URS to oversee demolition

An international engineering and construction firm has been selected to oversee the demolition of the Chrysler plant. The selection of URS Corp. was made by 1743 Holdings, a subsidiary of the University of Delaware.

The 272-acre site was purchased for approximately \$24 million in November 2009. UD plans to develop a new research and technology campus and use the site to reshape the gateway to the university from the south.

According to UD President Patrick Harker, "This land is an investment in our people and in our culture of innovation, partnership and excellence. Its proximity to our main campus will provide an invigorating entrepreneurial climate for faculty, researchers and students that will benefit

the state and the region through the important discoveries, inventions and collaborations that will ultimately take place there."

Under the terms of the contract URS will be responsible for the decommissioning and cleaning of process equipment and associated structures; abatement of asbestos-containing materials; demolition of site buildings; and removal, recycling and disposal of all building materials. Approximately 95 percent of the material from the site will be recycled.

"UD is pleased to be working with URS on this important project. After a very competitive evaluation process, URS was selected due to the strength of their prior experience, safety record

A technology pioneer in Newark was honored on Tuesday for its rapid growth and contributions to the state's economy.

Rite-Aid suspects arrested

The two suspects in the armed robbery of the Rite-Aid pharmacy in Newark on Friday August 6 have been identified and arrested.

The investigation led to the pair after a witness provided the registration number of a car seen driving erratically on Elkton Road. Although at the time the witness did not know the car was fleeing from a robbery that had just been committed, the manner in which the car was being operated caused sufficient concern that the witness documented the tag and type of car.

Roman Schurga, the owner of the car, of Top View Court in the Newark area, surrendered at the Newark Police Department on the evening of Wednesday August 11. David (Dean) Ranken, 28, of the Wilmington area, was arrested at his home on the morning of Thursday August 12. Both were charged with Robbery 1st Degree and Conspiracy 2nd Degree. Both were being held on a secured bond of \$5,250.

POLICE BLOTTER

Marijuana found in candy form in area home

A Newark area man has been arrested and more than six pounds of marijuana have been found — much of it candy form. Delaware State Police officials said they could not recall a simi-

lar instance of marijuana being packaged in that manner.

On Tuesday at 10:45 p.m., members of the New Castle County Governors Task Force (GTF) were in the Hunters Crossing Apartments located on Fairway Road east of Newark, near the Windy Hills and Red Mill areas.

The Governors Task Force consists of members of the Delaware State Police and officers from the Division of Probation and Parole whose

responsibilities are to monitor the activities of individuals convicted of drug, weapons, and other crimes and who are currently on probation.

As members of the task force were completing a curfew check at an apartment in the complex, they smelled a strong odor of burnt marijuana coming from another apartment. Shortly thereafter, they observed two individuals exit the apartment and smelled the strong odor of marijuana com-



ing from them.

The officers then knocked on the door of the apartment that the subjects had just exited and upon being granted permission to enter, observed marijuana in plain view. It was determined that the apartment was being rented by Alex R. Osgood,

23. A search warrant was then obtained by the task force and 6.6 pounds of marijuana (4.8 pounds of which were packaged in "candy" form), 1.1 grams of hashish, a marijuana pipe and bong, a digital scale, and \$3,560 in drug sale proceeds. Osgood was then arrested and charged

with the following:

- Trafficking in Marijuana
- Possession with the Intent to Deliver Marijuana
- Maintaining a Dwelling for Keeping Drugs
- Possession of Drug Paraphernalia
- Possession of Marijuana

He was arraigned and taken to the Henry Young Correctional Institute for lack of \$6,000 secured bail.

Drug arrest

An investigation into activity in a home in the Nottingham Green neighborhood led to a search warrant being executed at an address on the 300 block of Radcliffe Drive. During the search, officers found nearly 700 grams of marijuana, over 30 Oxydocone pills, .32 caliber ammunition, and materials used for the packaging of illegal

and willingness to utilize local resources,” according to Jennifer (J.J.) Davis, UD vice president for administration. It is anticipated that approximately 75 percent of the staff working on the project will

Substantial completion of the decommissioning and demolition is expected to be completed by November 2011.

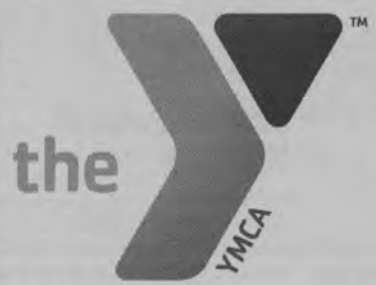

OUT OF THE ATTIC

This week's Out of the Attic item is an undated view of the prominent home built at 47 Kent Way in 1921 for the John Pilling and Elizabeth Johnson Wright family. The house is listed on the National Register of Historic Sites as an excellent example of 1920's Georgian Revival architecture. J. Pilling (b. 1881) was the first son of Samuel J. and Isabel Pilling Wright. He was born in Newark and studied in Newark schools. In 1898 he started at American Hard Fibre Company and in 1901 moved to Manager of the American Vulcanized Fibre Company. In 1905 he was a Founder and Vice-President of Continental Fibre Company and in 1929 became President of the Continental-Diamond Fibre Company. He was a University of Delaware Trustee from 1934 to 1946. It was his desire that his home, one day, become the official residence of the University President. That came to pass in 1961 when Mrs. Wright



devised the property to the University.

Glasgow football hopes to return to winning ways

To an outsider, the 2009 Glasgow High School football season might have seemed like a scene from the movie "Backdraft."

In some ways the '09 season, like the buildings in the movie, felt like it crashed and burned. But head coach Shannon Riley likes to draw a different comparison; one that he hopes will make his team look back on last year as a positive learning experience.

"Throwing the underclassmen in the fire last year has paid off," the fifth-year coach said. "They have a grasp of our offensive and defensive systems, plus we have great chemistry."

"Last year was my first losing season after three very good years, so our first goal is to get back to our winning ways. I feel we will be very

competitive because we only lost three starters and return almost everyone."

Everyone includes sophomore quarterback Khari Ngozi, who burst on to the scene last season when he set a Delaware freshman record with 1,504 passing yards. Ngozi will be joined by seven sophomores who all started last year, and he is confident that will only help this young, but experienced, team.

"Chemistry," the 5-foot-7, 175-pound quarterback replied when asked how having most of the players back from last year's season — Glasgow's lone win was a 29-14 victory over Newark — would help this year's team. "We all know our positions now. Last year we had a lot of young players who had to step up right away. Now they are more mature and have a better feel for the game."

Joining Ngozi in the backfield will be junior running back Clifton Armstead, who led

the team in rushing (371 yards) and receiving (19 catches, 352 yards) in '09. "They are two of the most talented players at their position in the state," Riley said of his dynamic duo.

Ngozi said the Dragons' offense will be centered around

a passing attack, and in addition to having Armstead catching balls out of the backfield, senior wide receivers Andre Davis and Kevin Hibbert will give the strong-armed quarterback two more lethal targets.

"I have complete confidence in my offensive line to give me the time I need this year," Ngozi said. "And with a year under our belts, I know my receivers will make the right breaks to the ball."

On the defensive side of the ball, Armstead returns at his safety position, where he was named first team All-Conference last season after recording 95 tackles and two interceptions. Joining him will be All-Conference linebackers Dylan Billy (sr.) and David McGonigle (soph.), and senior defensive linemen Jamie Watson and Raphael Stewart.

In addition to a plethora of returning players — the Dragons lost just three starters to graduation — Riley added two coaches who he feels will provide not only the experience to help this team return to its winning ways, but an added element of youthful energy. Michael Richardson returns to his alma mater after a stint at Delcastle and Michael Pipkins, a Christiana High graduate, joins Riley's staff after coaching at Glen Mills (Pa.).

Riley said the team's goal is to win the conference championship and qualify for the playoffs, and then hopefully compete for a state title. He added that this year his team has worked harder in the off-season than any of his previous

squads.

"Our summer lifting and conditioning program has been outstanding," Riley said. "We have had over 50 players show to every workout. We also have entered a few 7-on-7 tournaments and have won the championship each time."

When Riley talks to his players about being winners, he does so placing just as much emphasis on succeeding off the field as on it. His team is involved in several community events throughout the year and the coach takes great pride in his players' achievements in the classroom.

"I don't place success on

just wins and losses," Riley said. "I want them to succeed in the classroom and be model citizens in the community."

Glasgow's quest to return to its winning ways will begin when the Dragons visit Pencader Charter on Sept. 10 at Caravel Academy.

That night will be the first true test for this young, but experienced team. It will be the first chance for Riley to see if those players he "put through the fire" last year, respond by dousing the opposition.

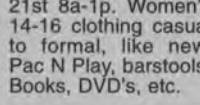

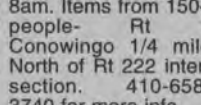

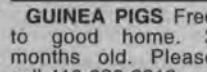
