Dear Dannie:

I am enclosing a sheet from an Argentine government propaganda publication which the Argentine Embassy in Washington seems to send out quite widely. You probably have seen it and in any event, Brosens will have told you in the last days what is going on there. I am afraid that all this about the electricity industry is mere words and what is actually being done for the Cade means more than any statement of the Argentine government. I have read with a lot of interest some of the statements which have been made recently by Perón and the Argentine government about their desire to have foreign capital, but I think a great deal of water will have to run under the bridge before any new private capital will venture into the Argentine. I am terribly sorry that I was not able to make the trip to New York as I would have so much liked to have talked with you and Brosens and to hear what he has to say about the Argentine. Everything that is still happening, including the subversive activities of the Argentine in other countries, does not give me any encouragement.
