The purpose of the S. G. A. as is the purpose of all student governments, is to promote interest and participation in various campus affairs, to provide social activities for the students, and to meet the needs and wishes of the student body. To insure the smooth running of this program, various S. G. A. committees were active throughout the year. These consisted of the Social, Publicity, Campus Chest, Cultural, Elections, Financial, and Student Union Committees. Each one was headed by a member of S. G. A., and any interested students assisted.

The Student Government got off to a fine beginning last fall by helping with Freshman Week registration and activities. Al Walter greeted the freshmen at one of the first orientation meetings and later introduced the members of the S. G. A. The freshmen received an overall idea of the S. G. A. program planned for 1956-57, and in October S. G. A. was again on hand to help with freshmen elections.

Some of the most successful social events of the year were promoted by the S. G. A. In October, they spon-

sored the Harvest Hop, with music by George Madden and his orchestra; in November, the well received Mike Pedecin Jazz Concert; and in December, the traditionally Christmas Dance, with the Glenn Miller Band led by Ray McKinley.

One of the S. G. A.'s main projects this year was to establish the budgets of various campus groups. Money was allotted to the many different student organizations and clubs according to their needs. Another project was the organization of a new committee to work on strengthening the Freshman rules and improving Orientation Week. To keep the S. G. A. a modern efficient working body, a committee was organized to revamp the present S. G. A. constitution and to bring it up to date. S. G. A. also actively participated in the program for Parent's Day. The Campus Chest Drive, an annual activity in the second semester, was revised and improved under the leadership of a new and active Campus Chest Committee.

On considering the S. G. A.'s many contributions to the students this year, it can be said that they were most successful in carrying out an extensive program and in achieving the goals set for them by President Walter, the constitution, and the student body.
