By virtue of a warrant granted unto Thomas Jones of Somerset county to resurvey and lay out five hundred acres of land in any part of this province bearing date the fifteenth day of September Anno Dom 1715.

These are therefore to certify that I William Whittington Jun^r his Lord^{ship}s Surveyor for Somerset County have accordingly surveyed for Thomas Jones a tract of land called Chance containing one hundred and fifty acres of land lying and being in Somerset county on the North side of a creek called Deep creek on the North side of a branch proceeding out of the said creek called Peterkins branch bounded as followeth. Beginning at a marked white oak standing in a point by a valley side coming out of the said Peterkins branch and from thence with a line drawn North thirty five degrees Easterly forty eight poles thence North sixty degrees Easterly one hundred and forty perches thence North thirty degrees Westerly sixty poles thence South sixty degrees Westerly one hundred and forty perches thence North forty five degrees Westerly one hundred and ninety poles thence West one hundred and ten poles thence South forty five degrees Easterly one hundred ninety five poles thence North forty five degrees Easterly fifty six poles
