreopsis, and more. Cool season vegetable crops including peas and lettuce are growing, the raspberries are pushing out new leaves, and pansies have been planted at the edge of my vegetable garden, and interspersed throughout the landscape, for color and for food. The pansy is just one ornamental plant that I like to use because it is edible, too. Beautiful signs of spring are everywhere. But, there are also signs of a challenging winter. A warm, dry day and a quick walk about your landscape can reveal new growth, but also the repair work that you will have to tend to in the coming weeks of spring. To help with your growing season endeavors, the New Castle County Master Gardeners

have prepared a variety of workshops to address your needs.

There are as many types of gardens, as there are gardeners. Some gardens are large, others are small. Some gardens are raised, others are flat. Some gardens are container gardens, particularly for those gardeners who live in apartments, condos or townhomes. Whether you want to compliment your expansive garden with a few containers on a deck or patio, or your entire garden is that which you plant into containers, let Master Gardeners Meg MacDonald and J.W. Wistermayer teach you the basic principles of container gardening. In this very hands-on, dirty workshop, you will make-your-own container to take home. Two sessions are being offered on April 20 or May 2.

Have you attended our vegetable gardening workshops and now you desire more? More information, more challenges, for your ever-expanding garden? Consider growing an herb garden. On May 4, Master Gardener Marta Kessinger will present an herbs workshop and discuss the common types of herbs used in culinary and cosmetic fields. She will review the ways to plant, use, and preserve these herbs, and provide you with the tools to establish an herb garden just in time for spring planting.

Wyoming Road in Newark. The Native Teaching Garden is clearly marked and located at the front of the building, while the Vegetable Teaching Garden, also clearly marked alongside our Compost Demonstration Site, is at the back of our building just off the James F. Hall Trail.

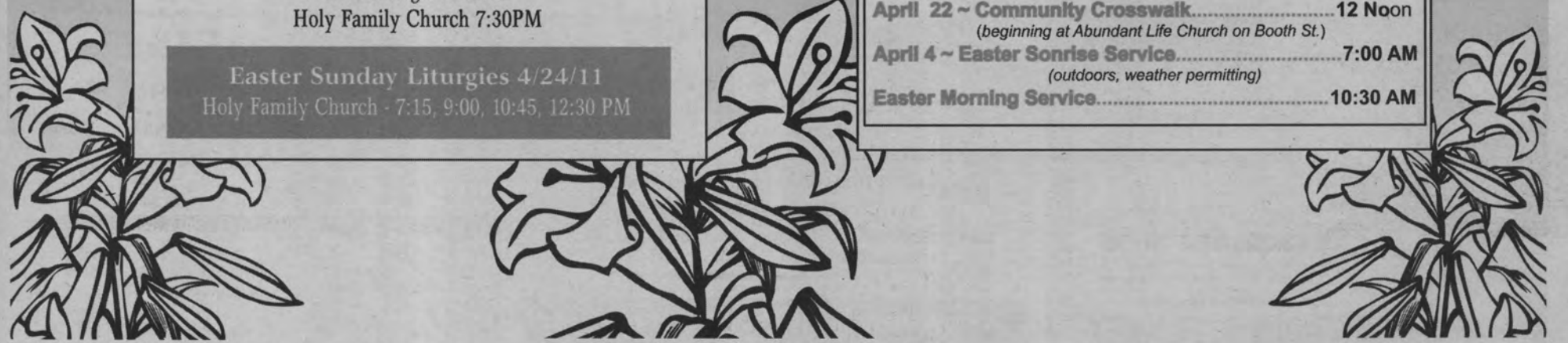
