Dear Friend,

I am enclosing herewith copies of two memoranda dated September 14th and 20th, which I prepared after discussions with Mr. Heineman and Mr. Wilmers in New York.

You will see that these notes summarize the present status of our negotiations in Buenos Aires and indicate what our immediate plan of action is. I would appreciate your sending Mr. Heineman your comments, which he will communicate to me.

I regret that we were unable to complete sooner the Brief which we promised to deliver to the World Bank. However, this document is now about ready, and although it has become, at least for the time being, without immediate purpose, I feel we must hand it to Mr. Gaston, if only for the psychological effect.

It is indeed a pity that I will miss meeting you here early next month as I would have liked to discuss our problems with you, but I have set the date of my departure for next week as I must see the President about our affairs as soon as possible.
