

Large Newark Entry In County Field Meet

Over 4,000 Boys And Girls Expected To Compete In Annual County Track And Field Meet, Friday, On Frazer Field; Schedule Of Events

The Newark schools have entered 60 boys and 63 girls in the eighth annual Track and Field Meet for rural New Castle County high schools, which will be held on Frazer Field, this Friday. There will be between 40 and 50 schools with between 4,000 and 5,000 competitors in the meet. In addition to the track and field events, Newark has entered 275 contestants in the badge tests.

In the badge tests for bronze, silver and gold badges, the contestants compete against themselves.

New Process for Stuccoing Frame Houses

Duffy Successfully Stuccoes Frame Walls Uses New Technique To Make Lasting Application To Frame Houses, Plaster Paint

William M. Duffy, the well-known plastering contractor of 613 Orange street, Wilmington, has been meeting with great success in his application of stucco over frame walls. Stuccoing over frame walls had been quite a problem up to the last few years but now it is possible to apply it with the certainty that it will be of equal permanence as that applied over stone or brick walls. The material comes in a wide variety of colors and works wonders in improving age worn homes. The beauty of a stuccoed house has long been known to architects and lovers of beautiful homes but up to the last few years architects and home-builders had been a trifle cautious about applying it over frame. As is the case in every other industry, there have been improvements in what is included under the application of plaster, such processes as stuccoing, cementing, and flooring. In flooring advantage has been taken of the plaster's art to make him the agency for the installation of what is known as composition flooring. This flooring is absolutely impervious to water, it is clean and sanitary, like stucco and Craftex, it comes in a variety of colors, and it is resilient—it gives and is easy to walk on. For that reason it finds its greatest use in kitchens, baths, stores, hospitals, and theatres. It is most commonly applied in kitchens and bath rooms and there is many a housewife in Wilmington who can testify to the advantages of composition flooring.

By giving thought to such processes as these Mr. Duffy has succeeded in building up a business that covers many details of finishing a home and there is not a house built now-a-days that does not take advantage of the permanence of plaster and the plasterer's art. The application of stucco, flooring, and plastic paint has added to his responsibilities and Mr. Duffy has met them with a guarantee for he has confidence in his work and that's as much as can be said of any building craftsman.

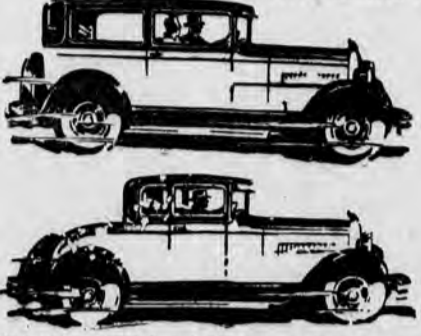
