Dear Mr. Graydon:

I am sending you herewith a memorandum covering my out-of-pocket expenditures during the trip which I took to New York and Washington on company business, principally for the purpose of signing the long-term loan agreement with the World Bank on April 28, in the amount of \$37.60. A check for this amount may be sent to the Equitable Trust Company, Wilmington, Delaware, for deposit to my account.

You will note that I had no expenses chargeable to the company for air transportation between Mexico City and New York and return, as I was the guest of the United States Air Force, having delivered an address at the Air War College on April 25.

Mr. Heineman paid my hotel bill for the day which I spent in New York at the Hotel Carlyle and it covered some local and long distance telephone calls as well, for which Mr. Heineman should be reimbursed.

As Mr. Heineman was the last to leave the Hotel Mayflower in Washington he paid the hotel bill at the Mayflower which covered the stay of Mr. Guest, Mr. Ford, Mr. Dean, Mr. James Heineman, Mr. D. W. Heineman and myself. I made a number of long distance and local calls on company business which were charged on the Mayflower bill. As Mr. Heineman paid the entire account at the Mayflower for the abovementioned, he should be reimbursed therefor.
