

## INTERPRETATION OF NUMBERS ASSIGNED TO COURSES AND CODE FOR DEPARTMENTAL SYMBOLS

The general interpretation of numbers assigned to courses is as follows:

- 001-049 Nondegree courses
- 050-099 Associate degree credit only
- 100-199 Introductory-level courses
- 200-299 Introductory and intermediate courses, usually requiring some previous knowledge or experience in the discipline
- 300-399 Courses with a more concentrated focus on subject matter in a particular discipline
- 400-499 Advanced courses for majors and other qualified students
- 500-599 Graduate-level courses for the nonspecialist
- 600-699 Graduate-level courses, also open to advanced undergraduates
