Dear Mr. Wirth:

I received from Mr. Edward J. Barry, a lawyer of San Francisco, a letter requesting me to endeavor to secure the birth certificate of one Julius Deichmann, born about 1847 in Germany. I have been able to secure the birth certificate through the cooperation of the American Consul in Bremen. You will find the copy of the birth certificate transmitted herewith, which comes from the Synagogen-Gemeinde at Hoya, under date of March 16, 1934.

The place where Julius Deichmann was born, is Doerverden, Kr. Verden, in the province of Hannover, but about sixty kilometers from that city. You will note from the birth certificate that Julius Deichmann was born on June 28, 1847, his father's name being Salomon Deichmann, and his mother's Hannchen, geborene Hammerschlag. The cost of securing the birth certificate was M. 1.- which I have refunded personally to the Consul at Bremen and which you can remit to me at your convenience.
